

Inl cattle, lepto can cause a death rate of up to 10 per cent, n calves up to 25 percent, in addition to abortions and a sharp drop in milk production. It is hard to diagnose in mature attle. In addition to abortions and a drop in milk output, it may cause the milk to become thick, yellow and blood-tinged. Calves may become depresesed, lose appetite and develop diarrhea. Symptoms in swine may be overlooked because they are not as

apparent as in cattle. Because of the chance of confusing it with something else. a veterinarian should be called when symptoms appear in any animals. He may have to resort to rather complex laboratory tests to identify the cause of the trouble. If the diagnosis is positive, he will make recommendations for handling the situation. Vaccines are available for cattle and swine but must be properly used to provide protection.




