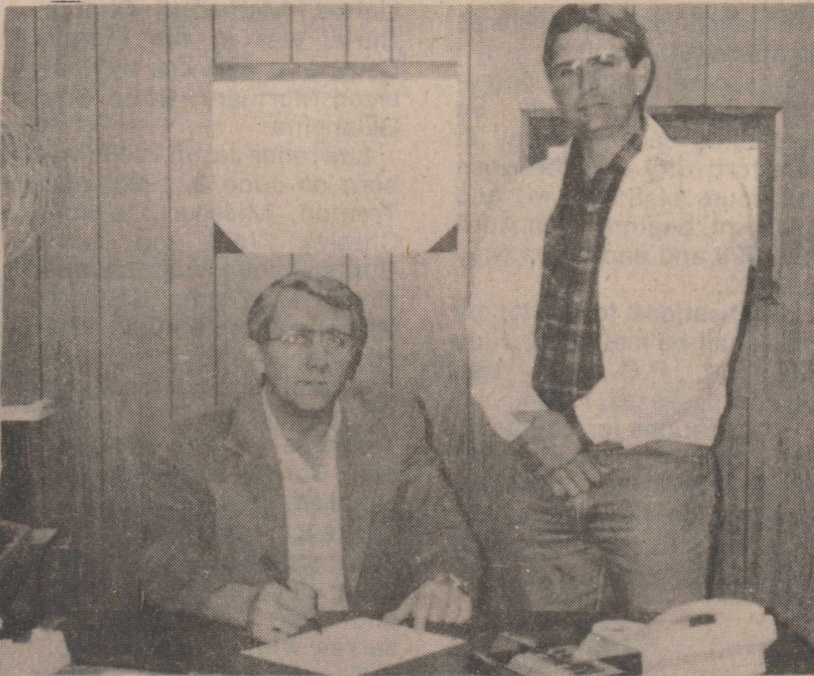
4-Her's Win District

how to look at 6-8 given situations with 4 choices. Then place the choices in order according to the best product for each given situation. they studied computer spreadsheets and

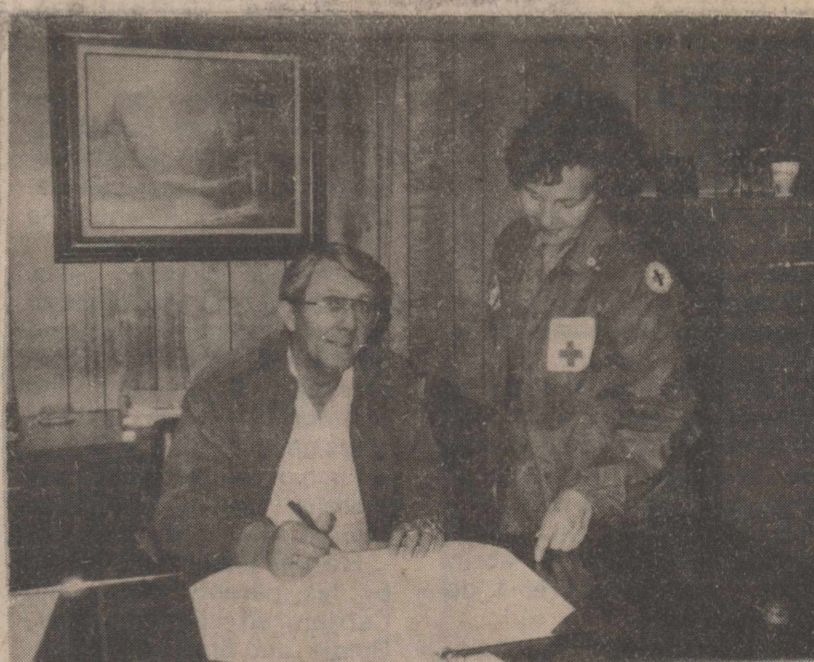

Proclamation as follows: The Honorable Doug Reese, Mayor, City of Stratford.

Whereas, one of the most meaningful gifts that one human being can bestow upon another is the precious gift of life; and Whereas, the need for organs and tissues far surpasses the number donated each year, while many desperately ill persons including small children, die while waiting for suitable organs; and Whereas, the history of the transplantation of organs from one person to another dates back to the 19th century, although, not until the 1960's was significant progress made in solving the problems of tissue preservation, surgical techniques and refection; and Whereas, kidney, liver

and heart transplantations are accepted therapies which are performed routinely at specialized transplant centers saving thousands of lives each year; and Whereas, by filling out an organ donor card and carrying it, and by making our wishes for organ and tissue donation known to our families, we may give the gift of life to those individuals who so desperately need organ transplants.

Now, therefore, I Doug Reese, Mayor of the City of Stratford do hereby proclaim the week of April 22 through 28, 1990 as National Organ & Tissue Donor Awareness Week in the City of

Funeral services were held Wednesday, April 4, 1990 at 2:00 p.m. at the Marella United Methodist Church. Burial was in the Marella Cemetery. Services by Cimarron Mortuary, Boise City, Oklahoma.

Lawrence Jason Wells was born on June 2, 1903, near Trenton, Missouri, to John Chesley Wells and Carrie Dunfee Wells. As a six year old child, he came to Griggs, Oklahoma, in February 1910. His father and three older brothers, Ralph, Verner, and Paul, rode on the train to Texhoma in an immigrant car. Carrie and the other children, Glenn, Norval, Lawrence, and Mella, followed later on a passenger train. John met them in Texhoma and took them home in a surrey with fringe on top.

The family helped pioneer the Griggs area. They farmed and ranched and for several years operated the Griggs Store and post office.

Lawrence married Geneva Taylor on July 21, 1937, at Raton, New Mexico. They continued to farm in Griggs and moved to their present location in 1942. They had two children, Joyce who lives at Griggs and Terry of Stratford, Tx.

He served on the Plainview School Board for many years and the Sampsel Election Board, as well as, the county FHA and the Texhoma Wheat Growers.

Lawrence accepted Jesus as a young man and attended Hornsby Chapel Church and the other pioneer church services held in the community schools. In later years he attended the Griggs Church of God and joined the Marella United Methodist Church at Griggs.

He was preceded in death by his parents, John and Carrie, an infant sister, Goldie, and brothers, Ralph, Verner, Glenn, Paul, and Norval.

Lawrence is survived by his wife, Geneva, with whom he had been married 52 years, children, Joyce and Terry and his wife Ann, and granddaughters, Christy, Teresa, and Lari Wells, and his sister, Mella Wells of Hooker, and his nephews and nieces and their families and Geneva's brothers and sisters and their families.

Although Lawrence was ill for many years, he was especially blessed with a devoted wife and family, a wonderful Church family, and a caring and generous community of friends and neighbors.

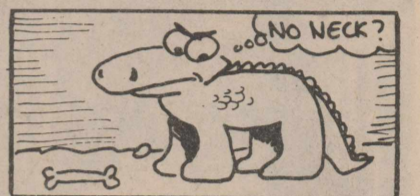
Your Right To Know

We have several good videos of tornadoes and would be happy to show them to any organization at any time of the day or night. Please give us a call at 396-2021.



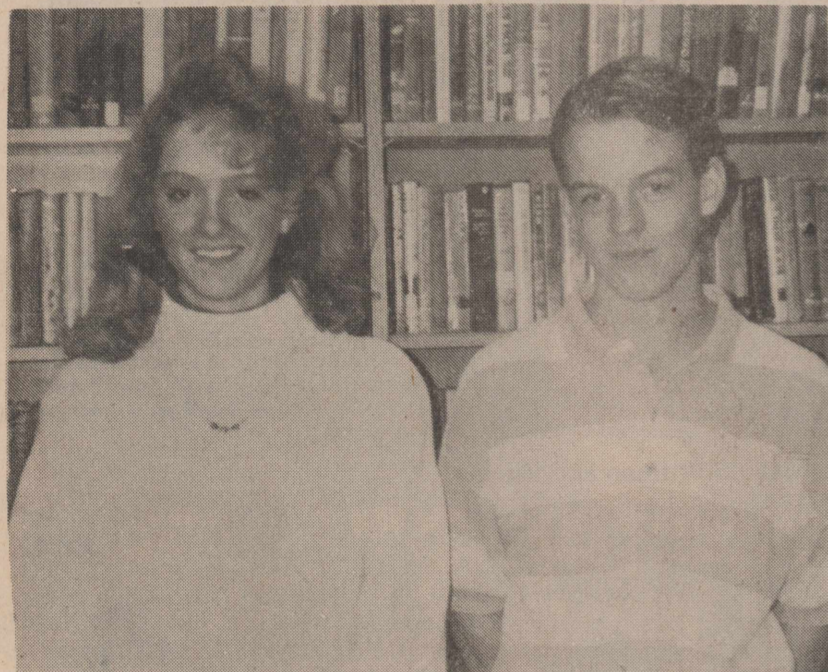
