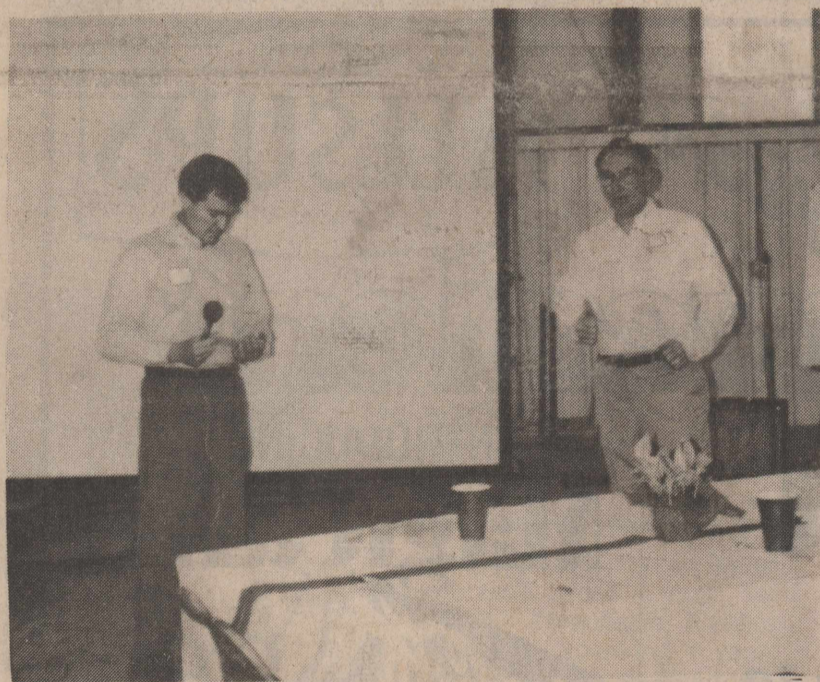

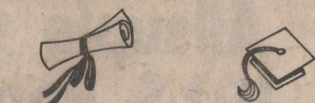

Springtime Draws Reminder From SPS

As warm weather draws more people outdoors, Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS) is reminding its customers to be careful around power lines and electrical facilities.

"We say all year to watch up for power lines, but it's especially appropriate to issue an additional reminder as people begin to spend more time outdoors," says Eugene Griffin, SPS's Stratford local manager. "People are trimming trees, repairing roofs and doing other things around the house that could bring them into contact with overhead lines."

Violent spring storms can create other hazards, Griffin warns. "If anyone sees a downed power line, stay away and don't touch anything the line is touching. Keep others away, and contact the electric company immediately," Griffin says. "A downed line can be completely free of sparks but still can be very 'live' and dangerous."

There are many other safety tips to keep in mind this time of year, Griffin says. For example, farmers handling irrigation equipment should be especially careful.

"Metal irrigation pipe is a excellent conductor of electricity," Griffin says. "Moving a tall section of irrigation pipe or lifting it to dislodge a rabbit or other animal inside could be fatal if there's a power line overhead."

Another common spring-time activity is installing evaporative coolers. These are potential hazards, Griffin says.

"By the time you get a metal cooler up, you're usually standing in a puddle of water. Metal and water are both good conductors of electricity, so make sure your unit is grounded. Don't plug in the cooler until everything is hooked up. If you have to make any

last-minute adjustments, be sure to unplug the unit first," he says.

Children also should be warned to play safely as they begin to spend more time outdoors.

"Parents should teach their kids to stay away from utility substations and poles, Griffin says. "If a kite gets tangled in a power line, they should never try to get it down by themselves. And they should check any tree they're about to climb into for power lines."

Dear Editor:

What should have been considered a personal family matter by the Amarillo TV Stations was instead turned into a Texas Panhandle media event due to an overzealous group of elected officials in the Sherman County Courthouse. As anyone in the law enforcement profession knows, this job is one of the most stressful there is, not only on the policeman himself, but also on his family. I'm sure there are few law enforcement families free of personal problems: our family, unfortunately, happens not to be one of them. As a result of these family problems, my husband's career and reputation have been ruined. I have been totally humiliated and embarrassed, and our children will certainly suffer the emotional scars for years to come.

After having gone to a friend's house to let the situation cool down between my husband and myself, they notified the Sheriff's department and I was escorted to the hospital by the Sheriff. I was told that Saturday morning that if I didn't press charges against my husband, the Sheriff's department would. I was also told a grand jury would convene the following Monday morning at 8:00 a.m. to consider whether or not to return an indictment against my husband, but due to a 48-hour notice required to be given to grand jurors, the meeting was postponed until Wed. morning at 8:00 a.m. A friend of mine had already advised me that the District Attorney had stated that if I did not appear in person before the Grand Jury, that the case would be dropped. I thus had not planned to appear. The Sheriff's Dept. then sent word to me I needed to be in Stratford Wed. morning at 8:00 a.m. to sign some papers. Nothing was ever said about me testifying in front of the Grand Jury. When I arrived at the courthouse on Wed. morning, I signed a couple of papers & then was suddenly whisked up to the grand jury room, completely unaware I was expected to testify. I must say this all brought about the speediest end to what I considered to be my husband's virtual unblemished 5-year tenure in Stratford.

I personally consider my husband to be one of the most dedicated, professional law enforcement officers I've ever known. He has cleared

In summary, despite the fact that my husband did indeed face certain provocation on my part, plus the added stress resulting from his job, he, as well as myself, find ourselves in a sad situation that seems to have no easy answer.

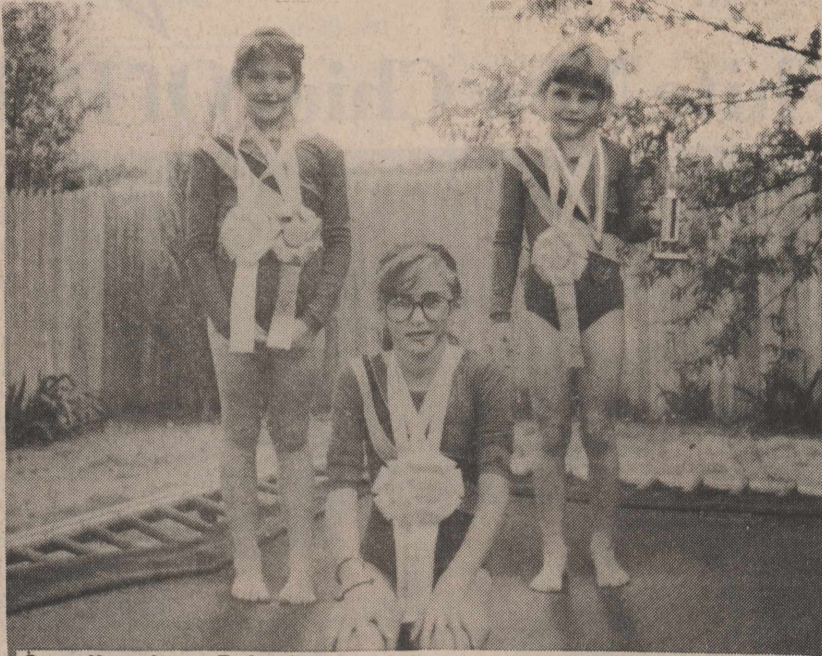
