## Tillerys Escape Serious Injury



Thursday night after a very exciting JV game at Boys Ranch the back wheels on the 1985 Dodge Raider, belonging to Terry Tillery, suddenly locked down, sending the vehicle into a 180 ft. skid, before leaving the right side of the highway and turning over 10 1/2 miles east of Channing. Minor injuries were reported by Terry and wife, Janis. There were no other passengers in the vehicle at the time of the accident. Franky Scott, investigating DPS officer from Dalhart stated he had never seen an accident of this nature and the cause has not yet been determined.

Joe E. Lopez, 70, died Monday, September 24, 1990.

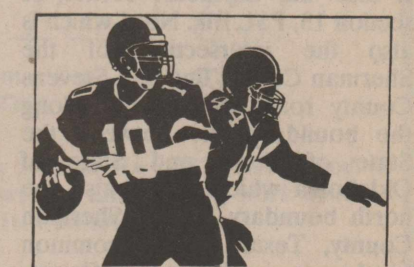

## Craig Participates In Demonstration

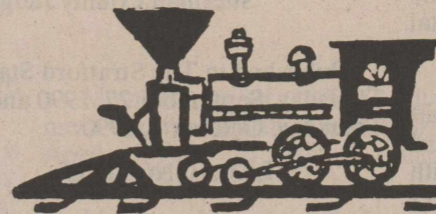

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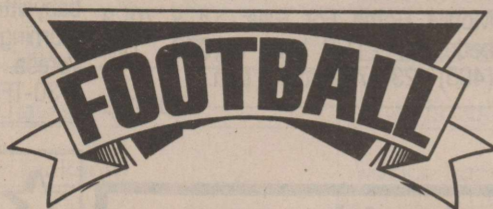

# Boothby honored poet

Texhoma-Alma Jeane (Tut) Boothby, Texhoma, has been honored by the World of Poetry.

The poem Boothby is honored for writing was written in memory of her parents, Jesse and Cora Turner, former residents of Stratford, Texas. Jesse was a barber in Stratford and Cora was a loving wife and mother.

Boothby's poem was one of 115 from 1.4 million chosen by the five judges over a period of six weeks. These poems commemorate the sixth

anniversary of the World of Poetry convention held in the Las Vegas Hilton, Nev., Aug. 26-28.

The poem resulted in a trip to Las Vegas where a group of 4000 representing all 50 states and 28 countries were entertained for the three days in various ways. They included a banquet with Bob Hope as entertainment, another banquet with entertainment by numerous famous persons including Johnny Campbell, the man responsible for forming the World of Poetry. Entertainers were William Shatner, Eugene McCarthy (senator from

Minnesota), Joan Rivers, Red Buttons, Natica Angilly (a ballerina), Nipsy Russell, the

Platters (a group who sold over 90,000 records since the 1950's) and the Free Flight Singers.

A lovely trophy was presented to Tut when she read her poem. She was proclaimed a Silver Poet of the organization.]

Denese Hodges Berryman of Amarillo, daughter of Sam Hodges, a long-time friend of the Boothby's, accompanied Tut to Las Vegas.

Boothby wrote her poem after the death of her mother. It was read following the blessing during the first traditional family gathering after Mrs. Turner's death.
