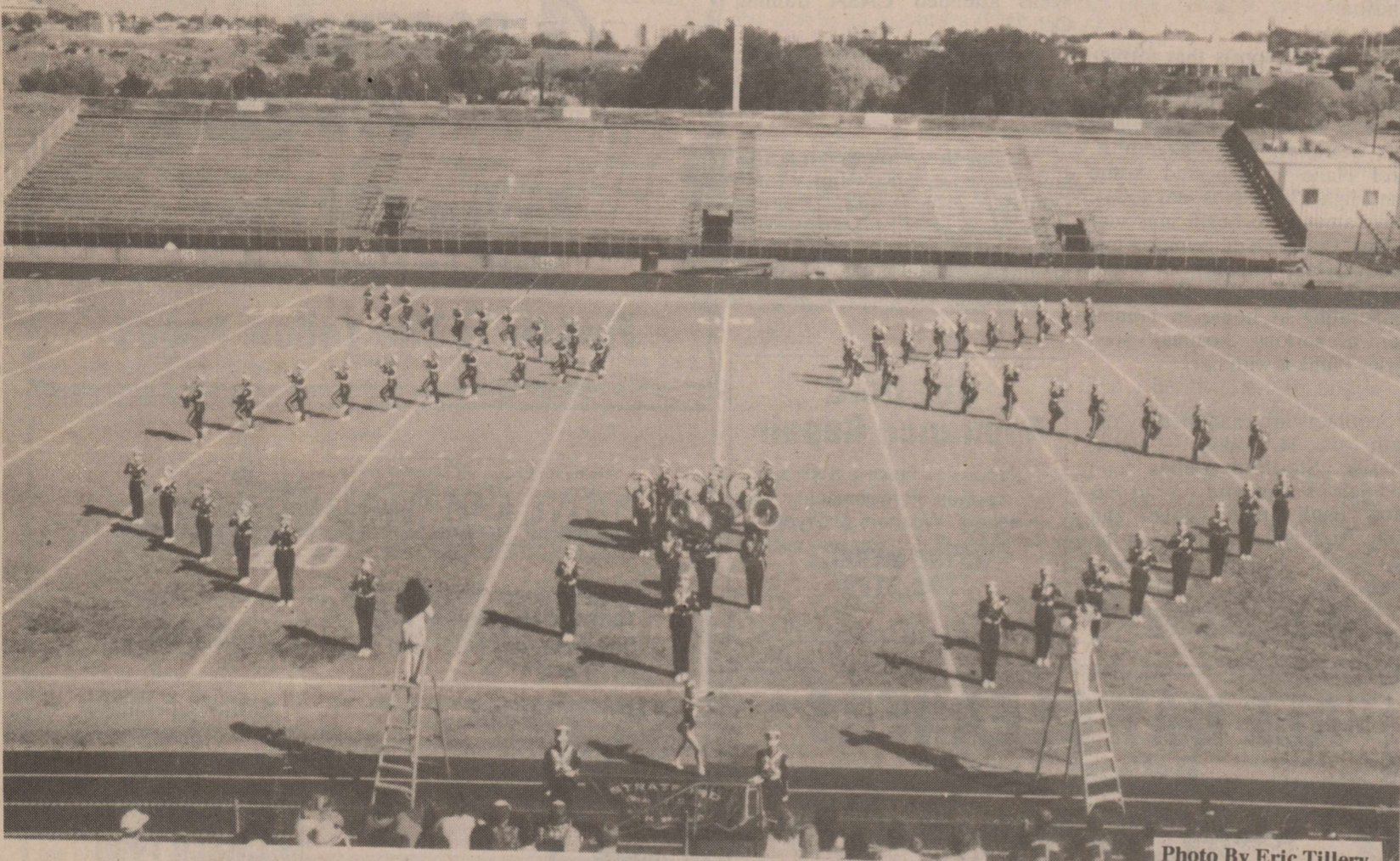

Large Crowd Attends XIT Open House & Grand Opening

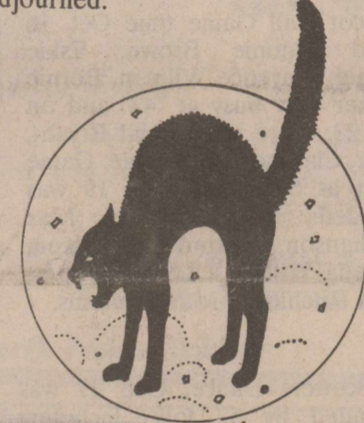

Mary Stowers recalls driving a grain truck since 1938. This week she celebrated her 75th birthday and was seen at the local elevator hauling grain sorghum. Mary and her late husband J.L., moved to the Stratford area 28 years ago. Prior to that they had farmed and raised cotton and grain sorghum on the South Plains, both coming from farming families there. She met J.L. in Littlefield.

Mary says she enjoys helping in the harvest and intends to continue until they "fire" her or she finds something more exciting to do. She likes the fast pace of harvest and keeps the trucks rolling for her son-in-law, Jim Chesher.

She says that when she first started hauling grain in the early 30's she used a trailer pulled behind the family car. Cotton was their main crop at the time. Later when they moved to North Friona and started growing more grain crops, they bought larger trucks to keep up with the bigger and more efficient combines.

Now, you'll find her still driving one of those trucks, hauling grain and trying to keep with an even bigger, more efficient combine. That's why you may pass her so often on the highway during harvest that you will think you are "seeing double."

Mary says she has "been

behind the wheel" since she was 13 when she got her first drivers license.

She has four daughters, Maldean Houston of Des Moines, Iowa, Darlene Dickey of Stratford, Arlene Brodhead of Dallas and Ineta Chesher of Stratford. 14 grandchildren and 12 great grandchildren.
