





Four new best-seller titles are in the library for your reading pleasure.

GET TO THE HEART, MY STORY written by Barbara Mandrell and George Vecsey will be of interest to her fans. This beautiful, blonde, and talented performer is known around the world. Here, in this candid, revealing, and often dramatic autobiography, Barbara tells the true story behind her storybook life---and the tragic accident that changed it--and her--forever.

Margaret Truman's book, MURDER AT THE NATIONAL CATHEDRAL, is the ninth in the "murder" series. In this latest Capitol Crimes mystery, she turns to that glorious church on a hill in Washington, D.C.
