Hospital Board Meets Several Business Items Discussed

The Stratford Hospital Board met in regular session on Tuesday evening in the board room of Coldwater Manor. President Scott Buckles called for business at 7:00 p.m. Among the items of business discussed were:

Coldwater Manor: 1. Reports a full staff of employees with licensed nurses around the clock and R.N.'s seven days a week as the state law requires.

2. The facility averaged 35 patients daily for the month with 3 empty beds.

3. Vendor checks totalling \$29,736.35 were approved for payment.

4. Salaries for the month of January totalled \$32,513.00

which is the highest rating available in the United States the service is comprised of five advance trained persons, plus six active emergency medical technicians, three experienced ambulance drivers and three EMT students which should be certified in May, 1991.

During the month of January, the ambulance service carried 14 patients, of which 10 required advanced life support.

The board held a lengthy discussion of Delinquent Ambulance charges. Manager, W.D. Brannan reported that the few clients who do not pay their bills force increases upon the taxpayers to keep the service going.

The Board requested that increased efforts be made to collect delinquent bills.

For the month Volunteers donated a total of 2,976 hours, in addition to the ambulance managers time.

In other action, the board ordered a Hospital Board election for May 5th. The offices are presently held by Scott Buckles and Frank Sutton. Each term is for 2 years.

Crime Stoppers Public Meeting To Be Thursday, February 28 7:00 p.m.

On Thursday, February 28, 1991, there will be a public meeting involving all interested Sherman County Stratford and Texhoma citizens to discuss the implementation of a county wide Crime Stoppers program.

Local Crime Stoppers Programs are designed to achieve citizen interest in involvement through three methods:

1. Anonymity
2. The establishment of a reward system which will pay for information leading to the arrest and indictment of persons involved in felony crimes.
3. The selection of an unsolved "Crime for the Week" to be featured by reenactment in a nightly television news broadcast, radio spot and newspaper articles.

Local crime stoppers programs are established as Non-Profit corporations by applying for a Charter under Texas law. Such

status enables contributions made to the program eligible for treatment as charitable contributions by donors on their Federal income tax returns.

We have already received support from our community leaders but it will take support from our community as a whole to make this program successful. The program will require a civilian Board of Directors, comprised of 15 to 25 members, which will broadly represent the community to oversee the general operation of the program. We urge any interested citizens of the community to attend.

Our Guest speaker will be Jim Ferguson, who is the Crime Stopper officer for his community.

The meeting will be held at The Sherman County Court House, Thursday, Feb. 28, 1991 at 7:00 p.m.
