School Board Meets Bids Opened

The Stratford Independent School District Board of Directors met in Regular Session on Tuesday, May 14 at 6:30 a.m. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and amended to read that bids be taken on roof repair, athletic supplies, cafeteria-custodial and teaching supplies, gasoline, and insurance. April bills were approved for payment.

Sam Brite, Superintendent was appointed official representative to the Regional Advisory Council at Region XVI ESC. Results of the TEAMS test for grades 3-11 were discussed.

School calendar for the 1991-92 school year was adopted with the first day of school being August 19, 1991 and the last day of school being May 23, 1992. Services from the Region XVI Education Service Center were reviewed and approved for the 1991-92 School year.

In other business, Steve Dettle was named delegate to the TASSB Convention in September with

Jack Rhoades alternate.

The resignation of Roger Whiteside and Shawna Peterson were accepted with regrets.

Bids were opened on cafeteria supplies. The lowest bid on each item will be awarded. Milk was awarded to Borden's. Roof repair bid was awarded to Parsleys Sheet Metal and Roofing. Keener Oil was awarded the gasoline bid for the 1991-92 school year. School supplies bid was awarded to Stratford Printing. Sports equipment bids and janitorial supplies bid were all accepted and will take the lowest bid or best quality item.

Superintendent Sam Brite gave a report on Kindergarten swimming lessons, Regional UIL meet results, band trip, Valedictorian and Salutatorian, Tax collections, transportation and local policy for Campus Level Decision Making Team. The District Level Decision Making Team was approved.

Meeting adjourned at 8:45 a.m.

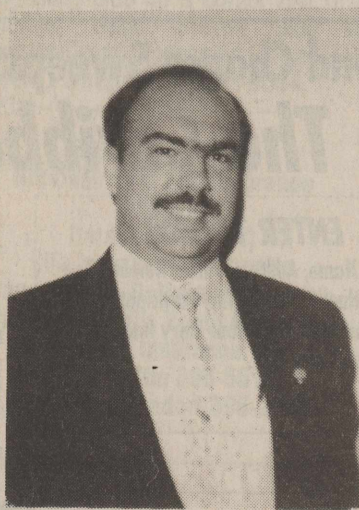
Recycling Trash Force Met May 16th

The City Council have repaired six trash containers. They are to be painted and coded by the Women's Division of the Chamber. Karen Riffe, Teresa Edmond, President of the Chamber of Commerce, and Arnita Lane, President of Women's Division will meet and

complete a presentation to be made to the City Council, June 20, 1991.

A site and an agent have been approved by the Task Force. Educating the community, the separating and manning the site, cost, and emptying the trash containers, as yet needs essentially the city involvement.

Annual Wheat Field Day

The annual Wheat Field Day will be held on May 23, 1991 at the Texas A & M Research and Extension Center in Amarillo and the USDA Conservation and Production Research Laboratory 0.75 miles west of Bushland. The morning session conducted by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service begins at 8:30 in the Texas A & M Center Auditorium, 6500 Amarillo Blvd., West. The program is chaired by Dr. Brent Bean, Extension agronomist, and is designed to qualify people for three continuing educational units needed for renewal of Pesticide Applicator Licenses.

The wheat research and demonstration bus tour begins at 1:00 p.m. according to Dr. B.A. Stewart, research director at Bushland.

Stops will include irrigated and dryland nurseries, wheat rooting depth study, wheat classification, grazing management, and tillage. This year's tour will highlight two new releases by Foundation Seed, TAM 202 and TAM 109.

The Field Day will be sponsored by Texas Agricultural Experiment Station, Texas Agricultural Extension Service, USDA, Agricultural Research Service, and the Texas Wheat Producers.

Memorial Day Weekend is approaching and with it brings the first outing of the summer. Major V.J. Cawthon, Regional Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety says motorist should be aware of the increased dangers on the highways during this holiday season.

Driving defensively and expecting the worse from other drivers is one sure way to stay alert to the situations that lie ahead. If any traveling is to be done at night, then a check of our vehicle lighting is a must. Headlights, turn signals, tail lights, and brake lights are often the only way we have of communicating with other drivers.

Motorists should expect to see large volumes of traffic in and around our recreational areas.

Keep in mind that the road conditions in these areas are not going to be as good as on the open freeway. Roads are often narrow, with generally two laned traffic and often times no shoulder. These situations call for reduced speed with a good eye on the road ahead. Always check out the shoulder area or right side of the roadway because this is where you'll have to drive if a vehicle should cross into your lane of travel.

One of the best preventive measures, to help reduce injury and death during a collision, is also the easiest. "Buckle Up", it can make a difference. Let's all help make this Memorial Day Weekend the safest ever. "Drive Friendly, It's the Texas way of doing things."

Stride-A-Thon Huge Success

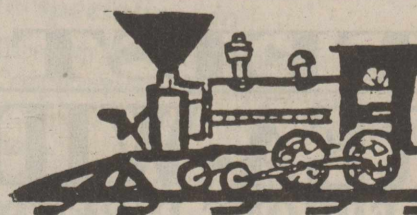
Sherman County Unit of the American Cancer Society met, recently at the Headquarters Restaurant, Don Riffe residing.

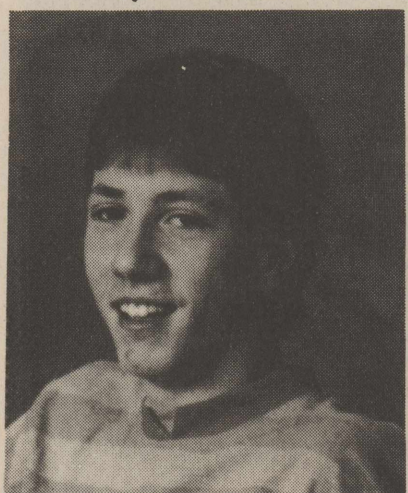
in the museum. Each year you give, a star is added to your name. These folks are dear to us and you can join the Club by writing us a check. Think about it!

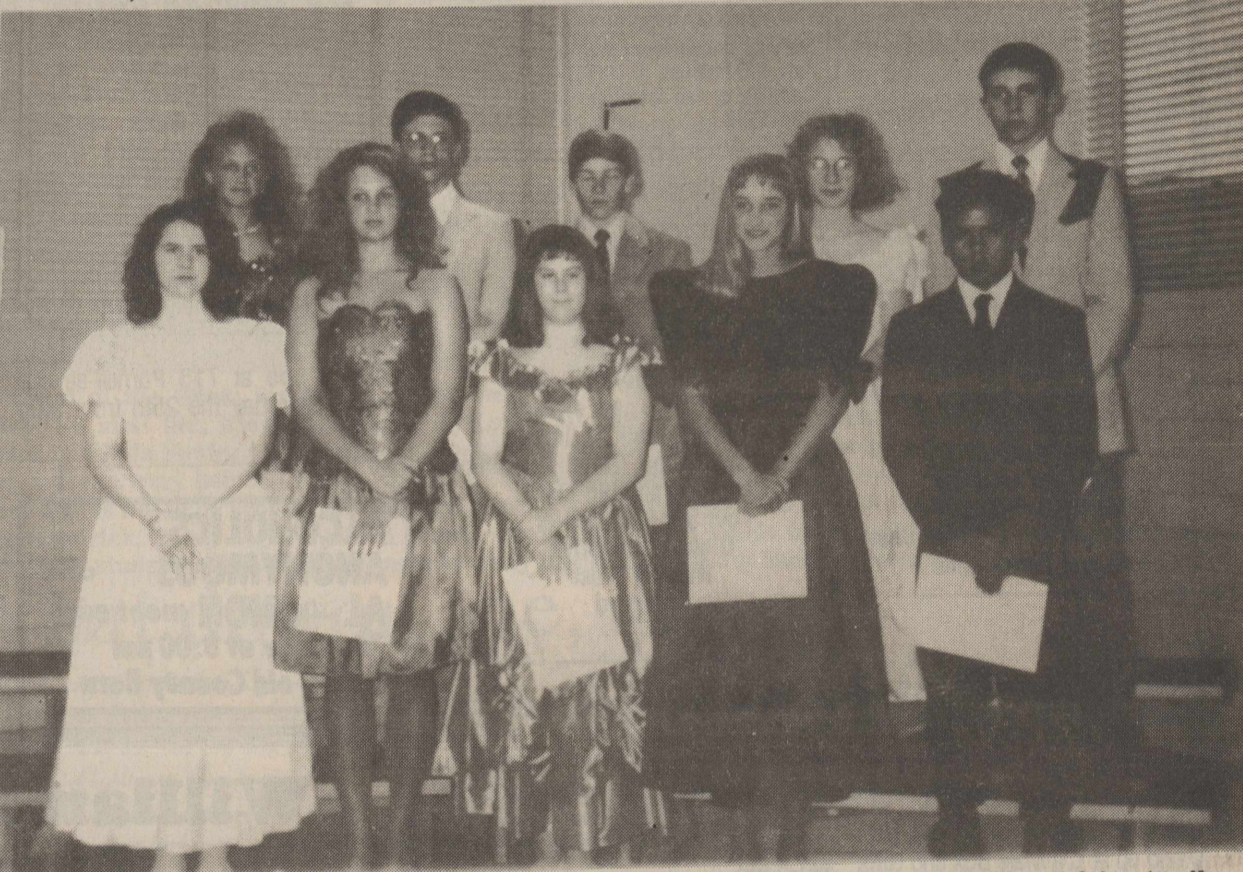
