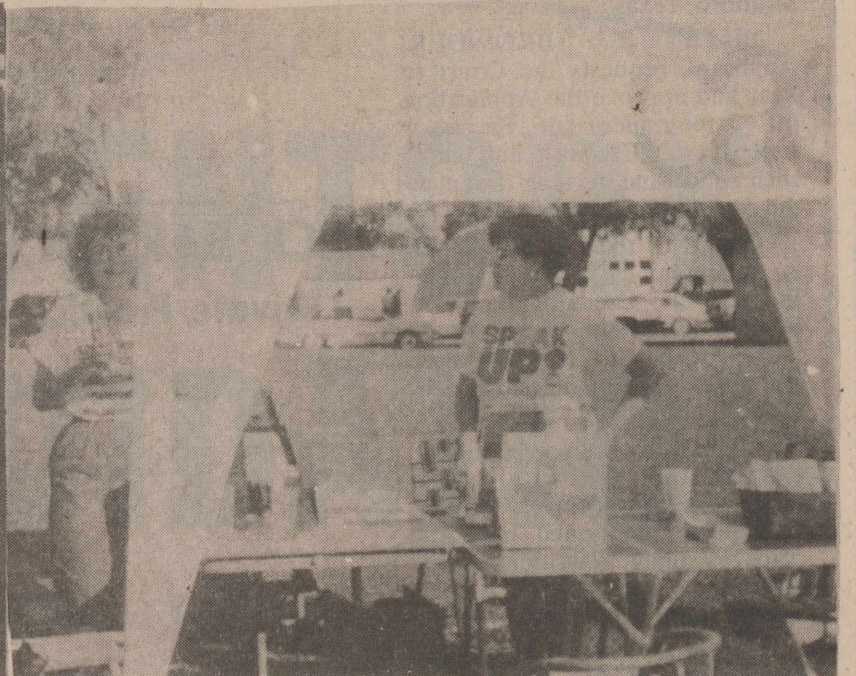

Bus Routes To Be Consolidated

The Stratford Independent School District Board of Trustees met in Regular Session on Thursday, July 4 at 7:00 a.m. with all members present. Following approval of minutes of the May board meeting, motion was made and approved to pay June, 1991 bills.

A preliminary budget study was held. Zeldia Pickens met with the Board to report on collecting taxes for the school and Walt Wesley gave a report on an Energy Management System for SISD. The school will go on the system on a trial basis for one year.

Cafeteria prices will remain the same for the 1991-92 school year. The Board voted to consolidate the cafeteria. The Mary Allen Elementary students will be bussed to the main cafeteria.

Bus routes will be consolidated during the 1991-92 school year. The previous routes consisted of 9 buses with the new consolidated routes consisting of 5 buses.

According to the Reduction in Force Policy, the Board voted to eliminate two teacher's aides positions and one coaching position.

All of the consolidations and personnel reduction is due to the loss of state funding. The Board

also voted to leave all salaries--administrative, professional, and auxiliary--the same as 1990-91, to be reviewed on a 60 day basis.

In other business, the Board approved a motion to contact the oil companies involved with the SISD to see if they would like to be a part of a law suit against the State of Texas concerning local tax money being transferred across county lines.

An insurance plan for students was approved with the Allen Agency. According to State regulations, bids will be accepted by the school district for vehicle insurance and for a high school computer lab.

Each school district in the state of Texas is required to hold an August 10 election regarding tax exemptions for County Education Districts. The SISD Board voted to consolidate our election with the Sherman County election in order to save expenses. The school district will provide more information concerning this election in a later issue.

Superintendent Brite gave a report on summer maintenance, his Superintendent's Conference in Austin, letter of disclaimer, and on the irrigation well at Mary Allen Elementary.

The meeting adjourned at 11:30 a.m.
