The State of Texas has ordered a state-wide election to be held on August 10, 1991 to vote on several constitutional amendments. There will be both county amendments and school district amendments. The school district amendments will help to govern the County Education District (CED) formed by the new education bill. The CED is a new taxing entity made up of the 13 school districts (SISD being one) in Sherman, Dallam, Moore, Hansford, and Potter counties. Each of the 13 school districts will collect at least .73 in taxes (perhaps more-determined Commissioner Education) to be sent to the CED. This money will then be disbursed to each school district. Therefore, CTD will not be available to PLEXAR I customers subscribing to optional Extended Metropolitan Service or Extended Area Calling Service.

If the company's application is approved, the monthl for CTD will be \$4.00 for each PLEXAR I station line. Prior to the June 19, 1991, interim rate approval, Southwestern Bell was billing customers who receive the service \$1.50 for each station line equipped with this feature. In addition, under Southwestern Bell's proposed tariff, every line within the PLEXAR I system must be equipped with this feature. The nonrecurring charge for the additional lines which must be equipped with CTD will be waived for existing CTD customers. The tariffed monthly rate will apply to all existing and future CTD customers.
