

Drive To Boost Grain Is Underway

Approximately 32 farmers and grain men met for breakfast at Lilly's Cafe Wednesday to map plans for expansion of grain sorghum promotion efforts.

C.W. (West) Anthony, president of Grain Sorghum Producer's Assn. in Castro County, was in charge of the meeting. Bill Nelson, executive vice-president of GSPA, and Nolan Chandler, association assistant, both of Amarillo, reported on past association programs and progress in interest of research, market development and service.

Nelson pointed out that since the organization was founded in 1955, using cattle feeding and swine feeding, foreign markets and industrial use had been increased.

In 1955, he said, there were 72 feed lots in Texas with ca-

capacity of 1,000 head. Today there are 140 such facilities. He added that in 1955 no grain sorghum was exported and now 100 million bushels, one-fourth of the national production, moves abroad.

Nelson commended colleges and research institutions in the area for expanded research efforts in recent years but stressed the need for continued research and educational attention to grain sorghum.

"It will remain a strong economic asset to Castro County," he said.

Ed Bennett and Wade Mills head the Hart grain program.

Both farmers and grain elevator operators attending commended the association leader and staff for great strides already made. They endorsed an expansion effort to obtain an area wide budget of \$74,000 with

\$11,000 to be raised in Castro County.

Anthony appointed individual farmers to be in charge of getting pledge slips signed in Hart.

the first couple of days have gone. . . the boys are showing lots of desire and hustle," said Coach Cleveland.

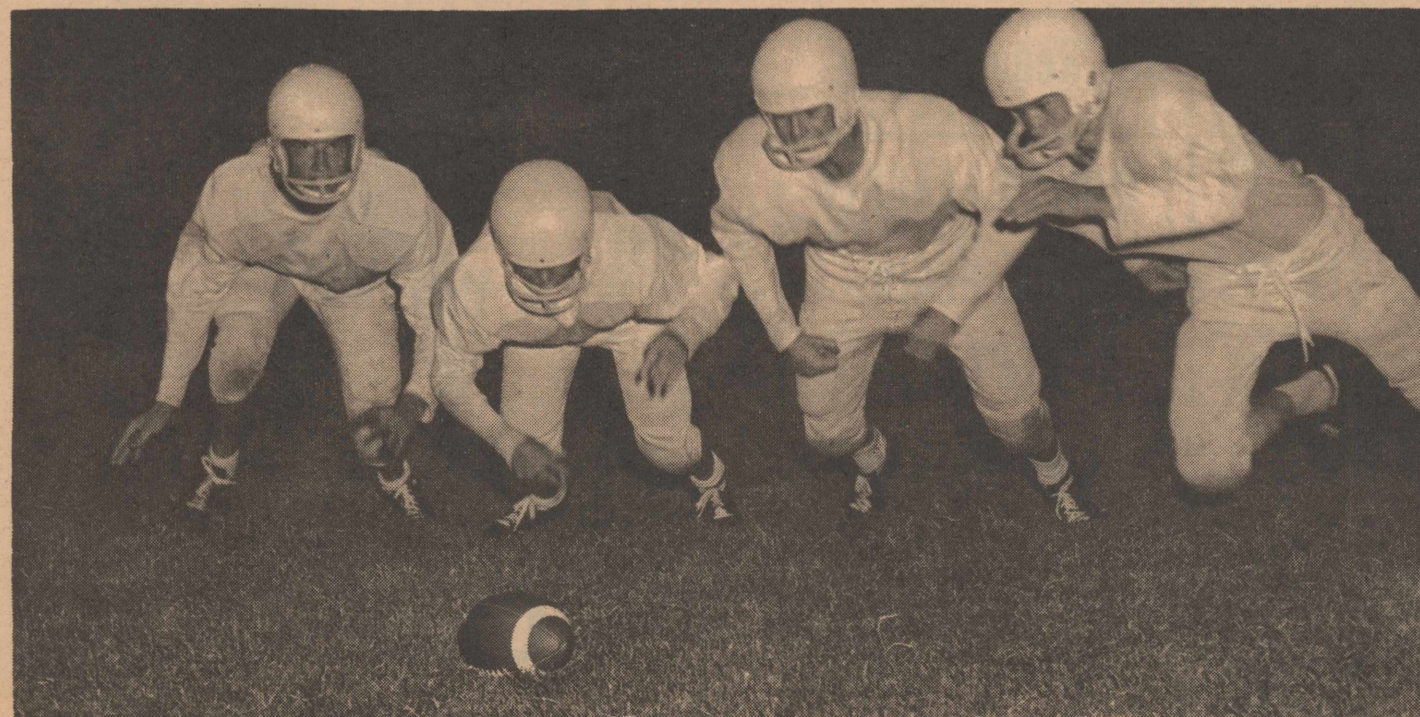
