Hart Meets Bovina Here Friday

Bovina Highly Favored

The Hart Longhorns will face the difficult task of stopping some of the best backs in Class B football this Friday evening when Bovina invades Hart Stadium.

Bovina, coached by talented Hallie Gee, romped over Friona last week by the score of 35-6. Tally Kelso, fullback, scored four times for Bovina.

The speedy back presently holds the area record for punt returns. Kelso returned an Amherst punt for an 83 yard touchdown.

Gee has worked his Bovina squad into one of the most fundamentally sound football teams in the state. He is considered by many to be one of the best coaches in high school football.

Coach Dub Cleveland does not stand around and admire the Bovina boys, however. The Horns are preparing to meet the toughest team yet faced but they are expecting to be a little tougher themselves.

Cleveland readily admits that Hart does have the talent to beat Bovina. He also wants it understood that many things can happen in a football game. If the Horns can roll smoothly offensively then, "We think we can beat them."

Johnny Kittrell will return to action this week and will start the Bovina game at right halfback. Cleveland has moved Bill Farris to the fullback position to give Hart a better running attack. Both Kittrell and Farris will see a lot of offensive duty this week.

The Longhorns proved to fans and to themselves that they can move the football. The Horns worked the ball very slowly in the first half of play. At the end of the half Hart had 16 points and one yard rushing.

The second half saw Hart score twelve points and rack up 136 yards. The offensive team showed signs of winning ability but the Owls took advantage of defensive mistakes to rack up 24 points in the first half and 12 in the second off 400 yards.

The prize money stayed in the Alexander family again this week. Calvin Alexander of Hart took first place by picking Silverton over Hart 28-18.

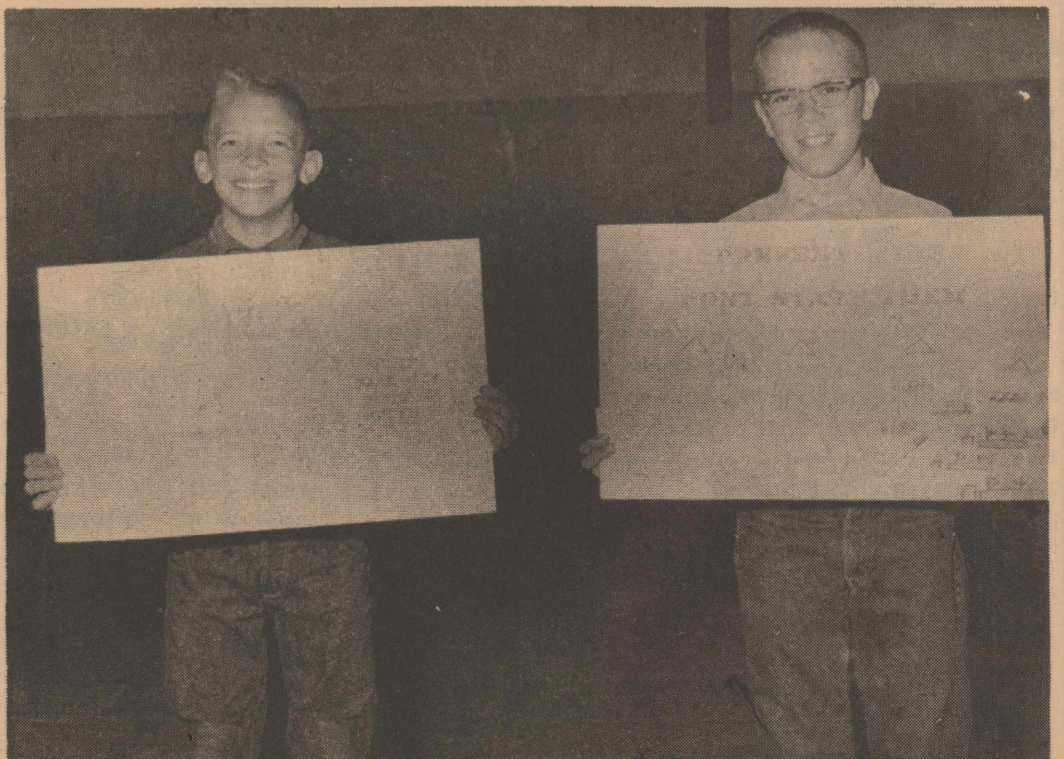
Alexander's wife, Jane, who won first prize last week, placed second by picking Silverton 18-12.

- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp cloves
- 1 tsp nutmeg
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 c nuts
- 1 c dates or raisins

Start at 350 degrees, turn to 200 degrees cook about 1 hr.

FILLING

- 1 c. sweet milk
 - 1 c. sugar
 - 1 tsp vanilla
- Boil to top of pan, pour on cake while hot. Punch holes in cake.

Edmonson Club Meeting Held

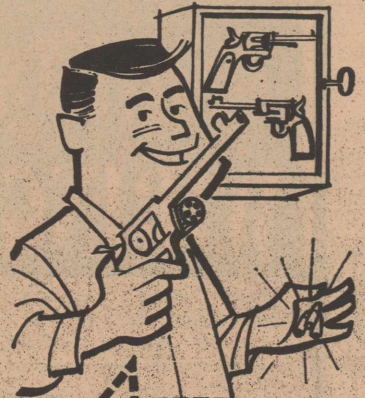
The Edmonson Men's Club met for their regular meeting Thursday at 7:30 p.m. at the Edmonson Community Center.

Menu will be enchiladas, beans, salad and cherry cobbler and drinks.

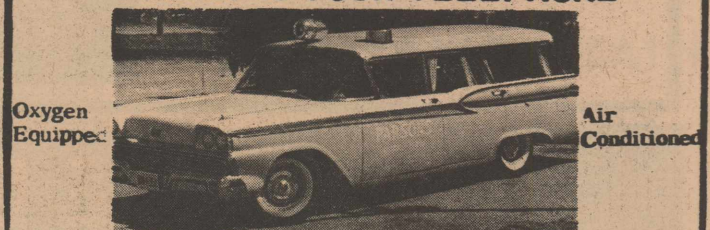
Tickets may be purchased at the door of the cafeteria the night of the supper.

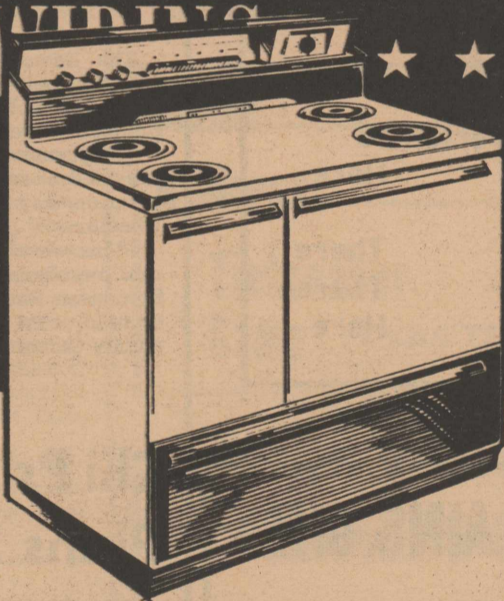
