### School Board Begins Planning Building

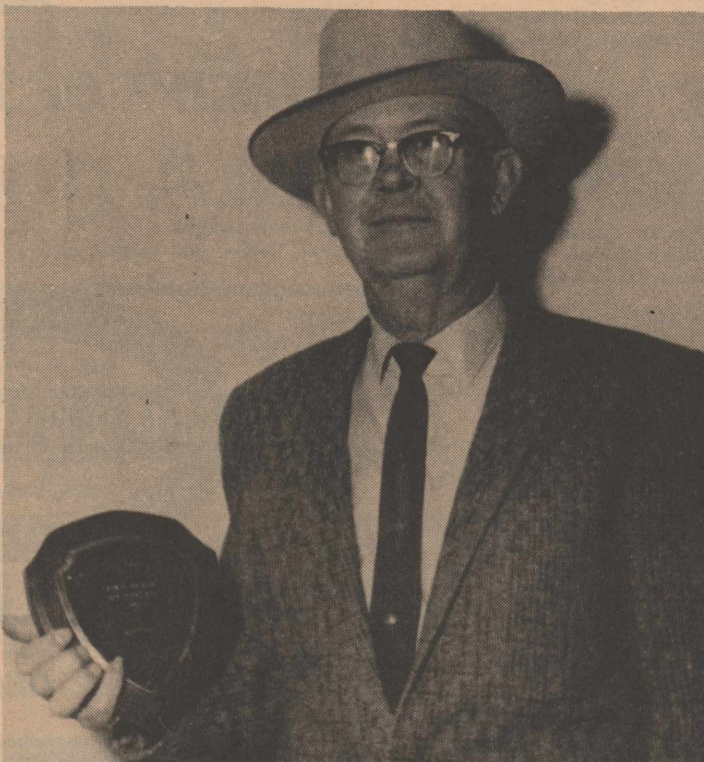
"There hasn't been a school built yet that would meet the needs of Hart. A school is as individual as a town or a person." This was the way Paul Kennedy, superintendent of Public Schools in Hart, expressed his views concerning the need for a new high school in this city. Kennedy met with the school board Monday evening to begin discussing plans for the new building. Board members include Rodney Smith, president, Gleen Reed, Lorenzo sident, R. G. Henderson, secretary and treasurer, Milton Sharp, Vice-president, Gleen Reed, Lorenzo Lee, Charlie Martin, and Doyle Davis.

The board is presently con-

sidering the type of building best suited for the Hart school system. Members are visiting several different schools with architects during the next couple weeks before taking any further steps.

During the next few days Hart residents will be questioned individually by the company to find out what the majority wants in the way of building and improving the area. Kennedy points out that whatever the people want they will get.

The bonding company and architect have been hired under an agreement that if the school district passes the bond issue and the building is constructed, they will do the job.

The hostesses presented the honoree with gifts of a diaper bag, electric bottle sterilizer

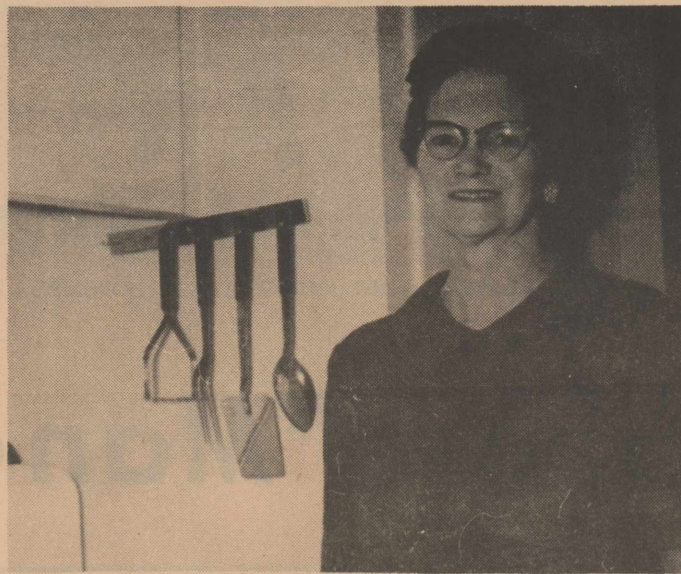

Other scorers in the contest included Dixie Kendricks and Jo Ann Clark with six points each.

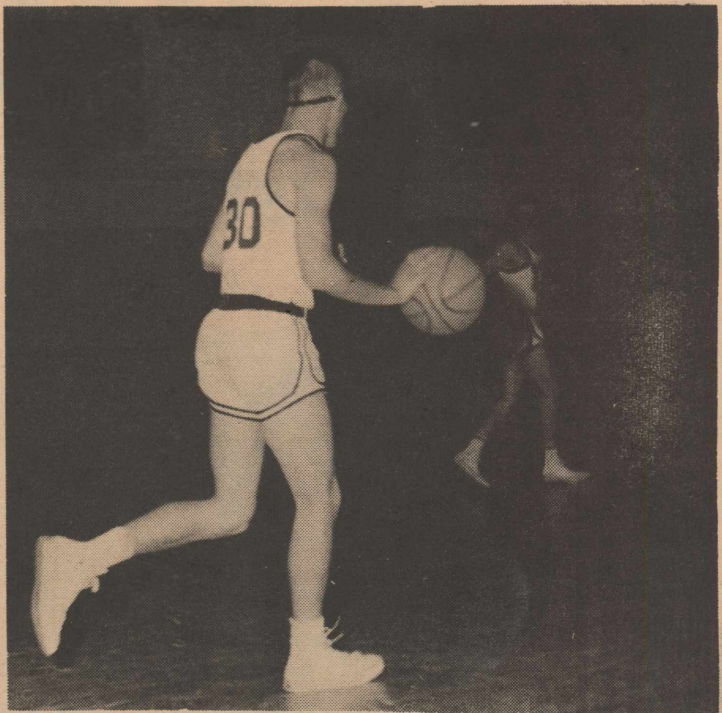
### Horns Edge Mustangs

The Hart Longhorns ran from the football field onto a basketball court last week in Olton and it looked for a moment as if they forgot to take off their football uniforms!

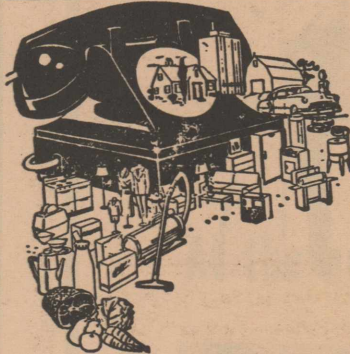
The Horns opened the regular basketball season in crude style against Olton but still beat the Mustangs 30-27.

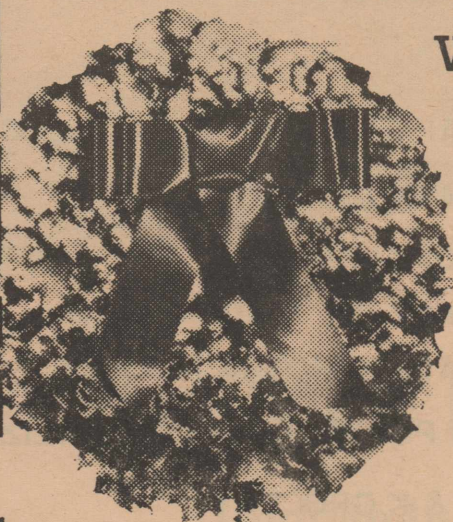
