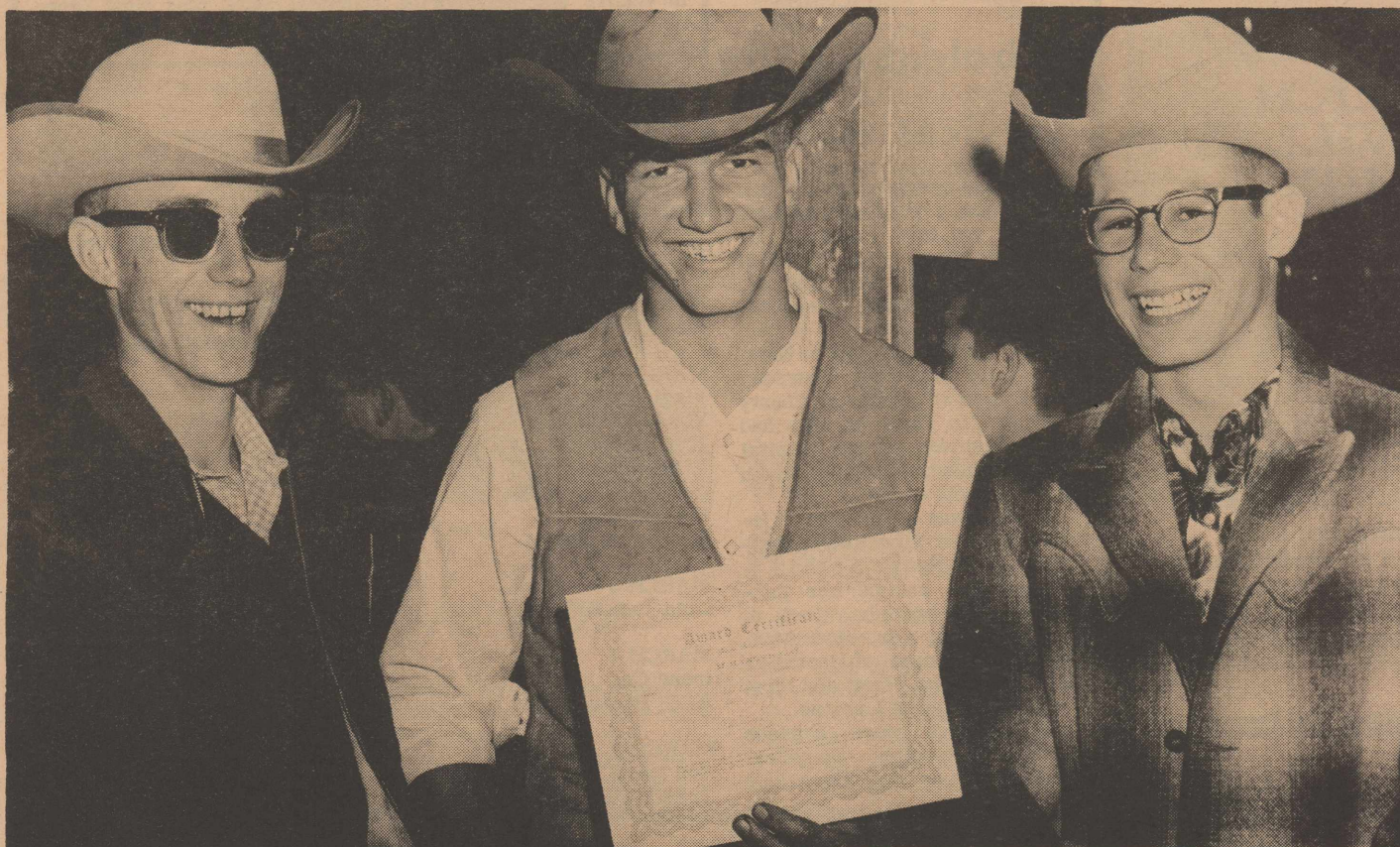

This project will create a series of dams and lakes up and down the water shed from Clovis, New Mexico, through the Texas counties in the organization.

M. Wright, Summerfield; and John Stork, Nazareth, county commissioners and Raymond E. Wilson, county judge.

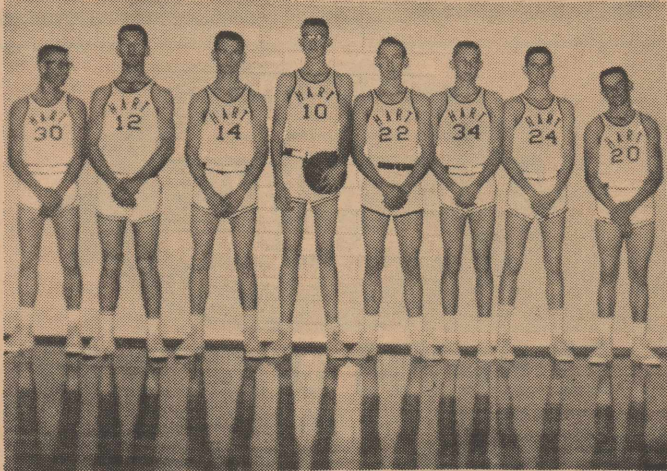

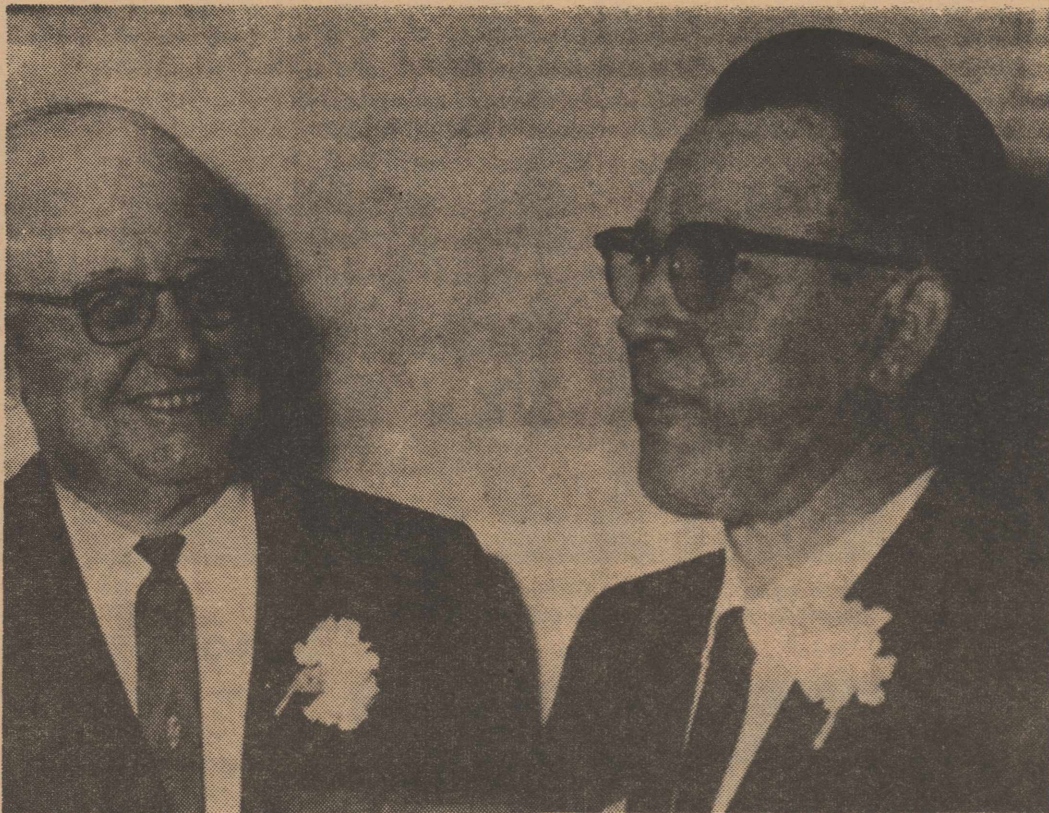

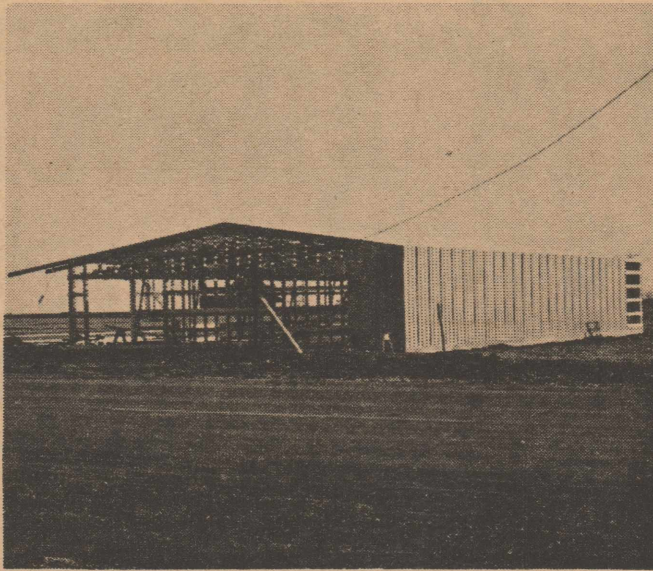

He commented, "We'll probably be favored along with Nazareth to win district."

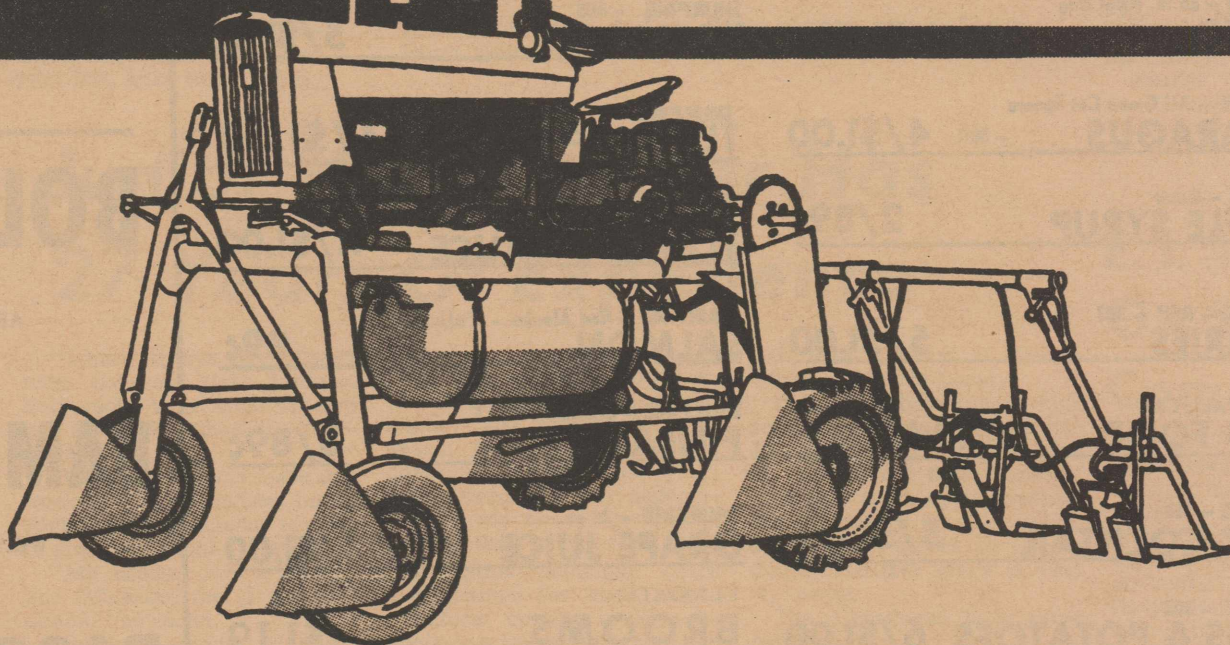
Coach said the girls have lost only two starters. Their prospects are good for next year, according to Nicholson.

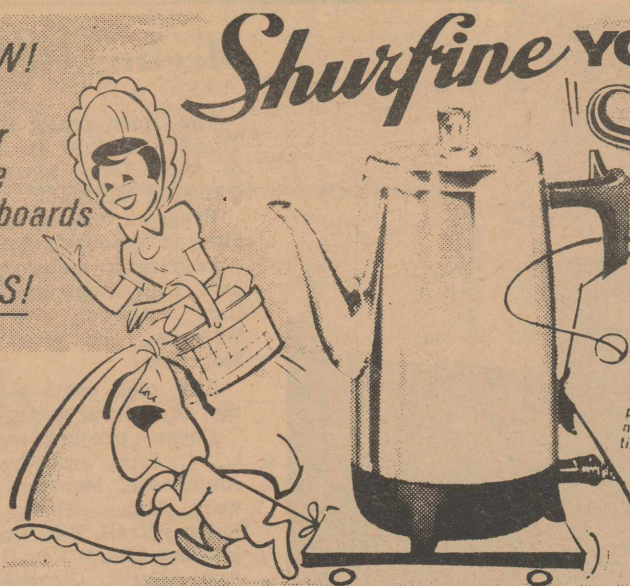
