New Bond Election Is Planned

B&K Opening Announced

Formal opening of the B and K Grocery is Saturday, April 20, owner Kenneth Lambert announced this week.

Lambert said, "Free merry-go-round rides will be offered to children as will free suckers and balloons."

He added, three baskets of groceries valued at \$25 each and three valued at \$15, will be given away at Saturday night's drawing.

Persons registering for the drawing do not have to be present to win, said Lambert.

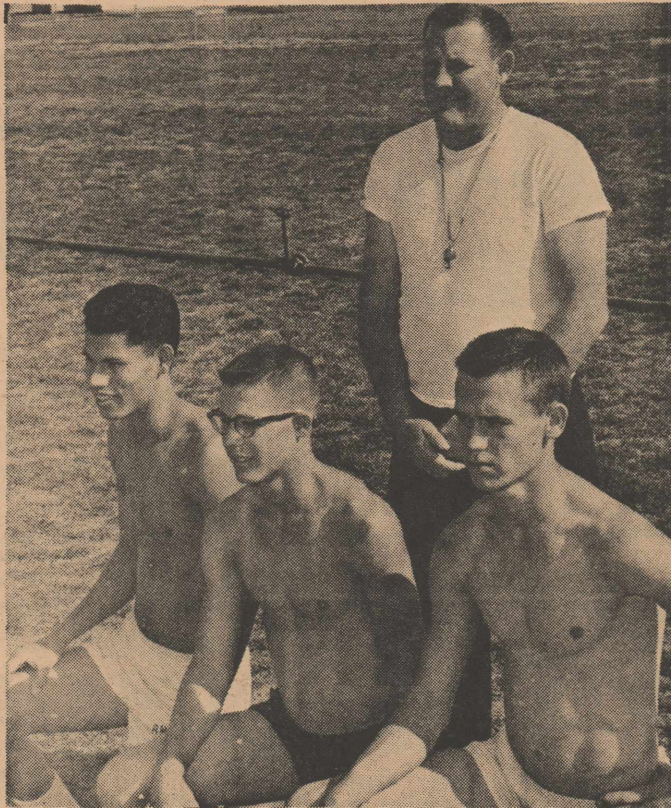
The Hart man has been in the grocery business since 1947, having begun work in a Plainview grocery store. He worked in the wholesale grocery business in 1946.

He moved to Hart in 1957 and bought out Homer Hill in 1959 to become full owner of his first grocery store.

Lambert said he started planning his new store about a year ago. "This store," said Lambert, referring to his new place of business, "is to be completely a grocery line, while the other store will handle just farm supplies."

Lambert said he thoroughly enjoyed the grocery business, although he puts in an average of 12 hours a day.

The grocery man said that the majority of prices are dropping on groceries. "Beef is down," added Lambert, "and staple goods are down two or three cents per item."

Hart school patrons soon will go to the polls again to determine the fate of an expansion program in the school district.

A new bond election is being planned for Saturday, May 4, it was learned this week.

Hart school board was scheduled to meet tonight to call the election and spell out details of the new bond proposal.

The board met last Thursday night for the first time since the April 6 trustee election and re-organized.

R. G. Henderson, who was re-elected April 6, was named president of the board, while Lorenzo Lee was elected vice-president and Milton Sharp secretary.

Attending for the first time was a new board member, Deryl Clevinger, who was elected in the April 6 vote.

The board discussed pros and cons of the \$460,000 bond issue which was defeated by a narrow margin on April 6. It also canvassed the returns of that election.

"We have begun circulating a petition to call a new election on the bond program," said board president Henderson. "We expect to call the election at our meeting Thursday night."

Henderson said the program will be changed some from the original proposal, but added that details would be made public after the meeting this week.

PLAINVIEW, Special:--Nine students from Olton and nine from Hart will be among 100 area students who will receive awards in essay, poster and project contests at the annual Plains American Heritage banquet at 6:30 p.m., Tuesday, April 23. The banquet will be held in Estacado Junior High School cafeteria in Plainview.

Some 300 winners, teachers and guests from over a five-county area are expected to attend the banquet.

Dr. John W. Drakeford, professor of psychology and counseling at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, will be speaker.

Hart essay contest winners are Carol Futrell, first; Jo Sanders, second; and Harvey Sullivan, third.

Poster winners are Rene Brooks, first; Rebecca Burress, second; and Carol Nivens, third.

Project contest winners are Charlotte Murray, first; Rosemary Lee, second; and Suzanne Constant, third.

Miss Sanders and Miss Futrell, were both essay contest winners last year and Miss Nivens was one of the top three winners in last year's poster contest.

First place winners will receive \$25 savings bonds. Second place winners will receive \$5 checks, and third place winners will be given \$3 checks.

Certificates will also be presented winners, who were chosen in competition within each school.

Fiery Joe Kerbel came to town Friday night and "hypnotized" his 265 listeners with tales of vigor, valor and determination.

The head football mentor at West Texas State University "entranced" athletes and guests alike at the Hart Athletic Banquet.

More than 50 athletes, representing three school sports, were recognized in the three-hour banquet. It was sponsored by the Hart Mother's Club, and held in the cafeteria.

Dr. Roy McCasland put on a well-applauded pantomime, in a 30-minute stint of entertainment. McCasland, besides being a top-entertainer is a Tulia dentist.

Master of ceremonies was Mrs. Laurence McLain. She introduced Coach Dub Cleveland, who recognized Coaches Eddie Nicholson and Don Hewitt. He then introduced Kerbel.

He told them, "Athletics is important to a community and nation--and you can be as good as you want to be." You have

to put more into a thing to get more out of it, said Kerbel.

The coach had a 76-15 win-loss record with two ties, while coaching in high school. He had championship teams, both at Breckenridge and Amarillo.

Kerbel told his audience, "Any time you find anyone with a good coaching record, you will find good athletes."

"At Breckenridge," said Kerbel, "I had boys like Jerry Tubbs and Dendy....why, you couldn't catch Dendy in a closet."

Athletics, said Kerbel, helps a person learn perseverance,

respect for fellow man, discipline, loyalty and devotion.

"An athlete gets a taste of life in every game," said the coach.

"Failure is only temporary" Kerbel said, "Unless one fails to fight back."

Persons, including non-athletes, need three bones said Kerbel, "A funny bone to laugh at their mistakes, a wish bone to wish great wishes and dream great dreams, and a back bone for determination to make those wishes and dreams come true."

A physical fitness program was presented by the sixth grade.

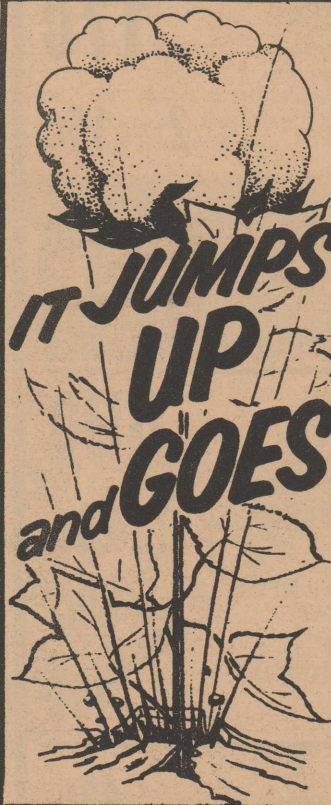
