## STORMS ROAM IN HART AREA

Hart and vicinity was bombarded Tuesday afternoon and well into the night by hard rain and marble-sized hail.

Farmers southwest of Hart said crops were badly damaged by the hail and sever winds.

A tornado funnel was sighted over the Johnny Clark home seven miles north of Hart but did not touch down.

From a half to two inches of rain was reported in and around Hart.

### Hart Rainfall Is Recorded

Hart and surrounding area received in the month of May 2.31 inches of rain.

In June the community has as of Tuesday, June 4, .79 inches of moisture.

This is according to government measurements made by H. E. Loman, who keeps a daily record.

### Former School Teacher Funeral Services Held

A former resident and teacher at Hart, Miss Ellen Robinson, died last week in a Clovis hospital at the age of 96.

She had been a school teacher for 59 years and taught in the Hart schools in 1908.

For the last 30 years, Miss Robinson had been living with a sister, Mrs. Lois Saxton, in Melrose.

Funeral services were held last Sunday in Clovis and burial was in a Clovis cemetery.

Officiating at services, held in Steed Memorial Chapel in Clovis, were J. L. Mackey, minister of Southside Church of Christ in Amarillo and Robert B. Hawkins, minister of the 16th and Pile Church of Christ in Clovis.

Miss Robinson had been in failing health for several years.

Other accomplishments included holding the superintendent of Plainview schools in 1912 and 1914.

She taught two years while completely blind.

She later regained her sight.

The former teacher was widely-known in this area especially by such old-timers as Mrs. Nora Ray, Earl Hacker, Percy Hart, Ira McLain, Carl Hankins and Fred Hamm.

Miss Robinson is survived by two brothers, A.J. of Waxahachie and R. O. of Clovis; four sisters, Mrs. A. B. Cathey of Fort Worth; Mrs. Laura South of Watervalley; Mrs. T.W. Hart of El Paso; and Mrs. Lois Saxton of Clovis.

### RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Hart's recipe of the week is submitted by Mrs. Calvin Alexander. Mrs. Alexander has lived in the Hart community all her life. She is a Star Route mail carrier. The Alexanders have one daughter, Kathy, age 10. They attend the Methodist Church. Following is a recipe for Spaghetti sauce and one for Banana Nut Cake.

**SPAGHETTI SAUCE**  
 2 pounds ground beef  
 1/2 pound ground pork  
 1 onion  
 2 cans tomato paste  
 2 cans tomato sauce  
 1/2 bottle ketchup  
 1 1/2 cups water  
 1/4 teaspoon garlic salt  
 1/4 teaspoon oregano  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 3 bay leaves  
 Brown beef, pork and onion. Add tomato paste, sauce, ket-

chup, water and spices. Simmer three hours. Serve over long spaghetti.

**BANANA NUT CAKE**  
 3 cups sugar  
 1 cup shortening  
 2 teaspoons vanilla  
 1 teaspoon butter flavor  
 4 whole eggs  
 3 1/2 cups flour  
 2 teaspoon (level) soda  
 1/4 teaspoon salt  
 1/2 cup buttermilk  
 6 bananas  
 1 cup chopped pecans  
 Cream shortening, sugar and flavoring. Add eggs one at a time.

Sift flour, soda and salt together add alternately with buttermilk and mashed bananas. Mix with shortening mixture. Add nuts.

Bake in a greased and floured 10-inch pan in a 425 degree oven for one and one-half hours.

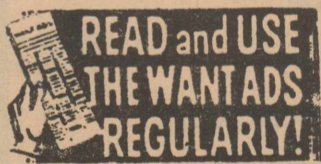
### No Diversion On Lost Wheat

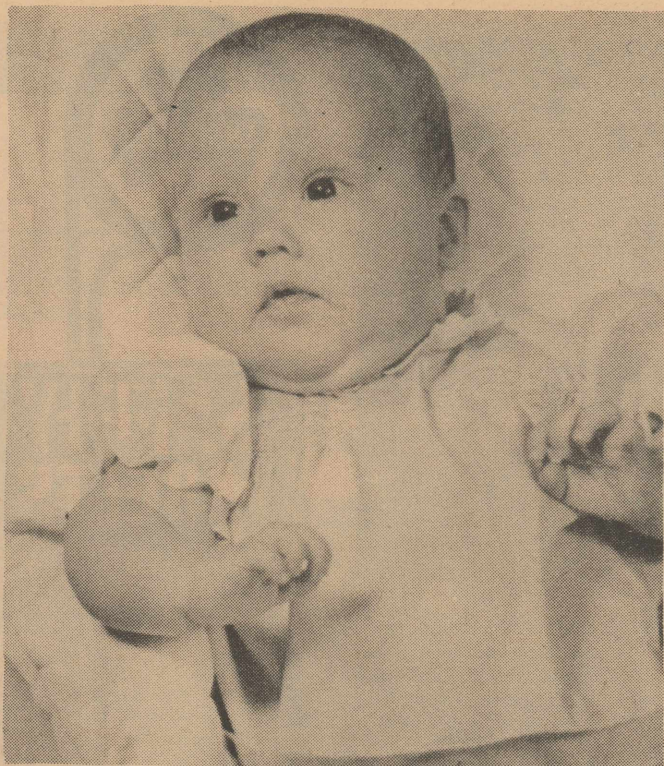
