## Hart School Bonds Are Sold

Hart school trustees Monday night voted to sell \$360,000 in school building bonds at an interest rate of 3.72 per cent.

Low bidder among five bids was First Southwest Corp. of Dallas, which was financial advisor for the building bond election.

Closest bid to that of First Southwest Corp. was 3.78 per cent.

The \$360,000 in bonds was approved by voters last May. Voters gave their okay to a new high school and junior high building.

Herbert Brasher, architect for the project, told the board

that it would take about six weeks for him to complete drawings on the new building contract.

Construction is expected to start sometime in September and should be completed in time for the opening of school in September of 1964.

The expansion program will provide a new gymnasium, nine general classrooms, two science laboratories, a library-study hall, commercial room and general administrative area.

Present high school will be converted to an elementary school.

## Sister Dies In Oklahoma

A sister of five Hart mendied last Wednesday in Taylor General Hospital in Vinita, Okla. She was 61-year-old Blanche

McLain and had been ill for eight months.

From here she moved to Vinita to live with a sister, Mrs. Sam Swopes.

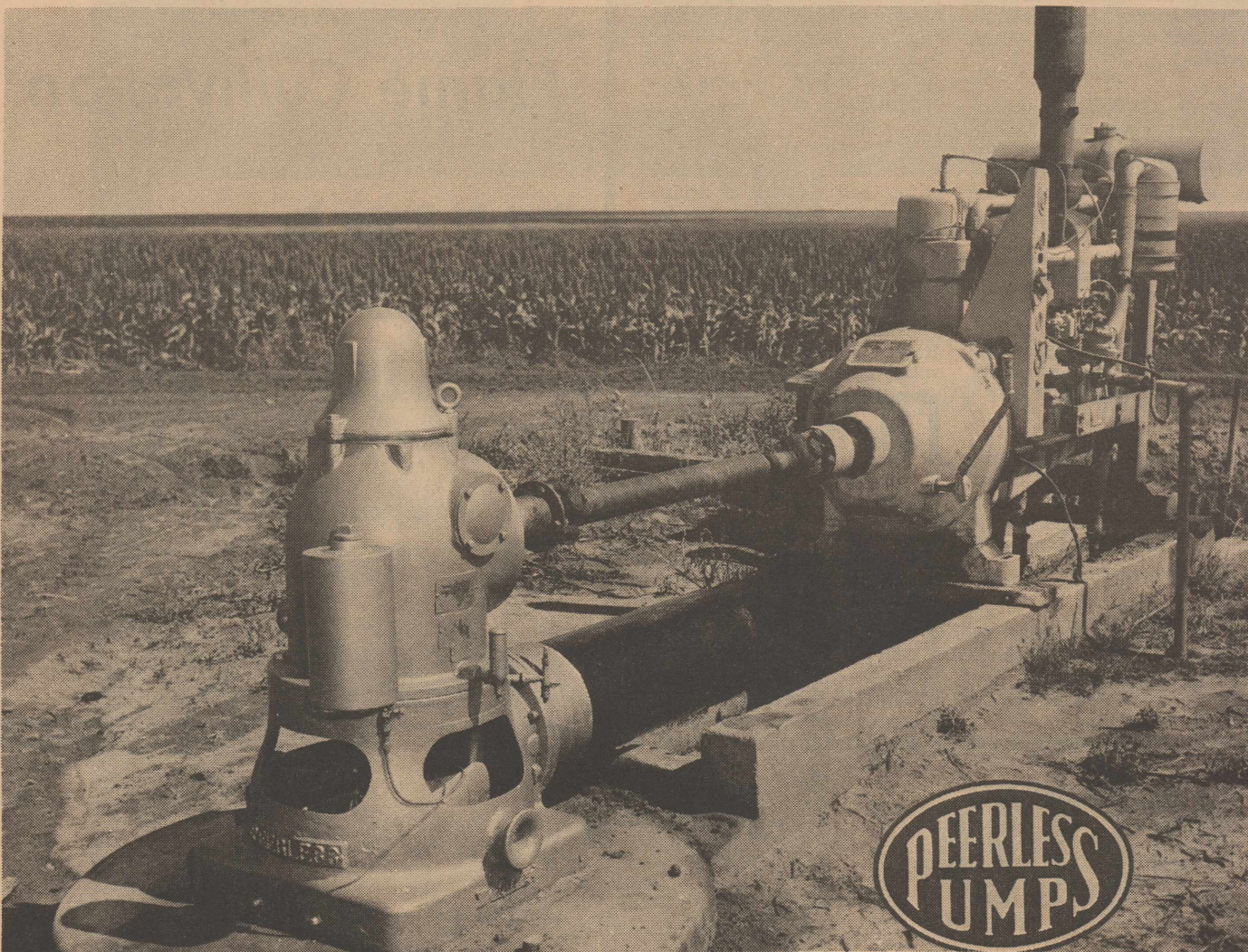
All entries must have been executed within the past two years and must be accompanied by a sketch. Work done under supervision is not eligible.

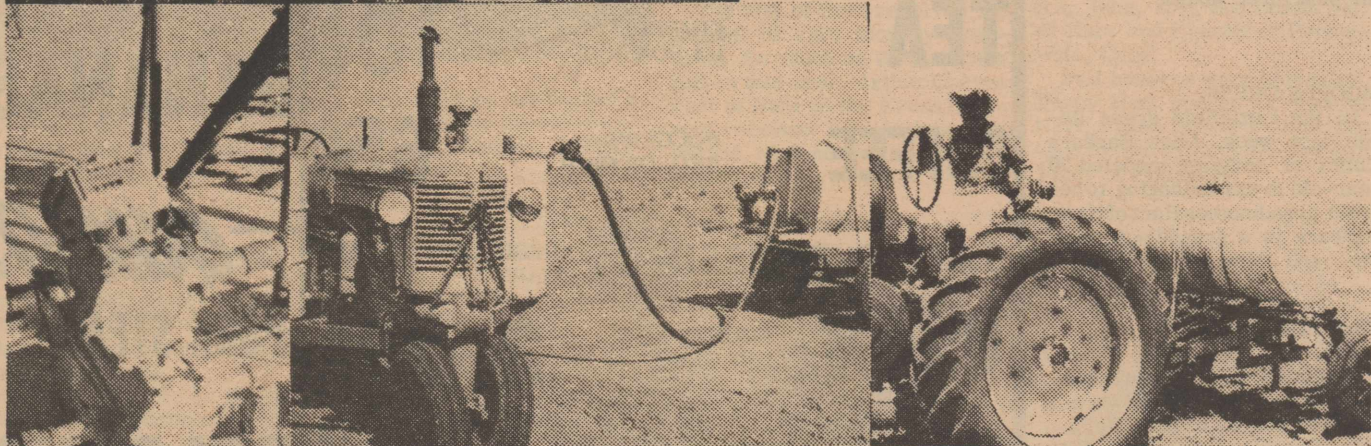
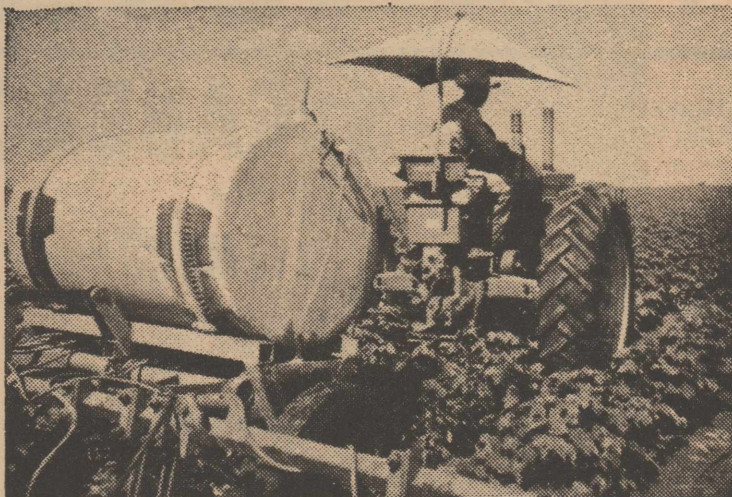
