Water, Sewer Project Near

Improvements for Hart's water system are "just around the corner" and progress is being made toward construction of a new sewage disposal plant, according to developments reported this week by Mayor Ed Harris.

The city has signed a con-tract for \$39,422 in water system improvements and works is to begin within 15 days of July 22, date of the contract signing.

Contractor is Panhandle Construction Co. of Lubbock, low bidder on the project.

Word came last week that the Texas Water Pollution Control Board unanimously approved the City of Hart's application for relocation of sewage disposal operations.

The city, planning to construct a new plant at a cost of about \$95,000, was given permission to change the location from two miles south of Hart to half a mile north.

A plant with a capacity of 72,400 gallons of effluent daily is planned. "We hope to sign a contract

on the sewer improvements in the very near future," said Mayor Harris.

Panhandle Construction Co. was also low bidder on the sewer project.

The contract for water system improvements calls for construction to begin by about Aug. 6 and to be completed within 120 working days.

The project includes eightinch water mains and fire hydrants in the business section, along with concrete flat storage of 200,000-gallon capacity.

Other lines in the city will be looped to put more pressure on the entire system, Mayor Harris said. "Some of the lines in the

business district have been there since we first had a town-site," the mayor said.

He said the improvements, also would result in a better water system in residential areas throughout the city.
