



For that special friend or shut-in, make a salad or candy and put in a pretty little bowl and give as a gift with insturctions to some time before the next Christmas, fill bowl and pass along as you have.

Here are some delicious salad recipes and they are good all during the year, not only at Christmas time. I never make candy.

When we take our vacation, the ladies and I always exchange recipes and these are some I brought from Illinois this fall.

AMBROSIA
Take 2-131/2 ounce can frozen pineapple chunks (drained of liquid) 5 medium size oranges, 2 full bananas, 2 cups seedless grapes, 1 can Angel Flake Coconut; 1-7 ounce bottle ginger ale and small jar of Marashino cheeries.

APRICOT SALAD

1 package orange gelatin, 1 cup boiling water, 1 cup apri-cot nectar, 3 ounce package cream cheese, 1 flat can crushed pineapple, 1/4 cup walnuts.

Dissolve gelatin in boiling water add apricot juice, chill until firm. Blend cream cheese with pineapple. Spread over apricot gelatin and sprinkle walnuts on top.

FROZEN FRUIT SALAD

1 medium can crushed pineapple drained, 3 ounces cream cheese, one 7-ounce bottle of lemon lime carbonated drink, 2 packages frozen peaches, thawed and sliced, I cup seedless grapes, 1 cup whipping cream, 1 1/2 cup small marshmallows.

Blend the pineapple and cheese, stir in beverage, and mix in fruit in cheese mixture. Partly freeze and whip cream, and fold in marshmallows and fold in cream cheese mixture.

1 CUP SALAD

1 cup Angel Flake coconut, I cup Mandarin orange slices, I cup pineapple tidbits drained, 1 cup chopped marshmallows and mix with 1 cup sour cream and let stand over night. Marashino cherries may be added.


