Connie Bailey Enters Contest

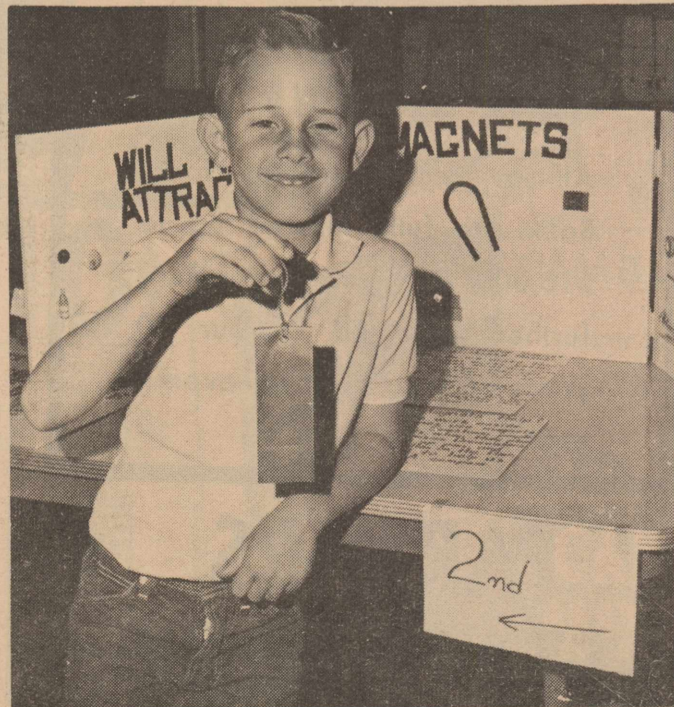
Connie Bailey will represent the Hart FFA Chapter in the Princess Contest to be held at Lubbock, Saturday, March 14.

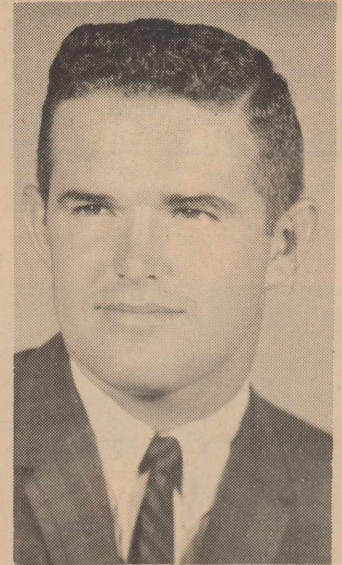

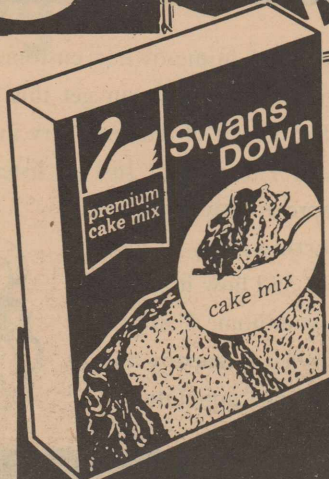

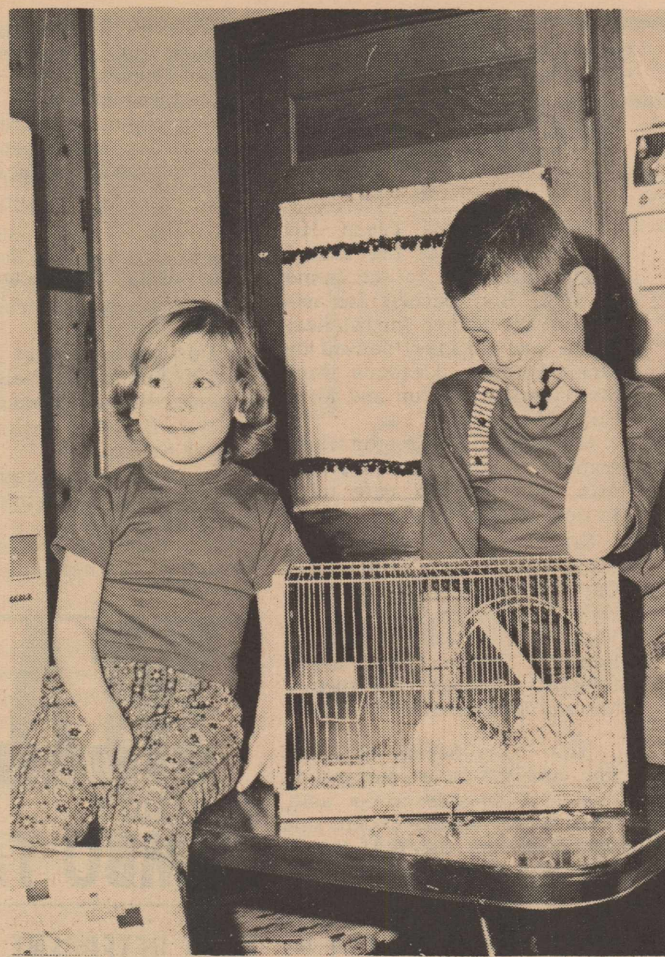
Swine Course Held Here


