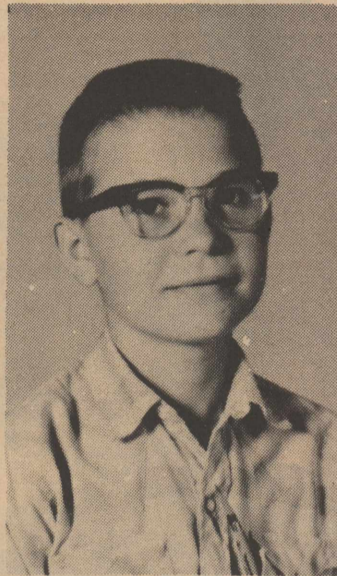

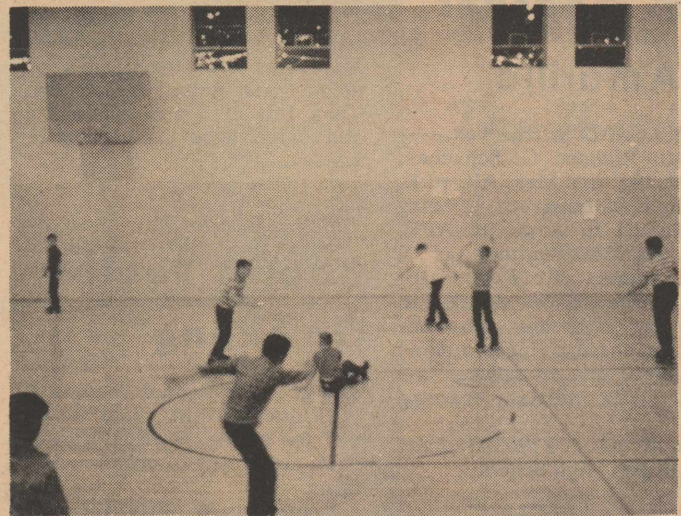
761 Poll Tax Receipts Issued In Precinct 1

Grading Not So Bad Says Hart School Teacher

"I always said I wouldn't teach because I didn't want to have to grade papers," laughs Mrs. Zula Jane Atwood, now in her tenth year of teaching school.

"I knew about that because my mother was a teacher," she explains, adding:

"Therefore, I studied business in college so that I could work in an office. But when my junior year arrived, the thought of sitting at a typewriter all day was worse than grading papers."

Mrs. Atwood then made plans to take some courses in education so that she might teach. Working at Vacation Bible Schools for a District Missionary and at summer camps had already taught her that she enjoyed working with children.

"That haunting spectre of paper grading just faded into the background," she notes.

Mrs. Atwood is a first grade teacher at Hart and has taught four years in the local school system. She has also taught at Tahoka, Henrietta, Idalou and Rio Vista.

She says that she thinks teaching is the most interesting and rewarding work that a working mother can do. She was influenced in this direction by her mother, who has taught school for over 35 years.

Should a teacher be dedicated?

"I would say an unqualified

'Yes' if, by dedication, you mean doing the best job of teaching you know how to do," answers Mrs. Atwood.

A graduate of Rio Vista High School, she majored in elementary education, English and business with a science minor at Mary Hardin-Baylor College, Belton.

She has now completed half of the requirements for a Master's Degree at West Texas State University, Canyon.

"It gives me such a feeling of accomplishment to hear children reading at the end of school when they knew nothing about reading at the beginning," explains this first grade teacher.

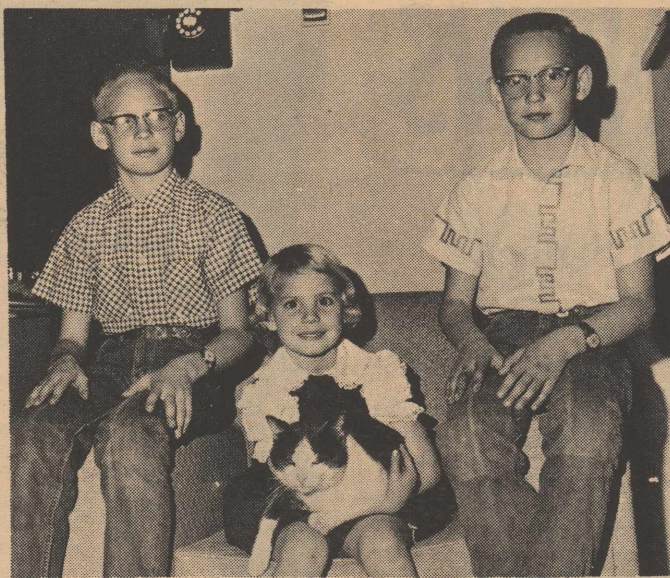

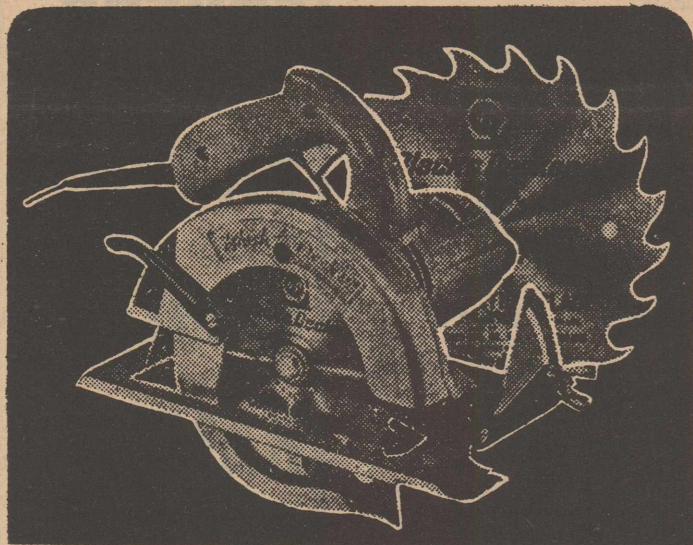
