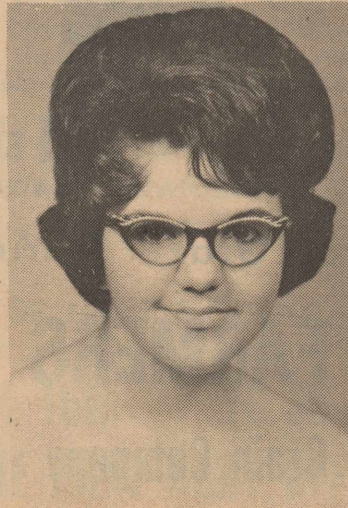

She has been a cheerleader for the past two years, in the

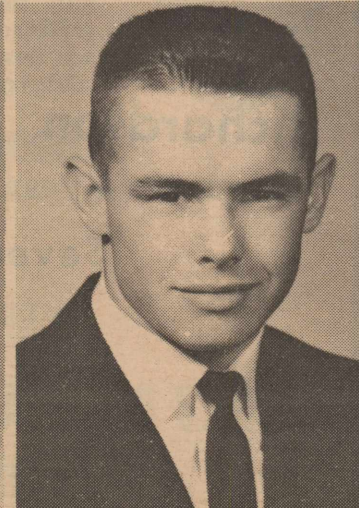
senior play, on the pep squad for three years and has been a class officer three years. She was named all-district in basketball her junior and senior years.

## No More Blue Mondays
