Youth Drowns In Farm Pond **Near Hart**

Ernest Williams, 17-yearold Negro from Austin, drowned in an irrigation reclamation pond on the Paul Armstrong farm near Hart Sunday.

Funeral is set Sunday in Granger with Dennis Funeral Home, Dimmitt, in charge of arrangements.

Body of the youth was re-covered about 2:30 p.m. Sun-day. He was believed to have died about noon of that day.

He and his brother, Alfred, 15, were said to have planned to swim in the pond with the aid of two auto innertubes.

Reports said that Ernest tossed his innertube into the Boys To Go pond, wind swept it away from shore and the youth jumped in the water in an effort to grab the tube and missed it.

His brother, standing on the bank, tossed his innertube to the victim.

The wind also carried this tube away and the boy sank from sight after coming up one

The body was recovered near a drainpipe which leads under a farm road.

The Armstrong farm is located six and a half miles southwest of Hart.

The pond varies from six to 15 feet deep.






