Youth Drowns In Farm Pond Near Hart

Ernest Williams, 17-year-old Negro from Austin, drowned in an irrigation reclamation pond on the Paul Armstrong farm near Hart Sunday.

Funeral is set Sunday in Granger with Dennis Funeral Home, Dimmitt, in charge of arrangements.

Body of the youth was recovered about 2:30 p.m. Sunday. He was believed to have died about noon of that day.

He and his brother, Alfred, 15, were said to have planned to swim in the pond with the aid of two auto innertubes.

Reports said that Ernest tossed his innertube into the pond, wind swept it away from shore and the youth jumped in the water in an effort to grab the tube and missed it.

His brother, standing on the bank, tossed his innertube to the victim.

The wind also carried this tube away and the boy sank from sight after coming up one time.

The body was recovered near a drainpipe which leads under a farm road.

A boat belonging to Norris

Sampler was used in the recovery.

The Armstrong farm is located six and a half miles southwest of Hart.

The pond varies from six to 15 feet deep.

The two boys came to Hart from Austin about a year ago. They lived in Hart with an uncle, Charley Scott, who works for Paul Armstrong.

Survivors include one other brother and his mother both of Austin.
