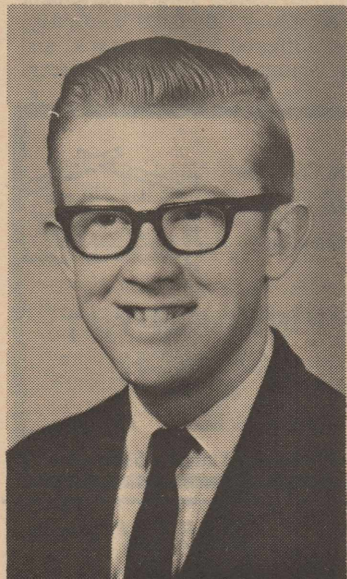

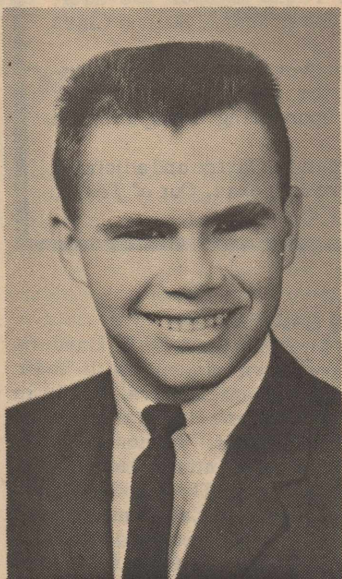

## Hart FFA Judging Teams Place High At Texas Tech

Teams from the local FFA chapter placed high in the area I Judging Contest held at Texas Tech this past weekend. The Tech contests are used as the Area I eliminations in livestock, dairy cattle, meats, poultry, and dairy products.

The dairy products judging team, composed of George Bennett, Elgin Brooks and Joe Bob Sanders, placed second in Tech contest, second in Area, and first in Plainview District.

George Bennett was fourth high individual and Elgin Brooks fifth high individual in the entire contest.

This team will represent Hart and Area I in the state judging

contests held at Texas A&M this weekend.

The dairy cattle judging team, made up of Mark Martin, Bob Crick, and Danny Godfrey placed fifth in the Tech Contest, fifth in Area and second in District. They also will compete in the state contests at A&M.

The meats judging team placed eighth in the Tech Contest, fifth in Area, and second in district.

Only the top four teams in area I qualify for state.

The meats team is composed of Harvey Sullivan, Billy Inscore and Tommy Morrison. Harvey Sullivan was eighth high individual in the entire contest.

The land judging team, composed of David Gardner, James Mitchell and Roger Davis placed eighth and David Gardner was 10th high individual. The land judging team was second in district.

The poultry judging team placed eleventh in Area I. Only the top 10 teams qualify. Wesley Bennett, Jerry Parker and Billy Bell make up the team.

## Voting Places

Polling places for the first primary of the Republican Party in Castro County were announced this week by County GOP Chairman Jimmy Singer, Dimmitt.

Precincts 5 and 6 (the Hart area) will vote at the Legion building in Hart. At Sunnyside, precinct 10, voting will be at the Jon Little home.

In each of the 15 voting boxes of the county, the GOP will combine voting precincts in the same voting place, but with separate ballot boxes.

## Hart Voters To Name First Primary Choices

Hart voters, both Democrats and Republicans, will go to the polls here Saturday for the first swing on the political merry-go-round.

With the two-party system still something of a novelty in this county, local voters will make their choices at separate polling places in the Saturday primary.

A Republican primary was held for the first time here in 1962.

Only local races with more than one candidates are district

attorney and county commissioner, precinct 1.

Seeking the district attorney spot are Steve L. Hurt and Frank Stovall, both of Plainview.

Hurt has served as Hale County attorney for the past three years.

Stovall has served two years as assistant district attorney in Houston.

Four candidates, T.C. Ray, E. I. (Tump) McClain, John Rice and M.L. (Buster) Aven, are seeking the commissioners post.

McClain, the incumbent, is seeking his second term.

Ray is a former county commissioner and Hart farmer. He served as commissioner from 1956 to 1960.

Rice is a retired farmer who has lived in the county for the past 53 years.

Aven has been a resident of precinct 1 for 37 years.

On the state level, Governor John Connally is being opposed by Don Yarborough, Harris County; M. T. Banks, Jefferson County; and Johnnie Mae Hackworth, Washington County.

The U.S. senator's race has drawn six candidates, four of them Republicans.

Ralph Yarborough, incumbent, will be opposed in the Demo Primary by Gordon McLendon of Dallas County.

Harold Bob Bennett was notified this week that his interscholastic league spelling paper had been graded 100 percent by the state graders.

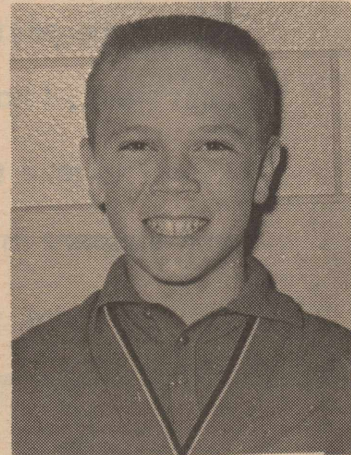
"We wish to congratulate you upon being one of the few contestants whose papers were sent to the state office," the letter of notification said.

"We hope that you will enjoy participation in many more interscholastic league contests."



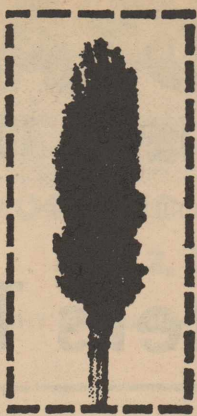

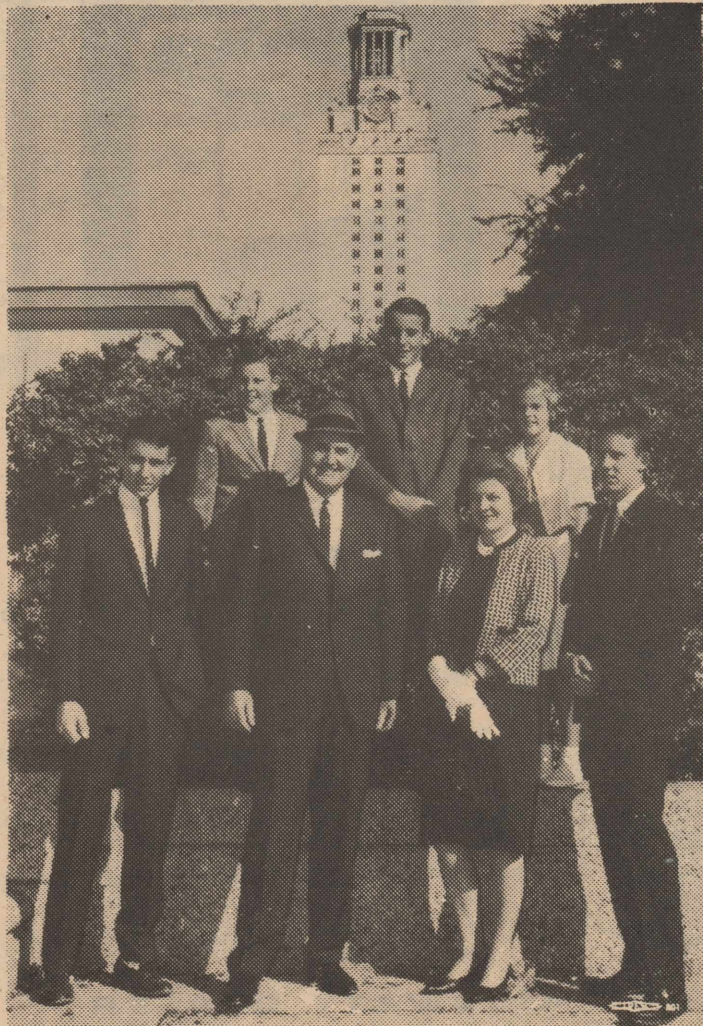
