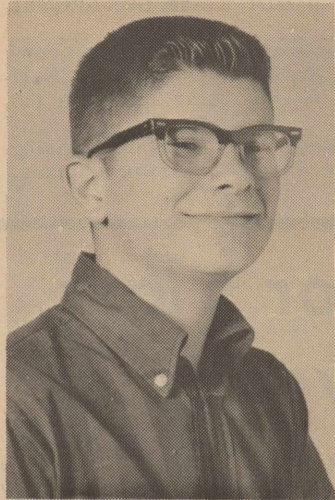

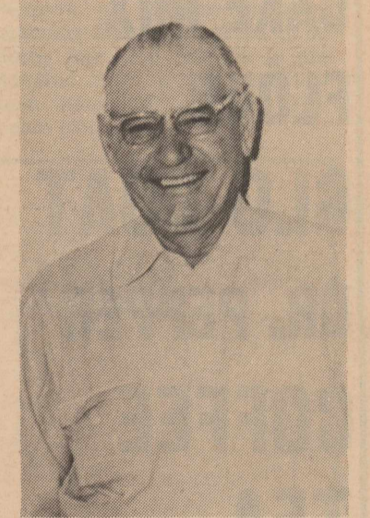
Burial was in Hart Cemetery under direction of Wood-Dunning Funeral Home.

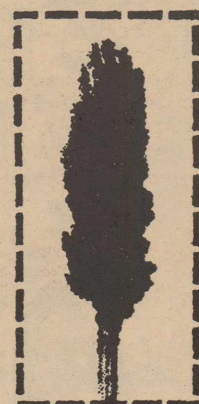

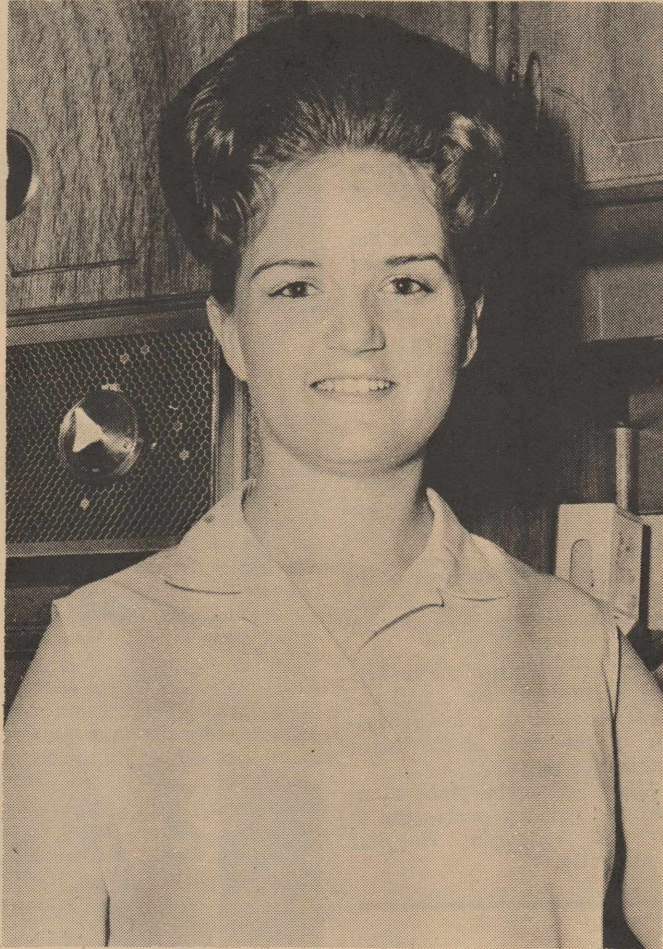

Recipe Of The Week

PINEAPPLE CHIFFON CAKE

Preheat oven. Sift an ample amount of flour onto a square paper. Drain well 1 No. 2 can crushed pineapple.

Measure and sift together:
2 cups flour
1 1/2 cup sugar
3 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. salt

Make a well and add in order, 1/2 cup cooking oil; 7 unbeaten eggs yolk, 3/4 cup pineapple juice, 2 tsp. grated lemon rind, 2 tsp. vanilla, 1/2 cup well drained crushed pineapple. Beat with spoon until smooth.

Measure into large mixing bowl 1 cup egg whites, 1/2 tsp. cream of tartar, whip until

whites form very stiff peaks. (Do not under beat).

Pour egg yolks mixture gradually over whipped egg whites, gently folding with rubber scraper just until blended. Do not stir. Pour into ungreased pan immediately. Bake at 325 degrees for 65 to 70 minutes.

CREAMY PINEAPPLE ICING

Cream together thoroughly, 2 tbsp. high grade shortening, 1 tbsp. butter, 1/4 tsp. salt, 1/2 cup sifted confectioners sugar. Add alternately, 2 1/2 cup sifted confectioners sugar and 1/2 cup drained crushed pineapple. Beat until creamy.

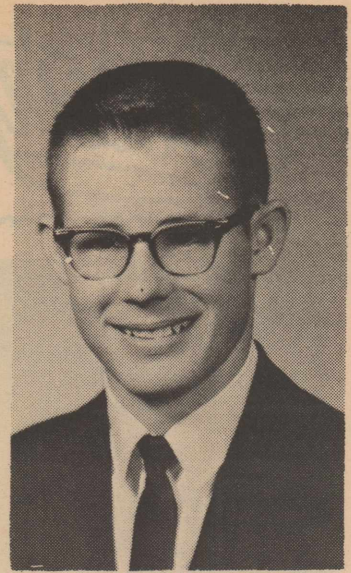
Dennis McLain Stars In Track

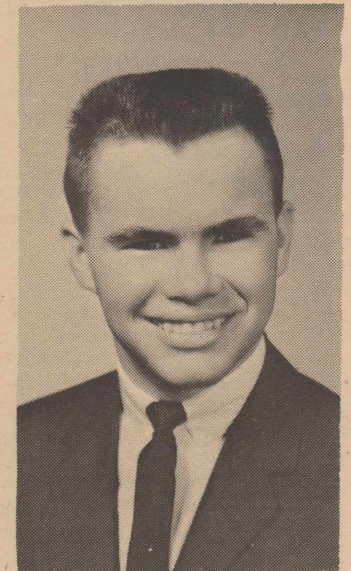
Miss Rubalcaba To Be Nurse
