



NEW PLANT TAKES SHAPE

The Tide Industries branch plant in Hart is rapidly taking shape east of town.

The Union Carbide subsidiary is investing between \$150,000 and \$175,000 in the fertilizer blending plant.

At present only the wood framework is up, but construction is proceeding at a rapid pace.

The Hart plant is one of several being built in the area. The plant at Littlefield is having its grand opening Sunday, and plants at Hereford and Farwell are now being completed. A plant will also be built at Seagraves.

Three of the plants have already been in use for some time. These plants are at Hearne, El Campo and Jennings, La.

The Hart plant will employ about four persons year-round. These include an agronomist, a plant manager, a salesman and a warehouse manager.





LEGAL NOTICE

ORDINANCE NO.24
AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE DIGGING OF CESSPOOLS
ON PROPERTY WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE
CITY OF HART, TEXAS, WHICH IS ACCESSIBLE TO THE
SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM, FORBIDDING THE PUMPING
OF EXISTING CESSPOOLS AND SEPTIC TANKS ONTO THE GROUND, AND FIXING THE PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HART, TEXAS:

SECTION I: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to dig a cesspool or install a septic tank on any property within the corporate limits of the City of Hart," Texas, to which the sanitary sewer system of the City of Hart is available.

SECTION II: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to empty the contents of any cesspool and/or septic tank on to the ground within the corporate limits of the City of Hart, Texas.

SECTION III: Any person, firm or corporation who violates, refuses or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon con-viction shall be punished by a fine in any sum not exceeding \$100,00.

SECTION IV: The invalidity of any section, sub-section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, word or words of this ordinance, shall not invalidate any other part of this ordinance. It is the intent of the City Commission in enacting this ordinance that the provisions hereof are separable and no provision hereof shall become inoperative or fail by reason of the invalidity of any other provision.

Loss Of Soil Nitrogen

A review of research recently released by TVA provides additional insight into losses of nitrogen by way of volatilization in the ammonia form into the atmosphers. The report was primarily a sumary of the research work done on topdressing the various forms of dry nitrogen fertilizer such as ammonium sulphate, ammonium nitrate and urea.

The summary pointed out that nitrogen losses can occur on alkaline, calcareous soils which contain free calcium carbonate (caliche). The ammonium sulphate, ammonium nitrate or urea can apparently react with calcium carbonate to form ammonium carbonate. This compound is unstable and will break down and release nitrogen as a gaseous ammonia.

The extent of the loss will obviously depend on several factors. First, soils with a pH or soil reaction of 7.8 or 7.9 or less will contain little or no free calcium carbonate, hence, very little loss would be expected on these soils.

Soils with pH 7.9 or above usually contain free calcium carbonate. Soils with pH of 8.2 or 8.3 usually contain an excessive amount. When nitrogen is topdressed on these soils, losses can occur. Losses will usually be greater on hot days.

Losses can be prevented or decreased tremendously if the fertilizer is watered in soon after application or if it is chiseled into the soil or disked or plowed in.

The magnitude of losses of nitrogen by research workers varies considerably. Most of those reported will average around 10 to 20 percent loss of the nitrogen when left on the surface. Losses were usually greater from ammonium sulphate than from ammonium nitrate. This is because half the nitrogen in the ammonium nitrate is in the nitrate form.
