






POLL TAX FIGHT RE-NEWED -- Bills which would put poll tax repeal on the Nov., 1966, ballot --via constitutional 1966, ballot -- via constitutional amendments - have been introduced in both houses of the Legislature.

A proposal by Sen. Franklin Spears of San Antonio also would try to extend the vote to all military personnel who qualified under residency requirements presently applicable to other Texas voters.
