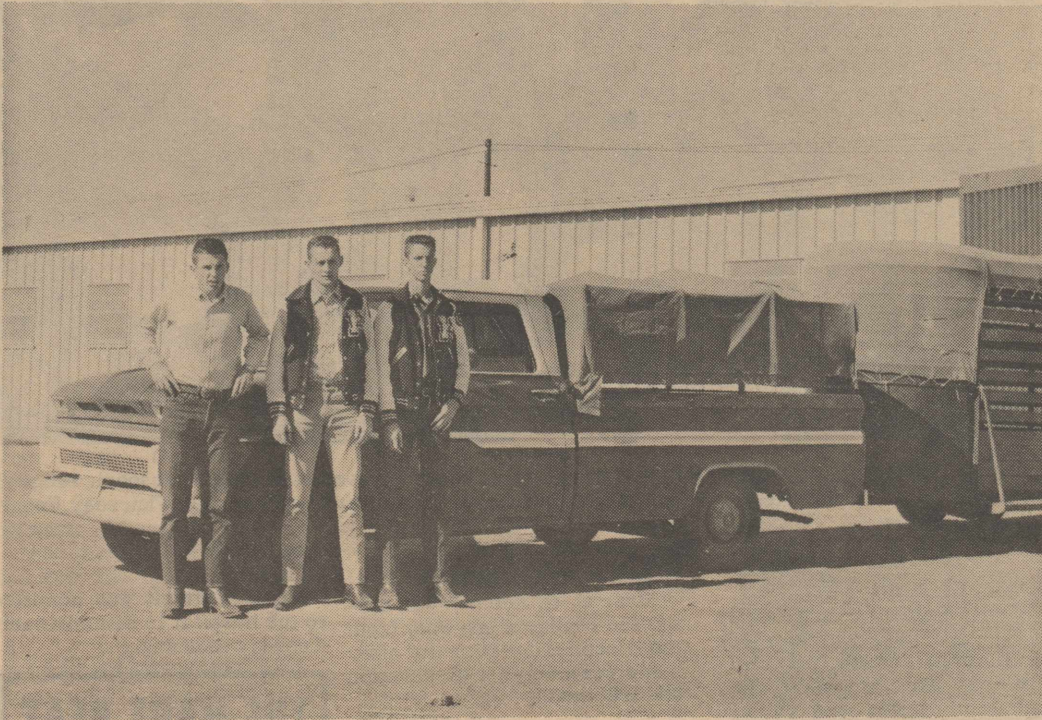

Miss Nellie Wingren has submitted the recipe for this week. "Aunt Nellie," as she is better known, retired in 1963 from teaching after 41 years. She taught schools in Lubbock and Perryton.

BANANA NUT CAKE

2 c. sugar
2 c. flour
4 medium size bananas
3 eggs (separated)
3/4 c. shortening
3/4 t. soda
1 t. baking powder
6 T. buttermilk
1 t. vanilla
3/4 c. nut meats

Cream shortening and sugar. Add 3 tablespoons of the buttermilk, slightly mashed bananas, chopped nuts, (slightly floured), egg yolks (slightly beaten). Add the soda to remainder of the buttermilk. Combine baking powder and flour. Alternate flour and milk to mixture. Add vanilla and very stiffly beaten egg white. Bake in stem pan that has been floured for 1 hour at 350 degrees.
