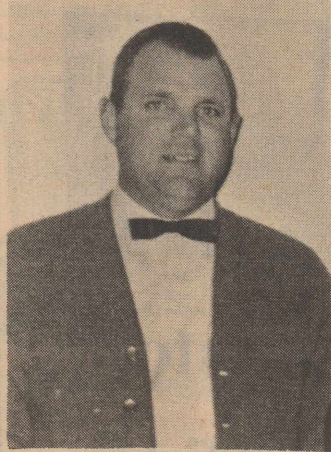

5 Candidates Seek 2 Posts On Local Board

Hart school district voters get their chance to fill two vacancies on the Hart School Board when the polls open at Hart City Hall Saturday.

Five persons have filed as candidates in the election, with Deryl Clevenger the only incumbent seeking return to office.

Both Clevenger and R. G. Henderson's terms expire this year.

Others running for the spots are Darrell Lacy, Claude Cox, Newlon Rowland and Mrs. Laurence McLain.

Background information was obtained from all candidates except Mrs. McLain, who is still recuperating from the recent auto crash.

Clevenger has lived in Hart the past 10 years. He was born in Tulia and graduated from high school there. He received his bachelor of science degree from Abilene Christian College and is currently president of the Hart Parent-Teacher Association.

He is married and has three children, Iona, 15, Dee, 12, and Duane, 10.

Clevenger also heads the Boy Scout program in Hart.

Lacy was born in Littlefield and moved to the Hart area in 1944 when he was 12.

He graduated from Hart High School and served in the Air Force in the Korean War. He went to business college in Plainview and attended night school three years at the University of Tennessee.

He is married to the former Joanne Cantrell of Nashville, Tenn., and has two children, Diane, 12, and Dale, 8.

He is a member of the American Legion and the Hart Volunteer Fire Department.

Cox is also a graduate of Hart High School. He attended West Texas State University and formerly served two terms on the Hart City Council.

He and his wife have four children, Veronica, 13, Steve, 11, Mike, 9, and Larry, 8.

He has lived in Hart all of his life. He is a member of the Hart Volunteer Fire Department, the Lions Club and Scottish Rite.

Advisor for the group is Mrs. Louise Carter.

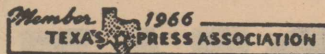

Hart Couple's Son Picked To Attend Florida Meet

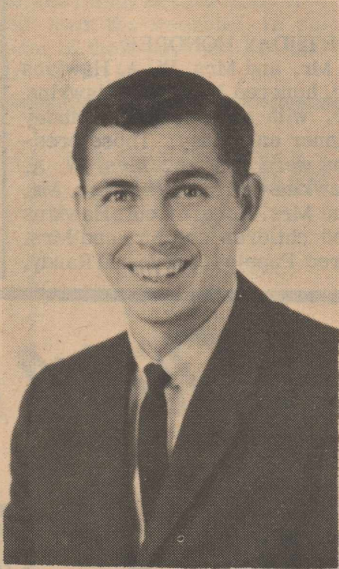
April 1 Richard Cheatham will go with a group of other Wayland students to Miami, Fla., where they will compete in debating and persuasive speaking.

KITCHEN KORNER

I have been enjoying the days that I can spend out doors so very much as I am sure most of you do.

As most of you know I have spent most of the last 20 years working indoors so I guess I especially have liked these warm days and have planted a small garden as fresh vegetables are really appealing right now.

Here is a dinner you can cook while you are working in the yard and not have to watch constantly.

PORK CHOPS AND RICE

- 6 pork chops
- 2 T. fat
- 3/4 c. uncooked rice
- 3 cups tomato juice
- 1 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 3 T. green pepper chopped
- 3 T. onion chopped

Remove bone from chops, dredge in seasoned flour and brown in fat. Combine rice, tomato juice, salt, pepper, green pepper and onion. Pour over the pork chops in a buttered baking dish and bake in a moderate oven for 1 1/2 hrs.

Have you tried the quick pudding cakes? They are very moist and good.

QUICK LEMON PUDDING CAKE

- 1 box lemon cake mix
- 1 box instant lemon pudding mix
- 3/4 c. cooking oil
- 3/4 c. water
- 4 eggs

Combine all the ingredients in the order listed. Bake in a tube pan at 350 degrees for 45 to 60 minutes. Remove cake from oven and let remain in pan. Insert ice pick in cake, making several holes.

SAUCE

- 1/2.
- 1/2 c. orange juice
- 2 T. butter
- 2 c. powdered sugar

Combine all of sauce ingredients and pour over cake while it is still hot. Let cake stand in pan until it is cool.
