

As most of you know I have spent most of the last 20 years working indoors so I guess I especially have liked these warm days and have planted a small garden as fresh vege-tables are really appealing right

Here is a dinner you can cook while you are working in the yard and not have to watch constantly.

PORK CHOPS AND RICE

6 pork chops 3/4 c. uncooked rice 3 cups tomato juice 11/2 tsp. salt 1/4 tsp. pepper 3 T. green pepper chopped 3 T. onion chopped

Remove bone from chops, dredge in seasoned flour and brown in fat. Combine rice, tomato juice, salt, pepper, green pepper and onion. Pour over the pork chops in a buttered baking dish and bake in a moderate oven for 1 1/2 hrs.

QUICK LEMON PUDDING CAKE

I box lemon cake mix 1 box instant lemon pudding mix 3/4 c. cooking oil 3/4 c. water

Combine all the ingredients in the order listed. Bake in a tube pan at 350 degrees for 45 to 60 minutes. Remove cake from oven and let remain in pan. Insert ice pick in cake, making several holes. SAUCE

1/2. 1/2 c. orange juice 2 T. butter

2 c. powdered sugar Combine all of sauce ingredients and pour over cake while it is still hot. Let cake stand in pan until it is cool.


