STUFFED CHICKEN BREASTS 4 whole chicken breasts

Salt and Pepper Bread stuffing(recipe below)

1/4 c. flour 1/2 tsp. dried savory leaves 1/2 tsp. salt

Few grains pepper

Mushroom Sauce

Heat oven to 350 degrees F. (moderate) Wash chicken and crack center bones so the two halves will fold together, but do not separate them. Sprinkle inside with salt and pepper. Spoon in Bread Stuffing; fold breasts together. Hold in place with large toothpicks and lace with string. Mix flour, savory, the 1/2 teaspoon salt and pepper; coat chicken breasts with this mixture.
