NEW CATHOLIC CHURCH GOING UP

Hello--Hello--Hello?

Anyone who has ever been troubled by crank or "funny" telephone calls knows how annoying they can be.

It is amazing how many people innocently submit to this.

Unfortunately, neither the police nor the telephone company can do very much about annoying or mysterious calls.

Listening in on a "mysterious" call, you might hear something like this:

"Miss Smith, are either of your parents home?"

"No, they aren't."

"Perhaps, you might help us then. This is the American Institute of Nothing Special and we would like your co-operation in an important survey we are conducting. Would you mind answering a few questions?"

"I'll try."

"Fine. Were you watching television when the phone rang?"

"No, I wasn't."

"Do you have a TV?"

"Yes."

"Radio?"

"Yes."

(The surveyor's voice sounds very professional and sincere. Miss Smith has gained a considerable amount of confidence.)

"How many people are there in your family?"

"Just my father and my mother and myself."

"What is your father's occupation?"

"He is a salesman for the Such-and-such Company."

"Do you have any pets?"

"Only goldfish."

"When you spend an evening at home alone, do you generally watch TV or listen to the radio?"

"Sometimes, but on school nights, I usually have homework."

"How many nights a week would this be?"

"Usually two or three."

"Does your family take an annual vacation?"

"Yes, sometime around the Fourth of July."

"Are your household goods and valuables insured?"

"Yes, certainly."

"Well, Miss Smith, we certainly appreciate the information you have given us. Thank you and good-bye."

This may seem harmless, but think of how many things Miss Smith has revealed to the caller.

First of all, he knows that she spends a considerable amount of time at home without the presence of her parents.

He also knows there is no watchdog, the family has valuables worth insuring in the house and that they vacation in July. The caller has learned the name of Mr. Smith's employer and could easily find out when he might be on business trips, leaving Miss Smith and her mother home alone.

To protect herself from giving out personal information to some crank, Miss Smith should have asked for the company's name and telephone number and

informed the surveyor that she would call back.

Every kind of call, lewd, crank, larcenous or just plain annoying can be coped with.

Here are some guide lines:

Do not use your telephone as if it were forcing you to respond. You would not reveal personal facts to a stranger on the street, so do not tell a stranger on the phone anything about yourself.

When a strange voice asks,

"What number is this?"

or "Who is this?" don't answer that question. Ask the caller

what number he is trying to reach and with whom he wishes to speak. Many people have acquired telephone nuisances by giving their number to a crank caller who has reached them by mistake.

If your telephone rings and the caller remains silent after you have said "hello" twice, hang up. Should a caller make an indecent remark, hang up. Those making such calls tire of their game if no one will listen.

Here is another trick that you might use to get rid of crank callers:

While the caller is on the line, push the button down twice very rapidly. (This will make a clicking sound, but will not disconnect.) Then say in a matter-of-fact voice: "Officer, this is the call I want you to trace." And hang up. The caller will think someone is listening on another line.

Chances are, he won't call again.

Don Follis, son of Mr. and Mrs. Horace Follis, will enter the hospital July 12 for major back surgery.

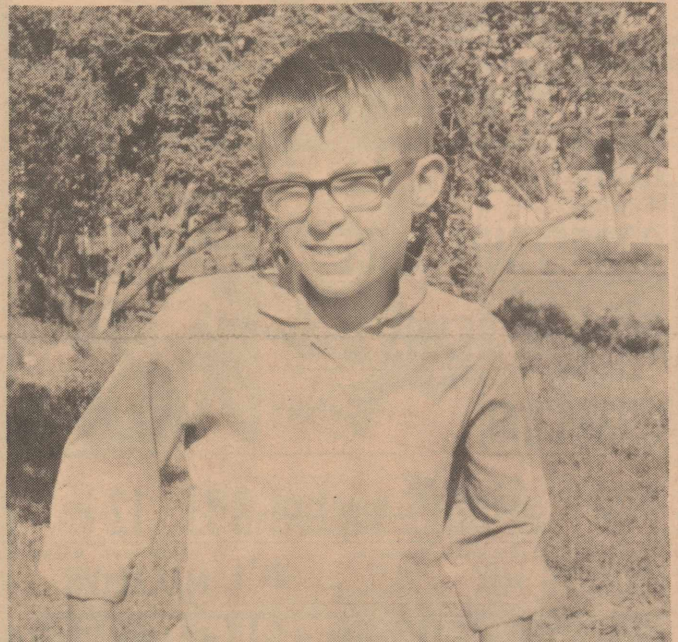
The Follis family has recently been hard hit by illness and medical problems with Don's father now in the hospital and one of his brother's under a doctor's care.

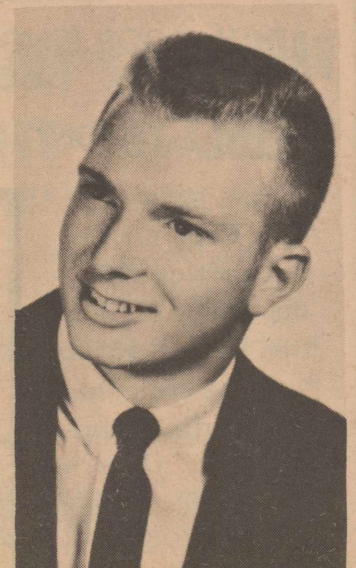
Gossett Serving As Youth Director

Crop Reports Due

ASCS office reports it is prepared to accept acreage reports and applications for final payment under the 1966 cotton, feed grain and wheat programs.

All producers participating in one or more of these programs are required to report (and certify) their crop and diversion acreages by no later than Aug 15.

Producers must file an

acreage certification whether they are subscribing to the measurement service or not.

The sooner the acreage reports are made, the sooner the office can compute (and make) final payments under the programs.

Farmers are asked to make the acreage report as soon as they have completed planting and the crops are up.

Allotment Deadline Near

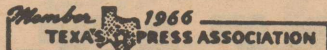

KITCHEN KORNER

We have had some real warm days and the dust makes us realize summer is really here—also vacation time, which I will be on when you read this. See you when I get back.

HAM PATTIES WITH SOUR CREAM

Skillet, 10-inch
6 patties
2 C ground cooked ham
1 T grated onion
1/2 C dry bread crumbs
1 1/2 T chopped parsley
1 t prepared mustard
1/8 t salt
2 eggs, slightly beaten
2 T butter
1/4 C water
1/2 t paprika
1 C dairy sour cream, at room temperature
Parsley to garnish

In a bowl toss together ham, onion, crumbs, parsley, mustard and salt; add eggs and blend well. Shape into 6 patties. In skillet melt butter; brown patties on both sides. Transfer to serving platter; keep warm. Meanwhile, in a saucepan combine water and paprika; heat to boiling. Remove from heat; stir in sour cream. Spoon over ham patties and garnish with parsley.

During warm weather, slice cool crisp cucumbers thinly, leave the skins on for color and nutritive value. Season, top with dairy sour cream and chill before serving.
