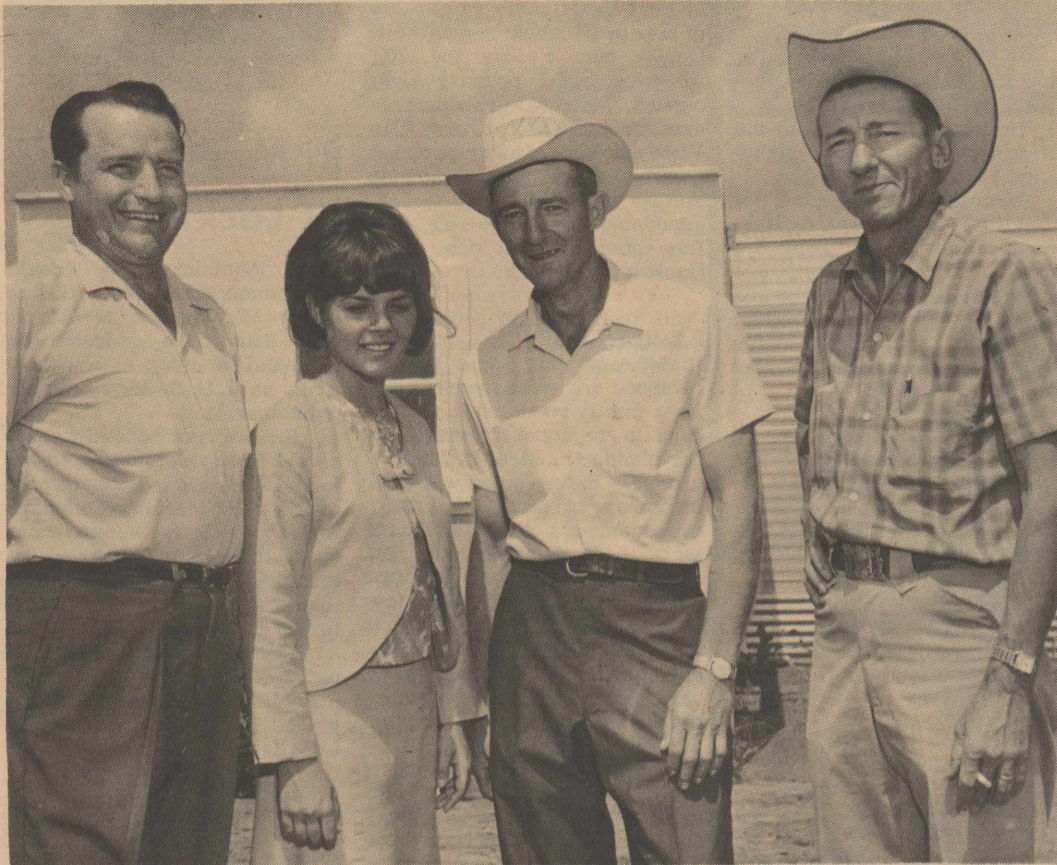

X-Ray Unit

Mobile chest x-ray detection unit of the West Texas Tuberculosis Association will be in Hart Tuesday, Sept. 13, under the sponsorship of the Hart Independent School District.

The chest x-ray detects many of the abnormalities of the chest besides tuberculosis, such as cardiovascular, and other respiratory diseases.

It is hoped that a large number of citizens will take the chest x-ray.

Work was done by Mr. and Mrs. M. F. McRee, who also donated the supplies.

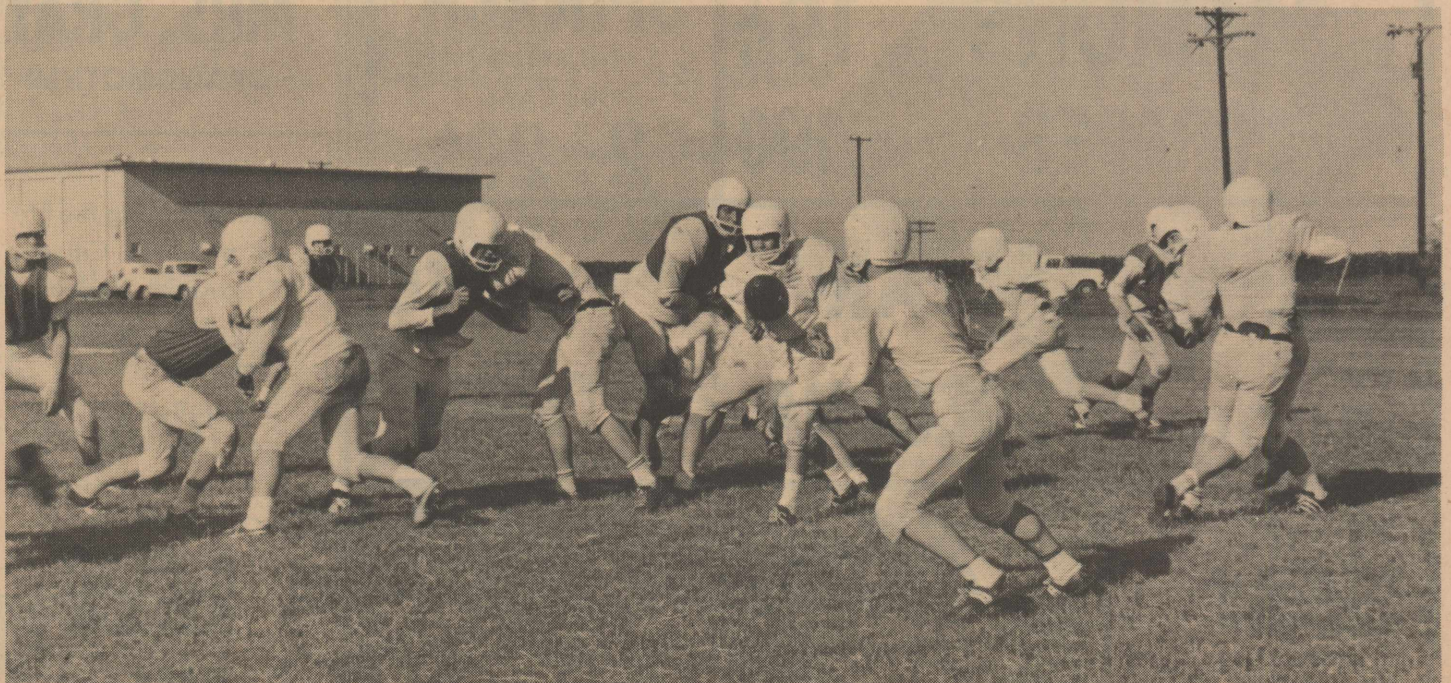
Booster Club Has Supper

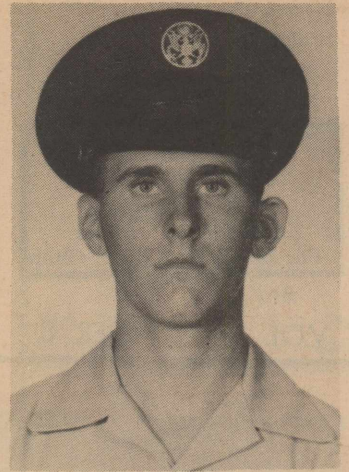

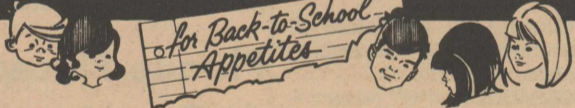

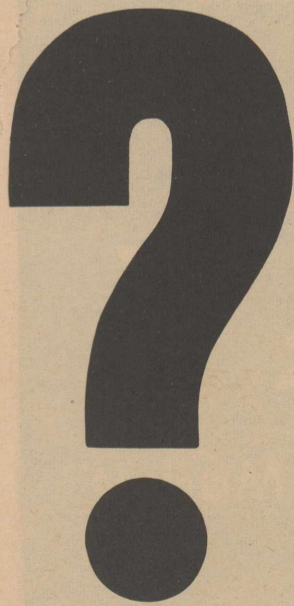

Jewel Phillips, brother of Monroe Phillips, was killed in a one car accident, Friday, Aug. 26 at 10 a. m., near Moab, Utah. Funeral services were held Wednesday, Aug. 31 in Hermiston, Oregon, where the family resides.

The Jewel Phillips family were returning from a family re-union at Stegall, where all 12 brothers and sisters and families were present, making a total of approximately 81 at the re-union.

Phillip's daughter, Alta, who was driving and his wife were in the front seat of the car and he was lying down in the back

seat asleep. When the car went out of control on a rain-slick road, he was thrown from the car, killing him instantly.
