RESOLUTION AND ORDER FOR CITY BOND ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS CITY OF HART COUNTY OF CASTRO

ON THIS, the 2 day of May, 1967, the City Commission of the City of Hart, Texas, convened in special session at the regular meeting place thereof in the City Hall, there being present and in attendance the following members, to-wit:

E. E. FOSTER MAYOR
JOHN HOLLOWAY COMMISSIONER M. L. AVEN COMMISSIONER

and with the following absent: none, constituting a quorum; and among other proceedings had were the following:

The Mayor introduced a resolution and order. Commissioner Holloway moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Aven. The motion, carrying with it the adoption of the resultion and order, prevailed by the following

AYES: Mayor Foster and Commissioners Holloway and Aven. NOES: None.

The RESOLUTION AND ORDER is as follows:

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Hart, Texas, deems it advisable to issue the bonds of said City for the purposes hereinafter mentioned; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE CITY COM-

MISSION OF THE CITY OF HART, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That an election be held on the 20 day of May, 1967, which date is not less than fifteen (15) nor more than thirty (30) days from the date of the adoption of this resolution and order, at which election the following propositions shall be submitted to the resident qualified electors of said property therein, and who have duly own taxable rendered the same for taxation:

PROPOSITION NUMBER 1 "SHALL the City Commission of the City of Hart, Texas, be authorized to issue TWELVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$12,000) general obligation bonds of said City, for the purpose of constructing street improvements in and for said City; said bonds to mature serially over a period of years not to exceed FORTY(40) years from their date, and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed SIX PER CENTUM (6%) per annum, payable annually or semi-annually; and to provide for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?

PROPOSITION NUMBER 2 "SHALL the City Commission of the City of Hart, Texas, be authorized to issue FOUR THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$4,500) general obligation bonds of said City, for the purpose of constructing improvements and extensions to the City's Sanitary Sewer System; said bonds to mature serially over a period of years not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date, and to bear interest at a rate not

to exceed SIX PER CENTUM (6%) per annum, payable annually or semi-annually; and to provide for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?"

SECTION 2: That said election shall be held at the CITY HALL in the CITY OF HART, TEXAS, and the entire City shall constitute one election precinct.

SECTION 3: That the following named persons are hereby appointed officers of the election, to-wit:

O. D. Dinwiddie, Presiding Judge Joe Newman, Alternate Presiding Judge

If the regularly appointed Presiding Judge is unable to serve at the election, the Alternate Presiding Jusge therefor shall serve as Presiding Judge. The Presiding Judge shall appoint at least two (2) Clerks (one of whom shall be the Alternate Presiding Judge if the election is conducted by the regularly appointed Presiding Judge) and not more than one(1) additional Clerk, as he deems necessary for the proper conduct

ABSENTEE VOTING shall be conducted at the City Clerk's Office in the City Hall, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 424, Acts of the 58th Legislature, Regular Session,

SECTION 4: That said election shall be held under the provisions of and in accordance with the laws governing the issuance of municipal bonds in cities, as provided in the General Laws of the State of Texas, and only resident qualified electors, who own taxable property in the City, and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be qualified to vote.

SECTION 5: That the ballots for said election shall be prepared in sufficient number and in conformity with Chapter 6, V. A. T. C. S., Election Code, and that printed on such ballots shall appear the following:

PROPOSITION NUMBER 1

"The new Freedom Shares which go on sale May 1, 1967, will be issued to individuals only, with the simultaneous purchase of Series E Bonds on the PayrollSavings plan or Bond-A-Month plan at your bank. Payment of income tax on the interest may be deferred to redemption or maturity, and the interest is not subject to state or local income taxes," Chairman Wilson Chairman pointed out.
