Two Car Accident Injures Family Tuesday Night

Henry Duane Janssen and his daughter, Sherry, 13, of Hereford were in satisfactory condition in Plainview Hospital Wednesday from injuries received in a two-vehicle accident five miles east of Hart on Highway 194 late Tuesday night.

Janssen, who is reported to have several broken ribs, was taken to the Plainview Hospital by John Rice Ambulance of Hart. Sherry suffered deep lacerations on her back.

Other occupants of the Janssen car were his wife, Margaret, and children, Susan, 12;

Laura, 9; Jeff, 6; and Jerry Lee, 4. All received bruises and minor lacerations, with Jerry Lee being the less seriously injured of the group.

Tex Scates of Dimmitt, Texas Highway Patrolman, who investigated the accident said that Janssen, driving a 1965 Ford, was attempting to overtake and pass a grain sorghum truck, a 1954 Chevrolet truck, driven by Manuel Villarreal of Plainview, when Villarreal started to make a left-hand turn. Janssen cut back to try to avoid hitting the truck and in doing so

went under the tail end of the truck. Both vehicles were traveling east.

Dub King, operator and owner of King's Blacksmith in Hart, brought in the first 1967 cotton to Hart of the Plains Gin Wednesday.

The 490-pound bale was made from 1990 pounds of pulled Paymaster III cotton. King received a premium of 50 cents a pound and free ginning.

Dry land cotton, it was produced on part of 28 acres that King farms seven miles south of Hart on the C. W. Wright farm. This is King's first year to farm there.

Hart Shorthorns Victors Over Lazbuddie Longhorns

The Hart Shorthorns wrapped up their third straight district title last Thursday as they dumped the Lazbuddie Longhorns 18 to 0. The victory was the 11th consecutive victory for the Shorthorns and their sixth victory of this season.

Quarterback Steve Cox, unsung hero of the team, drew praise from Coach Shaw for his ball handling, play calling and team leadership. Coach Shaw also pointed out the tremendous job done by his entire offensive unit this season, and the fine running of back Jimmy Robinson, Ruben Aguanio, and Robert Garcia, combined with the extra fine job done by the offensive line to give the Shorthorns a real punch on offense.

For the season the Shorthorns have been very tough on defense also, as they have shut out a couple of their foes and manhandled the others with ease. Stan Dyer, Bill Bates, Jimmy Robinson, and Ike Graves have all given season long performances that rank them among the best in the Shorthorns history.

In the game with Lazbuddie Jimmy Robinson got things off to a good start in the first quarter as he scampered fifteen yards for the first TD. Ruben Aguanio tried to pick up the two extras but he was stopped short.

Ruben got his revenge early

in the second period, however, as he sped 20 yards to make the score 12 to 0. Again the Lazbuddie defense stopped the extras as they nailed Jimmy Robinson before he crossed the line to leave the score the same.

Just to add a little insurance, the Shorthorns struck again in the third quarter. Ruben Aguanio again went in for the score, this time from 35 yards out. The TD had been set up by a 25-yard run on a reverse by Robert Garcia. A pass from Steve Cox to Jesse Garcia for the extras was incomplete and the score was at its final figure, 18 to 0.

The Shorthorn defense was led by Stan Dyer, Jimmy Robinson, Ricky Black, David Harris, Bill Bates, Ike Graves, Oscar Longoria, and Robert Garcia. The next Shorthorn game is a non-conference battle with Happy next Thursday.

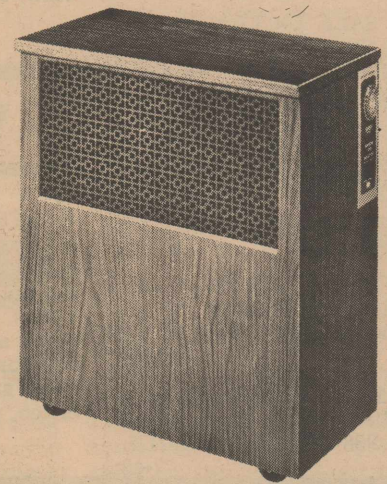



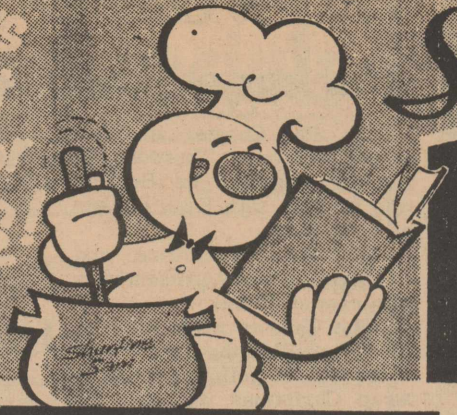
