Parliamentary "Whipa." The parliamentary origin of the term "Whip" goes back to 1768. that year, according to Sir Courtenay libert (clerk of the British house of commons from 1902 to 1921), there was a great debate in the house on petition against the return of Colorel Luttrell for Westminster in place of John Wilkes, who had been expelled from the house by its order. The government made strenuous of forts to bring together all their followers for the division, and Edmund Burke, referring scornfully to the manner in which men had been summoned postbaste even from the con tineot, likened the activity of the ministers to the whipping-in of a pack of hounds. The phrase caught on. The treasury officials became "whippers-in," and, by rapid process of abbreviation, whips.
