Over 180,000 Miles of Improved Highway is Government Program

Washington,-The United States road building program calls for 180,-000 miles of improved Federal highway, and will cover from fifteen to twenty years' time, according to arnouncement of the United States Department of Agriculture. The mi will be supplemented by an equal if not greater amount of State and local roads. When the job is done the transportation facilities of the country will far exceed those of any other Nation, past or present, and the highways of the ancient Romans, "whose fame has come down through the centuries," will pale by comparison.

Details of the program are to be presented before the Highway Edueation Board at its conference here beginning Oct. 26, one feature of which is to enable the board to pro ceed with its work of devising aid schools and colleges to which road builders of the country are turning for competent highway engineers. Officials of the bureau es imate the aggregate cost of the Federal aid program alone at about \$3,000,000,000, spread over twenty Approximatel one-third of proposed system about 60.




