The hot air about the Orient in big heads which comes from our Sweetwater-exchanges will now more than likely cease since that road has suspended construction.—Merkel Mail

No siren Bob, the big head lines about the Orient will not cease. The Orient road is a certainty. We are building road north of Sweetwater every day, new material is being unloaded for the construction work and when the engine arrives here to resume train work the construction will be pushed to a better advantage. "The Sweetwater exchanges" are not using "hot" head lines. They will all come to pass, and the Merkel Brethren need not be shooting off their various editorials in regard to a road that is a dead state thing.—Sweetwater Review

Mr. Webster, Chief Engineer of the Orient Railway, was in Crowell last Friday evening. He went to Benjamin Saturday morning and returned to Crowell in the evening.

In an interview with him as to the progress that was being made on the Orient, Mr. Webster stated that he had about 64 hands, including the bridge crew now on the work; that the material that was at Sweetwater and that now on the road will lay up the track to McCaulley, in the north side of Fisher county. He stated that he had promised the people of Sylvester that they would complete the road to that town by April the 10th; that he had bridge material enough to take them 50 miles and that the bridge gang was 5 or 6 miles ahead of the track. He said that the report that had found its way into the newspapers that the crew had gone back north and had suspended work at Sweetwater, grew out of the fact that the construction engine broke down and it would require two or three weeks to put it in repair, and in consequence of the circumstances he sent part of the force back north, but that sufficient force had been retained to handle the material and lay down the rails as fast as they could be brought in. He thinks that the construction engine is now ready and that he will run it in from the shops at Fort Worth and go to work in earnest. He states that they have been doing a little work all the time such as could be done by hand. He also stated to Mr. Beverly that he had ordered another construction train and that the track would be laid as fast as the material could be shipped in to Sweetwater. Mr. Webster was very pleasant and spoke in complimentary terms of the people of Crowell, and thinks the town and country around it have a very bright future.

Things seem to be in a bad way in Russia. The autocrats contend for the unlimited authority of the Czar, while the masses are favoring a constitution limiting the monarchy. And, while the educated and intelligent class is generally deploring the revolutionary spirit of the peasantry, and of the laboring-classes in Poland, they are powerless to arrest the tide of discontent that seems to be sweeping over, not only Poland, but over the entire Russian empire. A very alarming feature of the discontent is that it is rapidly gaining foothold among the young men and especially so in the colleges and universities, which has led in many instances to the closing of these institutions. In fact there is an internal commotion, a pent up smothered discontent, which must eventually result in an upheaval of these pent up forces, unless some concession is made to the demands for a more liberal government. This discontent at the homes of the Russian soldiery has its influence on the army and will, no doubt, be considered by the peace party in urging the government to consider terms of peace, and accept the same if an honorable peace is offered.
