Lanham sent in a mes sage last Tuesday urging the Legislature to take up the measure to provide revenue for the support of state government before adjournment, but the boys sat down on him by a vote of 56 to 38, a two-third vote being necessary to suspend the regular order of business and take up the measure

The Legislature will adjourn next Saturday. The Governor will be forced to call an extra eession as no provision has been made for the state government for the next two years. The Appropriation Bill will be the chief measure in the Governors call. Just what other subjects will be included in the call for special legislation is not defin-

There seems to be a little tilt going on at this time between Governor Lanham and the mem bers of the Legislature. The latter wanting a few days intermission so they can visit home folks, and the Gevernor want-ing to hold them down to busi-ness by calling the special session within one day after adjournment to the visit of the special adjournment so they cannot get mileage again. We see where the Governor is right as the mileage of an extra session if not called in one day, would cost the State many thousands of dollars.
