**Free Speech Issue
 In Court Proceeding**

LINCOLN, Ill.—Free speech was the issue here in a contempt of court case in which nearly 600 persons faced possible fines and jail sentences.

The defendants, many of them members of a reform group known as the "Good Government Council of Logan County," were cited for contempt for petitioning Circuit Judge Frank M. Bevan to replace a state's attorney in a case involving the prosecutor's friend.

Judge Bevan said the petition contained "odious, defamatory language concerning an official of this court." State's Attorney Edwin C. Mills.

Members of the Good Government Council contended Judge Bevan could not hold them in contempt and said if the prosecutor felt he was defamed by the petition he could sue them in a civil court.

The case arose when, as a result of action taken by the Good Government Council, Justice of the Peace Vincent Jones was charged with illegal diversion of funds collected in overweight trucking fines. Mr. Jones was charged with perjury, embezzlement and malfeasance.

The council followed up the case with a petition asking that Mr. Jones be replaced by a special or assistant prosecutor.

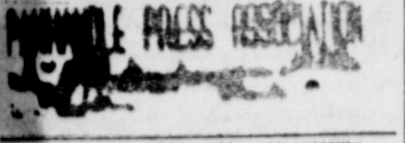

1,800 demonstrations conducted in 56 Texas counties last year under the direction of county agents showed that odorized methyl bromide was 96 percent effective for controlling the troublesome leaf cutting ants.

Extension Entomologist F. M. Fuller says the leaf cutting ant poses a threat to the record plantings of pine seedlings in east Texas.

Milk production in 1958 is likely to show its sixth consecutive annual increase. There is a good possibility that average prices will not be as high as in 1957.

While all moldy feed may not be harmful to livestock, it is wise to test questionable grain by feeding it to one or two animals of low value for about two weeks. Some reports have been received of livestock deaths from eating moldy grain.

Texas cotton producers literally took it on the chin from a lot of sources in producing their 1957 crop. Floods, hail storms, insects and terrible weather during the normal harvest season all took their toll. Cotton diseases also hit hard and cut production in the state by an estimated 10 percent.

The first countywide fire ant eradication program is underway in Hardin county. Five other southeast Texas counties are known to be infested with the pest.

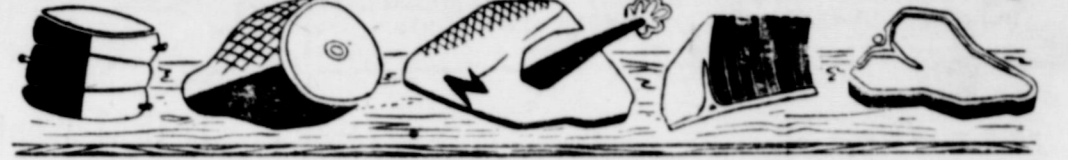
