TEXAS HAS SEEN TWO CLOSER RACES THAN PRESENT ONE

The closeness of the contest between Mrs. Miriam A. Ferguson and Governor Ross S. Sterling for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination this year is not without historical precedent. In 1881 Frank R. Lubbock and Edward Clark, both of whom had served as Lieutenant Governor and Clark as Governor for a few months after Sam Houston, elected in 1859, had been deposed, contended for the governorship. Lubbock received 21,854 votes and Clark 21,730. By the narrow margin of 120 votes, Lubbock became Governor. This is the narrowest race for Governor in the records of Texas. The second closest gubernatorial contest came in 1869, only eight years later. It was during the reconstruction days that followed the Civil War. The two candidates then were Edmond J. Davis and Andrew J. Hamilton. The Democratic party in that year was defunct. Davis was the "bold and unscrupulous leader of the Radical Republicans and Hamilton was "the able, eloquent and patriotic champion of the Conservatives."

Texas was under the dictatorship of a military satrap, General Joseph Jones Reynolds, who ruled it with an iron hand. The legal machinery was in the hands of the Davis faction, with armed soldiers overlorded the polls. All election returns were made to General Reynolds.

According to the announcement made by him, Davis received 39,901 votes and Hamilton 39,092. Davis was declared elected by 809 votes. In 1876 a committee, during the convention that framed our present Constitution, reported that the returns of this election had been returned from the State when General Reynolds left."

BUSINESS IN TEXAS STILL SHOWN ON INCLINE

AUSTIN, Sept. 28.—Production at Texas cement mills, which normally changes very little between July and August, rose this year from 276,000 barrels in July to 325,000 barrels in August, a gain of practically 18 per cent, according to the Bureau of Business Research at the University of Texas. Last year in August, 644,000 barrels of cement were produced at Texas mills. Shipment increased by 26 per cent over July and totaled 386,000 barrels, the highest for any one month since last October, and made a gain of 62,000 barrels on existing stocks at mills. At 630,000 barrels stocks at Texas mills were 10 per cent less than those at the close of July and equalled those at the close of August a year ago.

FOURTEEN-CENT COTTON PREDICTED BEFORE NOV.

Word has been spread around on the inside that a drive to push up wheat and cotton prices will start in two weeks. The minimum goal is 14-cent cotton and 65-cent wheat by election day. The first objective seems a logical possibility. The second will be more difficult. European and South American wheat is threatening to grab the act.—Whirligig, in the Abilene News.
