## 6 In. Snow Covers Area

### Farm Prospects Bettered

One of the biggest snows within a period of 20 years brought smiles to all folks of this area. An estimate of the fall was generally given at 6 inches with 2-1/2 inches of moisture. Much snow Saturday melted as it fell while the snow of Thursday was very dry. This winter moisture coming in the form of snow is as effective as half an inch of rain when the weather and soil is warm and the air is dry.

Snow is a very good soil conditioner, bringing oxygen and nitrogen into the soil for action by nitrogen-fixing bacteria. A winter of snow usually means a crop especially when the mountains to the west are heavy with snow.

The snow was the first effective moisture since last October.

### O'Donnell Nips Slaton

The O'Donnell Indep. Basketball team won a return game at Slaton Thursday night to make it two games in a row over Slaton. O'Donnell scored 47 to 36. Benny Clark was high man with 15 followed by Darrell Brownlow with 10. It was one of the best games for the locals of season.

### Mahon Helps Farmers

Last week in Washington a bill providing for the repeal of the federal tax on gasoline and other fuels used in farming was passed by the House of Representatives. Early passage by the Senate is anticipated.

Representative George Mahon of the 19th District voted for the measure, stating that passage of his legislation was long overdue, but that he realized this was only a minor step toward achieving an adequate 1956 farm program.

Mahon said he had received many letters and petitions from West Texans urging passage of the bill. Other fuels involved include propane and butane.

### Spencer Is New Jr. Hi Head

Supt. Weldon Skinner said Monday that the school board had given a contract to Bruce Spencer of Alpine to be principal of the Junior High School effective immediately.

Mr. Spencer is married, has a daughter, age 3, and he is 42. He holds a masters degree and for the past 4 years has been principal at Sanderson. He is a veteran of World War II serving in the Navy. Mr. Skinner said he is well pleased by securing the services of Mr. Spencer.

### S. S. Man Here Feb. 15th

Our representative will be in O'Donnell at the Post Office at 4 p. m. on Feb. 15th and will be glad to assist in all matters pertaining to social security.

Self-employed farmers will, for the first time, in 1956, pay social security tax on their farm income for 1955 according to Mr. John G. Hutton, manager of the Social Security Office in Lubbock, Texas. If you are a self-employed farmer and have earnings of \$400 or more a year, you must file a report of your self-employment farm income at the same time you file your income tax return.

The social security tax is 3 percent of the self-employed farmer's earnings, up to a total of \$4200 in earnings. If you work, or have other types of self-employment income, earnings from these sources may be combined with your farm earnings up to a combined total of \$4200 according to Mr. Hutton.

### Collections Are Good

Tom Vandell, school tax collector reported a 92 percent collection of 1955 school taxes or a total of \$91,353.75 being collected. Counting the delinquent taxes paid in the total runs to \$94,071.76.

So something should be done in the way of educating the adult of the population, so they will voluntarily carry out those measures which prolong life and maintain good health.

### McKibben Brothers In Car Mishap Near Lamesa

A Lamesa man was killed and three men were injured, including two Tahoka men, in a head-on wreck on FM 179 five miles north of Lamesa at about 8:30 o'clock Tuesday night.

Lee Alexander Davis, 19, of Lamesa, passenger in a 1955 Pontiac, was killed instantly, and Johnny Young, 20, also of Lamesa, driver of the car, was seriously injured.

Pat H. McKibben, Jr., 33, of Tahoka, was critically injured and his brother, Warren McKibben, 26, of T-Bar, was less seriously injured. They were in a 1949 Chevrolet pick-up loaded with mattresses they were bringing to Pat's mattress shop.

Pat had multiple lacerations, broken arm, a possible crushed chest and internal injuries. Warren, who worked for his brother, was less seriously injured.

Officers said the McKibben pick-up had evidently pulled off the pavement on its right. The Pontiac, possibly traveling at a high rate of speed, ran off the pavement and crashed into the pick-up head-on.

### Work On U.S. 87 To Start This Spring Or Summer

A. B. Furlow, Commissioner of Pct. 2 of Dawson County, said Saturday that the Commissioner's Court of Dawson County had about completed securing the needed right-of-way for the new 4-lane 87 highway in Dawson. Only a few minor adjustments are pending not including one case within Lamesa. Fences and phone poles are to be moved as well as one small house and a windmill in the O'Donnell vicinity.

Work is expected to begin sometime this spring.

The road will be a beautiful thing with only three gradual curves between here and Lamesa due to the fact that Lamesa lies well to the southwest of here. Between the two-lanes of traffic will lie 30 feet of space.

Mr. Furlow said he was very anxious to see the Farm to Market road running south from O'Donnell to bisect the Rock Crusher Road (F. M. 1219) paved this year. He said the contract may be let this year. This would give a paved route to the potentially big Harmony Field.
