### Relax Requirements For Air Force

To meet its present need for 5,000 Aviation Cadets per month, the United States Air Force has relaxed the age and education requirements. This means that Aviation Cadet training is now open to many individuals formerly denied the opportunity to fly. This is an excellent change for young men to win their silver wings as an Air Force pilot.

### Auto Wreckers Given Added Incentive

Auto wreckers have been given an added incentive to help raise the iron and steel scrap inventories of the nation's steel mills and foundries to a safe level.

A. C. Jackson, District Manager, National Production Authority in Lubbock announced an amendment NPA Order M-92 (Auto Wreckers) which removes purchase restrictions in the following quarter by auto wreckers who, in any given quarter, wreck out all 1939 or older cars they had at the beginning of the period.

Other major changes in Order M-92 include changing the definition of "motor vehicles" to exclude certain buses whose parts scrap for a car unit; and provides that no wrecker may acquire a greater number of vehicles during any quarter than he has junked in the preceding quarter, unless he has wrecked out a number of cars equal to the total number of pre-1940 vehicles which were in his inventory at the beginning of the previous quarter. Mr. Jackson explained that the original order exempted only those cars built from 1946 on, but vehicles from 1940 upward are great demand and is not in the public interest to scrap them.

**Bakery Products O. P. S. Prices Set On**

The Office of Price Stabilization today issued a regulation establishing new ceiling prices for perishable bakery products—breads, cakes, pies, pastries—for which consumers nationally spend nearly five billion dollars a year.

District OPS officials said the new regulation, Ceiling Price Regulation 135, specifies a fixed percentage by which the new ceilings may exceed prices charged during the base year of 1949 for these products. The permissible percentage by which bread and sweet goods products may exceed 1949 prices is 16 per cent. The new regulation becomes effective May 10, 1952.

The effect upon the public will depend upon the amounts by which bakers in the various districts have raised their prices between 1949 and the general price freeze of January 25, 1951.

Among other things this fixed percentage reflects the rate of increase in the industry from 1949 to July, 1951; increases in certain other costs other than ingredient costs from July, 1951, to the present, and certain cost increases that are scheduled to take place in the immediate future.

Bakers whose present ceilings are above the permissible percentage will have to adjust their ceilings downward to bring them in line with the new level. Bakers whose current ceilings are below the permitted level may raise theirs to this level.

The regulation applies to all types of bakery products and frozen bread and sweet goods products—wholesale, retail, home-to-home and chain store bakers.

Other sellers who buy from bakers are not covered by the regulation. Grocers, for instance, will continue to price cookies under the dry grocery regulations and bread and other perishable bakery products under the General Ceiling Price Regulation.

Because many small bakers lack the records necessary to compute prices under the regulation, they have the option, if their annual volume of business is less than \$100,000, to continue under the General Ceiling Price Regulation or the emergency regulation issued last Nov. 26. Supplemental Regulation 80 to the GCPR.

**CHICKEN POX IS COMMON CHILD DISEASE**

Chickenpox cases are most numerous in winter and spring says Dr. Geo W. Cox, State Health Officer. Ordinarily, people do not consider it a serious disease. But probably the most serious factor is that light cases of smallpox and the symptoms of chickenpox are similar. Only a physician can tell the difference. At the first sign of skin eruptions, you should put the patient in bed and call the family Dr.

As in any other illness, chickenpox lowers body resistance to other disease germs. Thus, complications such as pneumonia, inflammation of the kidneys, erysipelas, and gangrene of the skin may occur, resulting in a serious illness.

Chickenpox is highly contagious. It usually develops two to three weeks after exposure. After one attack, the patient is immune to the disease. Although chickenpox occurs most frequently among children less than fifteen years of age, adults, too, can get the disease if they did not have it when they were children.

The chickenpox germ gains entrance to the body through the mouth and nose. Skin eruptions of a sick person contain the germ. The disease spreads rapidly through families and schools, as an infected person can spread his germs widely by careless coughing, using a common drinking cup, towel or washcloth. For his own welfare and to protect others the patient should stay in bed and apart from susceptible members of the household until all danger of spreading the disease is passed.

**New Cottonseed Oil Extracting Method Told**

A new process for solvent-extracting oil from cottonseed and other oilseeds has been developed, the U. S. Department of Agriculture reports.

The process, which is especially adapted to use by small mills, is called "filtration-extraction", because it involves the use of a continuous vacuum filter as the major operating unit. It worked successfully with cottonseed, and with certain modifications also proved to be suitable for the oil processing of rice bran and soybeans, on a pilot-plant scale. Experiments with other oilseeds are under way.

USDA reports the investment required for applying the process for equipment and the cost of operation are relatively low.

**Krilium Will Not Replace Fertilizer**

**Chemical Increases Soil Needs for Plant Foods**

Krilium, the newly discovered chemical powder that can rebuild soil structure on rundown crop land within a few hours, will not take the place of fertilizers.

Midwestern agronomists who have tested this new soil conditioner, say that its use on farm land would actually increase the soil's need for plant food.

Prof. Emil Truog, of the University of Wisconsin's soils department, points out that Krilium does not add any nitrogen, phosphate or potash to the soil. But by improving tilth, increasing the soil's water-holding capacity and helping the soil "breathe" in more air, it promotes bigger crop yields per acre. More bushels mean a heavier drain on the plant nutrient supply.

Mixed with the soil, the new water-soluble chemical loosens tightly packed clay and clay loams and makes them fluffy and porous. It does this by "gluing" tiny soil particles together into crumb-like granules, ranging in size from a pin-

head to a pea. More water can enter and be held for crops; more air gets in.

Prof. Truog points out that present manufacturing costs make the new product too expensive for farmers who work big acreages. He estimates that reconditioning an acre of soil would take 200 pounds of Krilium. At \$2 per pound, that would cost \$400.

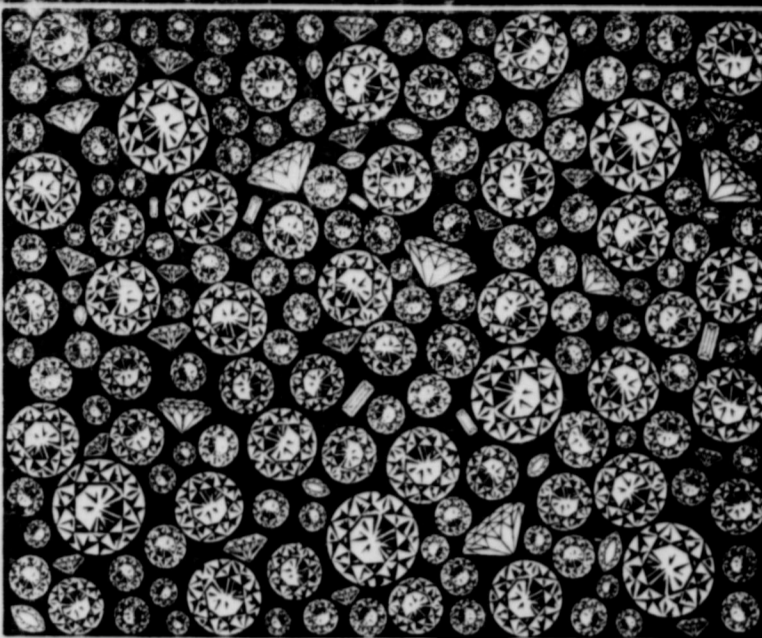

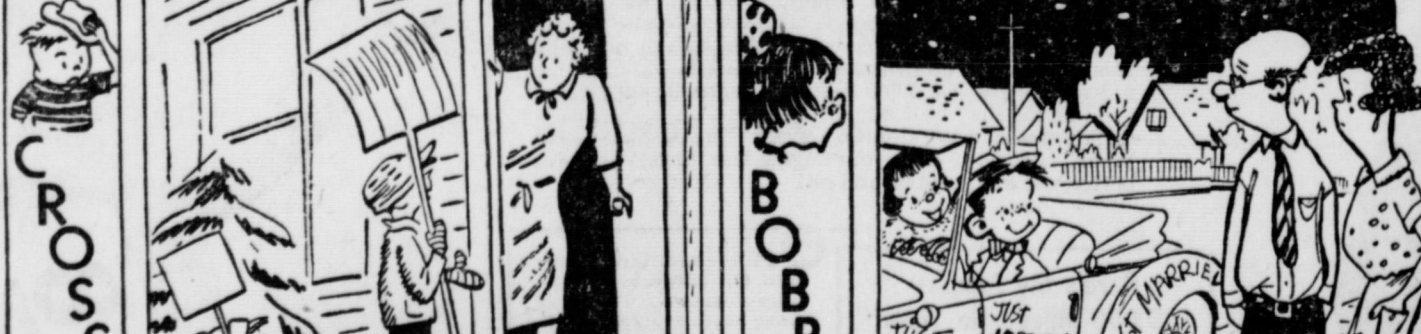

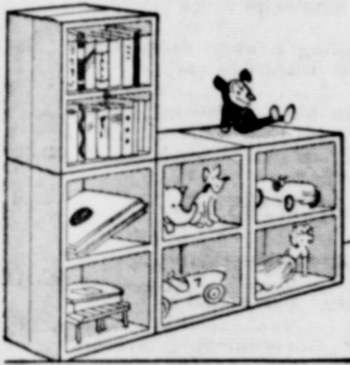

so that you do not step into any redecorating which needs to be changed later.

One, two or three shelves may be used together, depending upon the need as well as the decorative effect desired. A group of three shelves can be made from plywood, and scalloped edging from the plywood for the shelves may add interest.

Triangular shelves are excellent, too, especially in corners. These are made of varying sizes with the smallest at the top and may hold a doll, plant, miniature dish or other collection.

This came like a thunderbolt out of a clear sky, but, as I was to discover later, I am not the only woman whose young life was blasted that way."

### Trapped

"The arrangement was that my husband should give me full custody of Jimmy, pay me \$100 a month, and \$40 a month for Jimmy's support until he is 18. As Lew is a junior partner in his father's very prosperous law firm, and makes close to seven thousand a year, this should not be too much. But he has remarried and had two little girls and an extravagant wife, and he also supports her mother and brother, according to report, so he represents himself as very much strapped."

"He pays, yes. But he never pays on time. I have to telephone every month, and sometimes have to ask my lawyer to jog his memory. Sometimes he writes me a little note insulting his check, saying something insulting like how long am I going to keep this up, haven't I found someone who wants to marry me?"

"I can't tell you how humiliating and even maddening this is to me. I live with my mother whose only contribution to expenses is that she owns the house and pays a low tax yearly."

### A Racket

"My lawyer tells Lew that he must be more prompt, and Lew says that alimony is a racket and that no self-respecting woman would go on taking it year after year. This is very different from the way he talked when he wanted to be free. I have never seen him since he sailed away; we had known each other then only seven weeks. Mother and I live out of town, keep much to ourselves, and devote ourselves to my boy, determined that his life

shall not be saddened by his father's faults.

"Woman after woman tells me a similar story of desertion, cruelty, and utter indifference to obligations and to children. God knows we don't want divorces! We don't want to be lonely and unloved. But what little dignity we could save from the wreckage of our hopes is torn away by the insolent coldness of the men who swore to love us always. Have you anything to suggest that will help me to convince my husband that he owes us something better than this?"

Laurette, you are right in your statement that this case is not unusual, and my abhorrence of divorce—any divorce—is well known to anyone who reads this column. But at the same time, alimony in itself is an indefensible thing, and a smart woman ought to get away from it as fast as she can. Help with the small boy's expenses is another question, and Lew is bound on all accounts to pay that. Legally he can be held to it.

But look at your case as a healthy young human being, not as a deserted wife. You and Lew made a hasty, ill-considered marriage. In those war years a million girls and boys did the same, and some turned out well and many didn't.

Now you say to Lew, "For those weeks of wartime excitement and mistaken passion, you must support me as long as I live. No matter what your difficulties I will never have to help you. Though I married a capitalist tomorrow, you would have no claim on one penny of mine. I will hold my son. I will keep him conscious of his father's faults. But I will make no efforts to support him, because he and I are assured now of support as long as you live." This does not seem fair from the man's viewpoint. It is understandable so.

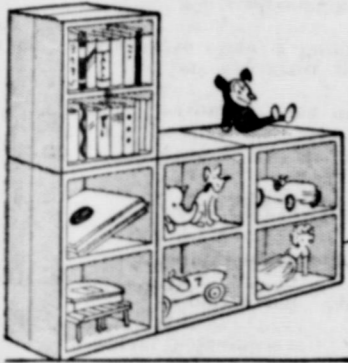
WHEN you wake in the morning to a day full of the same routine as the day before and the day before that, does the prospect seem dreary? Not, so, say decorators, if you wake in a bedroom that's cheerful and pleasing!

so that you do not step into any re-decorating which needs to be changed later.

Is the furniture somewhat battered? This can be refinished at home with little cost, though of course, it involves labor. However, the satisfaction is excellent payment and money saved buying new pieces is even more satisfying.

If the furniture is out of proportion or has poor design, this can sometimes be altered by removing some of the decor, shortening legs of old dressers or tables, reshaping the headboard on the bed and doing the same with chairs.

Storage is another big problem that can be remedied. If the man of the house has carpenter's ability or is even interested in it, built-in dressers and chests can be made for the room.

In addition to this, you'll be amazed at what sturdy wooden boxes of the same size can be fitted and placed together to give cabinets. Use these for a hobby collection such as dishes, knick-knacks, records or even bookcases.

### Proper Storage - Not Clutter

Children's rooms frequently need

additional storage space, even though at one time you may have thought them adequate. The sturdy boxes just mentioned would be excellent here, too.

Books are always being added to their possessions, and so are records, in many cases, not to mention the "collections" such as insects, nests, boats, airplanes, dolls and games of all sorts. Unless there's space for housing these, the room is never really neat and certainly as such is not conducive to teaching habits of neatness.

Boxes converted to cabinets are usually made of soft wood, so they should be treated with shellac and sandpaper first. They may be stained and varnished accordingly if you want light or dark woods. If preferred, they may be painted with a bright enamel that goes with the room colors.

Shelves are another item which not only relieve clutter, but also add to the decorative interest of the room. If reading while relaxing is a primary interest of the occupant, consider placing shelves directly above the bed to hold current reading material.

One, two or three shelves may be used together, depending upon the need as well as the decorative effect desired. A group of three shelves can be made from plywood, and scalloped edging from the plywood for the shelves may add interest.

Triangular shelves are excellent, too, especially in corners. These are made of varying sizes with the smallest at the top and may hold a doll, plant, miniature dish or other collection.

## Alimony Destroys Self-Respect

"YOU DON'T WRITE much about alimony," writes Mrs. Laurette Adams, of Fargo, "and yet, with more than two million women entitled to it, it seems to me a problem of today that is worthy of occasional discussion.

"I am 33," her letter continues, "deserted in 1944, when my husband returned from Guadalcanal. Ours had been a hasty courtship and marriage; my boy's father never has seen him. Jimmy was born six months before I received a letter saying that Lewis, my husband, wanted a divorce, was disgusted at the idea of returning to me, and was planning a second marriage. This came like a thunderbolt out of a clear sky, but, as I was to discover later, I am not the only woman whose young life was blasted that way.

### Trapped

"The arrangement was that my husband should give me full custody of Jimmy, pay me \$100 a month, and \$40 a month for Jimmy's support until he is 18. As Lew is a junior partner in his father's very prosperous law firm, and makes close to seven thousand a year, this should not be too much. But he has remarried and had two little girls and an extravagant wife, and he also supports her mother and brother, according to report, so he represents himself as very much strapped.

"He pays, yes. But he never pays on time. I have to telephone every month, and sometimes have to ask my lawyer to jog his memory. Sometimes he writes me a little note with his check, saying something insulting like how long am I going to keep this up, haven't I found someone who wants to marry me?"

"I can't tell you how humiliating and even maddening this is to me. I live with my mother whose only contribution to expenses is that she owns the house and pays a low tax yearly.

"We rent all the downstairs rooms except the kitchen to a woman doctor. This means we have no gracious living space, and can naturally have but a limited social life. I am not complaining, but it interests me to talk to other divorced women, in shops and in the circle of my friends, and to discover that the very husbands who wanted the divorces, and more or less forced them, are acting in this cruel way about alimony payments.

### A Racket

"My lawyer tells Lew that he must be more prompt, and Lew says that alimony is a racket and that no self-respecting woman would go on taking it year after year. This is very different from the way he talked when he wanted to be free. I have never seen him since he sailed away; we had known each other then only seven weeks. Mother and I live out of town, keep much to ourselves, and devote ourselves to my boy, determined that his life

shall not be saddened by his father's faults.

"Woman after woman tells me a similar story of desertion, cruelty, and utter indifference to obligations and to children. God knows we don't want divorces! We don't want to be lonely and unloved. But what little dignity we could save from the wreckage of our hopes is torn away by the insolent coldness of the men who swore to love us always. Have you anything to suggest that will help me to convince my husband that he owes us something better than this?"

Laurette, you are right in your statement that this case is not unusual, and my abhorrence of divorce—and any divorce—is well known to anyone who reads this column.

But at the same time, alimony in itself is an indefensible thing, and a smart woman ought to get away from it as fast as she can. Help with the small boy's expenses is another question, and Lew is bound on all accounts to pay that. Legally he can be held to it.

But look at your case as a healthy young human being, not as a deserted wife. You and Lew made a hasty, ill-considered marriage. In those war years a million girls and boys did the same, and some turned out well and many didn't.

Now you say to Lew, "For those weeks of wartime excitement and mistaken passion, you must support me as long as I live. No matter what your difficulties I will never have to help you. Though I married a capitalist tomorrow, you would have no claim on one penny of mine. I will hold my son. I will keep him conscious of his father's faults. But I will make no efforts to support him, because he and I are assured now of support as long as you live." This does not seem fair from the man's viewpoint. It is understandably so.

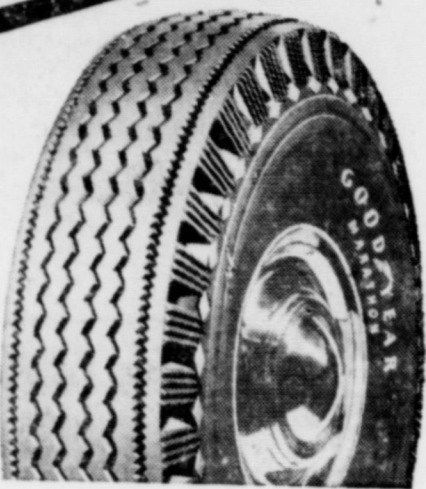

### Children May Take T. B.

Speaking of the susceptibility of children to tuberculosis, Dr. Geo. W. Cox, State Health Officer, said today that few people realize that babies and young children are very likely to become infected with tuberculosis if they are kept in rooms with persons who have the disease use the same dishes, sleep in the same beds, or are handled and kissed by persons who have tuberculosis.

"Babies and young children pick up germs of tuberculosis just as readily as they pick up the germs of measles or whooping cough, or of any other of the so-called children's diseases," Dr. Cox said. But tuberculosis unlike most diseases, has more than one form. Babies who get tuberculosis may not show the symptoms we associate with the disease in older persons. But the disease in most cases develops rapidly and is likely to end fatally. Tuberculosis in babies and young children is a very serious matter

that although recent studies have shown that if young children are removed promptly from contact with the disease and given the necessary care, many lives can be saved.

Dr. Cox said that if the presence of tuberculosis is recognized in its early stages and if medical attention is secured promptly, a great deal

can be accomplished whenever the disease develops, whether in young or old.

"Tuberculosis doesn't just simply happen. Nobody is born with the disease. Everybody who develops tuberculosis gets it from some other source, and children and young people who have been in contact with persons having tuberculosis are especially likely to contract it."

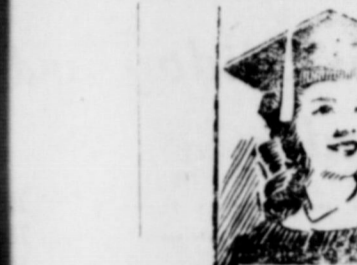

### Fertilized Soils Drink Hard Rains

**Unfertilized Soils Break  
Down Under Hard Rains**  
Does your farm land "drink" in  
pelting rains? Or do those rains  
break down the surface soil, seal the  
top like a lid, puddle and then run  
off?

The answer depends on soil care,  
say Missouri University agron-  
omists.

The accompanying photos show  
what happened after a beating rain  
fell on two freshly plowed fields ad-  
joining each other at the Sanborn  
Experiment Field at Columbia, Mo.

Both fields had been in corn since  
1888. The top field was fertilized;  
the lower one not. For the test, all  
crops were removed and then the  
soil was plowed.

Soil in the top field took the rain  
in stride. The water drained quickly  
down in. There was practically no  
runoff; no soil damage, or loss of  
water or topsoil. The plowed clods  
are intact and the surface looks  
loose and porous.



On the lower field, the beating  
rain broke the bare surface soil into  
tiny particles. Clods were dissolved.  
The tiny particles quickly filled the  
pores of the surface soils, forming  
a hard, lid-like crust. Water could  
not get down in, so it ponded on the  
surface. This field suffered a double  
loss. It lost needed moisture for  
crops and it lost valuable topsoil  
due to runoff.

### Farm Wife May Equal Spouse in Crop Know-How

The hand that rocks the cradle is  
regaining its traditional skill in  
agriculture.

Prof. Grant B. Snyder, head of the  
Department of Olericulture at the  
University of Massachusetts and  
rural youth leader, predicts that  
modern farm wives will soon be  
growing out of the kitchen into full  
working partnership with husbands.

He bases his opinion, he said, on  
records of the National Junior Veg-  
etable Growers Association, an or-  
ganization that offers rural youth in  
46 states "apprenticeship" training  
in the best methods of commercial  
gardening. This training program is  
a year-long production-marketing  
contest sponsored by A&P stores,  
which provides \$6,000 annually in  
scholarship funds.

In the 1951 contest, Prof. Snyder  
pointed out, "more than 40 per cent  
of the 148 winners who split the  
\$6,000 melon were girls."

"Many of these future farm  
wives," he added, "are college stu-  
dents taking agriculture, and I am  
sure they will put their education  
and their NJVGA experience to good  
use on their future farms."

Prof. Snyder, co-founder and chief  
adult adviser of NJVGA, said the  
1952 contest, which is open to boys  
and girls 12 to 21 years of age, "is  
expected to be the biggest in NJVGA  
history."

### Minnesota Farm Receipts, Expenses Hit New Highs

Both cash receipts and expenses  
of Minnesota farmers reached new  
high marks in 1951. Receipts from  
the sale of farm products reached a  
peak of 1,391 million dollars, topping  
1950 by 14 per cent and the previous  
record, in 1948, by 4 per cent. At  
the same time, cash expenses in  
1951 rose nearly 12 per cent above  
1950. The actual increase in net  
cash income over 1950 was only  
moderate.

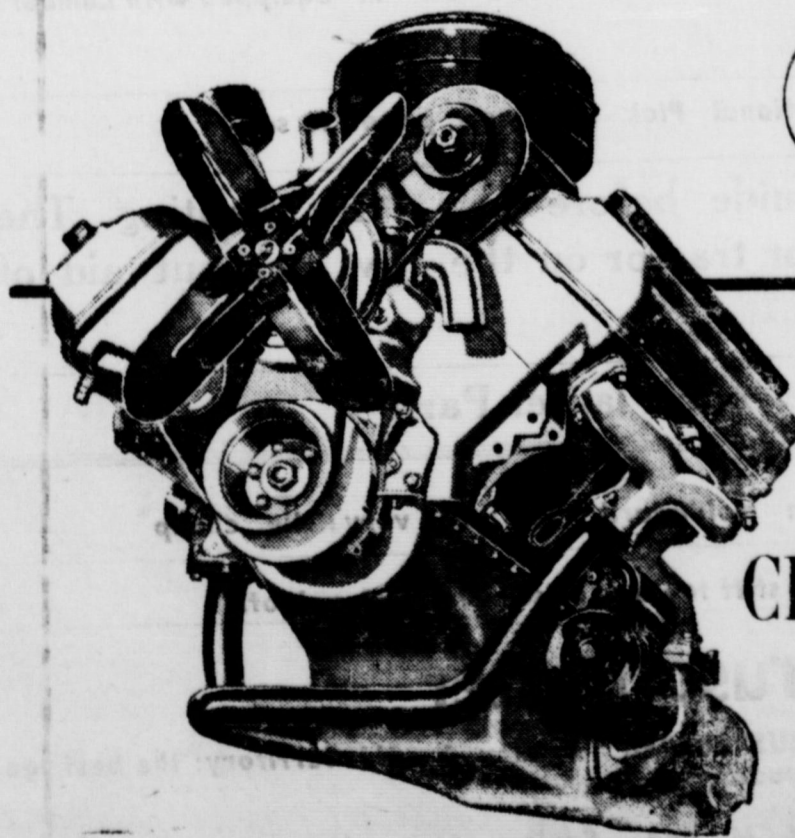
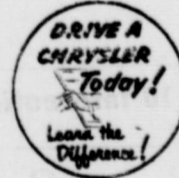
