Turkey Meeting Is This Thursday Nite

At 7:30 At High School Auditorium

Interest Is Shown Here

Thursday nite there will be a community meeting at 7:30 at the high school auditorium of all interested in the commercial production of turkeys and caged hens. There will be a number of informed men to present the entire picture of the proposal.

Turkeys if raised in units of upward of 1,000 head are expected to give a nice side income to farmers. The poults will be furnished the grower at 8 weeks of age at about \$1 each. The farmer will have the turkeys on range for about 4 months until the market opens. Turkeys are usually sold on the Thanksgiving market and then frozen. This year the producers took home profit of \$1.65 per head. Next year the net is expected to be about \$1.

Broiler men are invited to attend as they may be asked to brood some of the poults until reaching the age to go on range.

Full financing of this venture is expected to be explained at the meeting. Needed is fencing, a brush shelter, and a roost.

Having a part on the program are: E. J. Smith, local banker, Glenn Clark, local feed man, and the following from out of town: Mr. Williams, General Manager of the Paymaster Feed Co. of Abilene, Charles C. Partin, Sales Man and finance, A. Allen Heidebrecht, a feed nutritionist, speaking on the feed program and other speakers will be Claude R. Ash of Abilene, Jim Kimbraugh of Abilene and Wren Vineyard of Lubbock.

Light refreshments will be served Glenn Clark said. Farmers are invited to be present Thursday nite Dec. 15th even if not interested as other types of "side-line" farming may be developed.

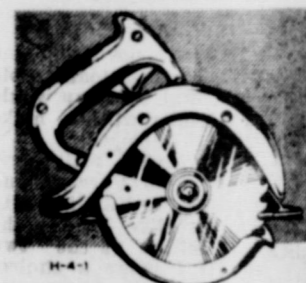

Rats Cost Millions

Texas lose 170 million dollars every year on account of rats. They destroy and waste large quantities of food and are responsible for the spread of certain diseases to humans. "There is just one thing to do about rats," declares Dr. Henry Holle, Commissioner of Health, "and that is get rid of them."

Rats have been found to spread infectious (jaundice), rabies, typhus fever, rat bite fever, dysentery and other diseases. More eggs and small game are destroyed by rats than by all other animals. Sometimes they start destructive fires by nailing wires and short circuiting them.

Exterminating rats is an endless process, if your building is not soundly protected against additional invasions. New buildings should be made rat-proof, and old ones can be made so at reasonable expense. Building rats out is a whole lot cheaper than having them around. Solid concrete or heavy metal are about the only materials that keep rats from entering a building, and unless foundations extend about two feet under ground, rats can burrow underneath. You certainly cannot trust to luck -- the rat is too clever and aggressive for that.

Red Squill is one of the poisons commonly used to kill rats, but this poison is not only death on rats, it is deadly for humans too. Warfarin is a comparatively new poison designed for killing rats -- but it, too, is equally dangerous to humans. Both these poisons must be handled very carefully, and put out where neither children nor pets can get near them. Any kind of such poison must be stored in very safe places too.

If rats were starved out, by rat-proof construction, and with complete sanitation in our communities -- around our homes and places of business, and all wastes and trash were properly disposed of in sanitary land-fills -- we would make an enormous economic saving and eliminate a real threat to health.
