SERIOUS SHORTAGE OF TEACHERS IS A MAJOR SCHOOL PROBLEM

The Texas State Teachers Association has just completed a survey among city and county school superintendents to determine the condition in the public schools of Texas. Replies were received from 1,038 superintendents representing 35,874 teaching positions or about 78 per cent of the total in Texas. The turn-over in the teacher personnel in the public schools for this year is the greatest in our history, 8,272 teachers or more than 25 per cent were new in their job when school opened this fall.

Of the teachers included in the survey, 5,730 were listed with sub-standard qualifications which represents 1 out of each 6 in the state. Superintendents reporting stated that they had in their school systems 2,157 classes with a student enrollment of 49 or more. The national standard for enrollment is 27 students in high school classes and 30 in elementary classes. This over-crowded condition has resulted from the shortages of teachers and in many instances, a lack of adequate classrooms.

Today, Texas needs at least 9,000 qualified teachers to relieve our over-crowded classrooms, to add to the curriculum many subjects that have been eliminated during the war years an dto replace sub-standard personnel.

Superintendent Charles M. Rogers of Amarillo, retiring president of the Texas State Teachers Association commented that: "Today if our public schools could employ immediately all of the students in the colleges and universities of Texas that are preparing to be teachers, we would not relieve our great shortage. I am sure that we do not have

in our Texas institutions of higher learning 9,000 people today who are preparing to become teachers. We must raise salaries in Texas high enough to encourage those now in college to enter teaching as their chosen profession. I cannot see any other solution to the problem."

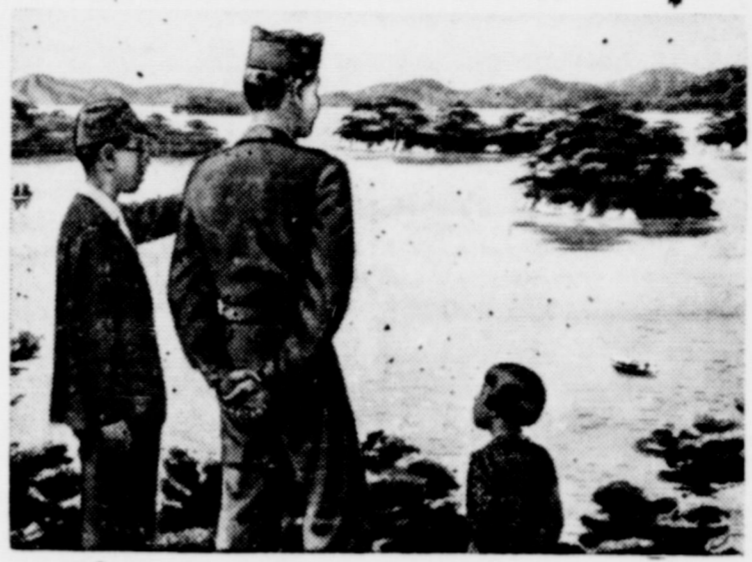

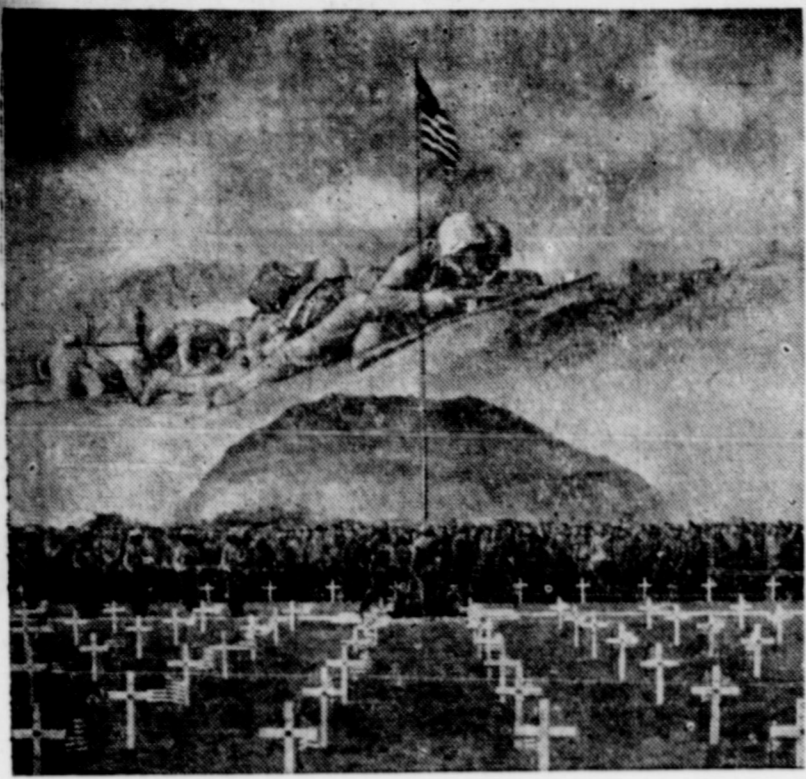

HISTORY OF HEROISM

Marine Corps To Observe Anniversary of Founding

Traditions springing from the deeds of heroic marines down through the decades of American history will burn fiercely in the hearts of present-day Leathernecks as the U. S. marine corps observes the 171st anniversary of its founding on November 10.

At ceremonies throughout marine corps bases in continental United States as well as at outposts in Shanghai, London, Manila, Panama Canal zone and others manned by Leathernecks, the men of the corps will assemble. They will be told once again the story of the founding of

the marines at Tun Tavern in colonial Philadelphia on November 10, 1775, before signing of the Declaration of Independence. Wherever they gather, marines will remember with pride the men of their corps who died at Trenton, Tripoli, Manassas, Belleau Wood, Managua, Guadalcanal and Iwo Jima.

Still Protect Lives.

Although no longer fighting a war, the marines of today are as active as ever. They are back at their job of protecting lives and property, at the same time perfecting those special talents which always have distinguished them in the military field.

At Lake Success, Long Island, N. Y., marines have been selected as the representatives of our armed forces to preserve order and to maintain the security of the United Nations. Some 80 marines of the provisional guard, outfitted in new blue uniforms, take posts at strategic places to direct traffic, to answer inquiries and to check passes.

In China, as members of "cease-fire" teams—umpires in the Nationalist-Communist dispute—marines operate in the field to bring about conciliation between local factions before bloodshed can begin.

On the other side of the world, 900 miles from the North Pole, a force of marines is testing winter combat clothing and studying techniques of cold-weather campaigning—a radical change from the steaming jungles of the Solomon Islands.

Significant History. Throughout the history of the United States, the marine corps has played an illustrious and colorful role in all conflicts. The corps' battle record commenced with the Revolutionary war in 1775. Then followed the naval war with France in 1798, the war with Barbary pirates in 1805, the War of 1812, the Indian wars of 1836, the Mexican war of 1848, Perry's expedition to Japan in 1854, the Civil war of 1861, the expedition to Korea in 1866, the Span-

Ancient Ashes Used For Building Blocks

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M.—Tests under way at University of New Mexico are designed to show that ashes and cinders deposited by volcanoes in New Mexico during the Mesozoic period of several thousand years ago can be utilized as a building material to aid the postwar shortage.

Main objective of the tests is to determine the best method of manufacturing "cinder blocks" from the ancient material. Already in use in the state, the blocks are gaining popularity because of their extreme lightness and low thermal conductivity.

Experimenters are endeavoring to secure a building material which will be light, strong, fast curing and easily manufactured.

Convicts Hitch Ride—With Prison Warden

LANSING, KAS.—Two convicts from the Kansas state penitentiary escaped from a work detail, hid in a nearby woods until nightfall and then made their way to a highway, where they hitchhiked a ride with the first car to approach. Driver of the car was Robert Hudspeth, state prison warden. Recognition was mutual, Hudspeth reported, and the prisoners offered no resistance.

Skunk Is Grateful, Benefactor Insists

HANKINS, N. Y.—Even the skunk occasionally can be grateful, Louis Hoffman admits. When a little skunk advanced toward Hoffman, discretion struggled with valor, but discretion lost. Hoffman held his ground and breath. The skunk's head was caught in a glass jar, so Hoffman bent down and gingerly pulled at the jar until the creature was free. The skunk ambled off.

IN THESE UNITED STATES

Toy Cars, People and Trees Recreate Accidents in Court

LOUISVILLE, KY.—Toy cars, miniature replicas of people and even diminutive trees recreate the setting of traffic accidents in the court of Guy Shearer, police judge pro tem.

"We're not playing with toys around traffic court," Judge Shearer insists, adding that the project is intended as a means of speeding up cases.

Deciding that action on traffic court cases was unnecessarily slow, conflicting evidence in a minor case often requiring nearly two hours for presentation, Judge Shearer decided to modernize and streamline the procedure.

Judge Goes Shopping.

The judge went shopping, trudging the business district for several hours before he finally found seven toy cars in a dime store, paying 10 cents each "out of his own pocket."

The toy cars are used to illustrate testimony of witnesses in traffic mishaps. Used with the cars are six maps showing various types of intersections in the city. The maps were drawn on large cardboard placards to scale with the model cars.

When a traffic case is called, a map covering the particular type of scene where the accident occurred is set up and witnesses are asked to place the model cars where the street-size vehicles were at time of the mishap.

Add Realistic Touch.

Toy people and trees also play an important part in the plan. Trees are placed at intersection corners to add realism to the scene and persons involved in the mishap are placed in the positions they occupied.

"This procedure," Shearer explains, "makes clear in the minds of the court and the witnesses just what happened and eliminates confusion."

Threat of A-Bomb Impels Easterner To Head for West

PORT WASHINGTON, N. Y.—The reasoning of William Keenan went something like this: The United States has the atom bomb, but soon other nations will have it. If there were a war between one of these nations armed with the atom bomb and the United States, what would be the enemy's main target? The answer that Keenan arrived at was "the New York area." That is where Keenan lived—until he became alarmed over perils of life in the atomic age.

Loading all his furniture and other possessions in a truck, Keenan set

forth for "somewhere in Montana," where, he believes, there will be little possibility of a rain of the destructive war weapons.

Accompanying Keenan on the trek west were Mrs. Keenan, their son, Billy, and three daughters, Barbara, Pauline and Ruth.

War Battleflags Being Relegated To Show Cases

DES MOINES, IOWA.—World War II already is reaching the "show case" stage in Iowa history. The next session of the state legislature will be asked to provide display cases for World War II flags of Iowa units, which will be presented to the state at an Armistice Day ceremony in the statehouse.

Four cases of faded and often tattered Civil war flags and one case each of Spanish-American and World War I standards now repose in show cases. Under the once red-white-and-blue Civil war flags are such observations as these:

"May the wreaths they have won never wither, Nor the stars of their glory grow dim."

"The judgments of the Lord are true and righteous altogether."

Beneath the World War I flags appears this legend:

"So long as time's great cycle runs, Or nations weep their fallen ones, Thou'lt not forget thy patriot sons, Iowa, O' Iowa."

Some of the flags have been on display for more than half a century. Occasionally someone looks at them.

Church Gets Quarter, Interest and 'Penalty'

NEWPORT, KY.—The Rev. Charles J. Schauffus, pastor of the Congregational church, received a letter from Mrs. Lydia Simpkinson, 70, of Pasadena, Calif., containing a 25-cent piece which she said she had overlooked while conducting a drive for the church 50 years ago, plus checks for \$13.75 representing interest and \$50 "as a penalty for keeping the quarter so long."

PAUL MINISTERS TO THE THESSALONIANS

LESSON TEXT—Acts 17:1-7; I Thessalonians 1:2-8.
MEMORY SELECTION—Be not weary in well-doing.—II Thessalonians 1:11.

A great city, commercially active, religious to a high degree, a military center and a harbor so fine that it is important to this day—such was the city of Thessalonica. It presented a challenge to the preachers of the gospel and, in the name of Christ, Paul accepted and won a great victory.

In the face of persecution, bitter and persistent, the believers in this city remained faithful. The reason for that appears in our lesson. Rooted and grounded in Christ, they had brought forth the fruit of real Christian living under circumstances which were difficult and trying. Our lesson tells of both the preaching of the gospel by Paul and the living of the gospel by the Thessalonians.

I. The Gospel Preached—Accepted and Rejected (Acts 17:1-7).

Paul began his long and successful ministry in Thessalonica in the synagogue. It was to the Jews who worshipped the one true God that he came with his message about their expected Messiah—Christ the Lord. Here he established a strong church.

What was the message which so signally succeeded in this great strategic center? Well, it was not (as some modern preachers in large cities seem to think necessary) a series of social, political, or literary discourses. Paul preached Christ. He reasoned with them and presented the Saviour (v. 3) as One who was

1. Dead for our sin. These people were like us in that they needed a solution for their sin problem.

Without the death of Christ there is no salvation for any man. Only through the shedding of blood can there be remission of sin (Heb. 9:22). Paul had no part in the folly of a "bloodless gospel"—as though there were any such gospel.

2. Raised for our justification. It was not enough that Jesus died, marvelous as that is in our sight. For many a man has died for his convictions, but none has risen from the dead. Christ could not be held of the grave. He arose the victorious Redeemer.

3. Declared to be the Christ. He is more than a man, more than a great leader and an earnest teacher. He is God's anointed One, himself divine—and our Lord.

Some believed (v. 4), including many devout Greeks, and not a few of the leading women. The gospel does have life-giving power as the Holy Spirit applies it to the hearts of willing men and women.

Others opposed (v. 5, 6). Note that they were "of the baser sort." They always are, even when they appear to be cultivated and educated, for there is something fundamentally wrong in a life which rejects Christ.

It was a serious charge they made against the Christians (v. 7), for it was treason punishable by death to have any other king but Caesar if one lived in a Roman colony.

But the thing which they hated worst in these Christians was the fact that their topsy-turvy world was in danger of being set right (they put it the opposite way, v. 6), and they did not want to be made right. It is interesting to note that these early preachers had divine power to turn over the social order. Would that we showed more of that power in the church today!

Accepting the truth is good, but it must go on in daily living. The Thessalonians knew that and they are models of

II. The Gospel Lived—Followers and Examples (I Thess. 1:2-8).

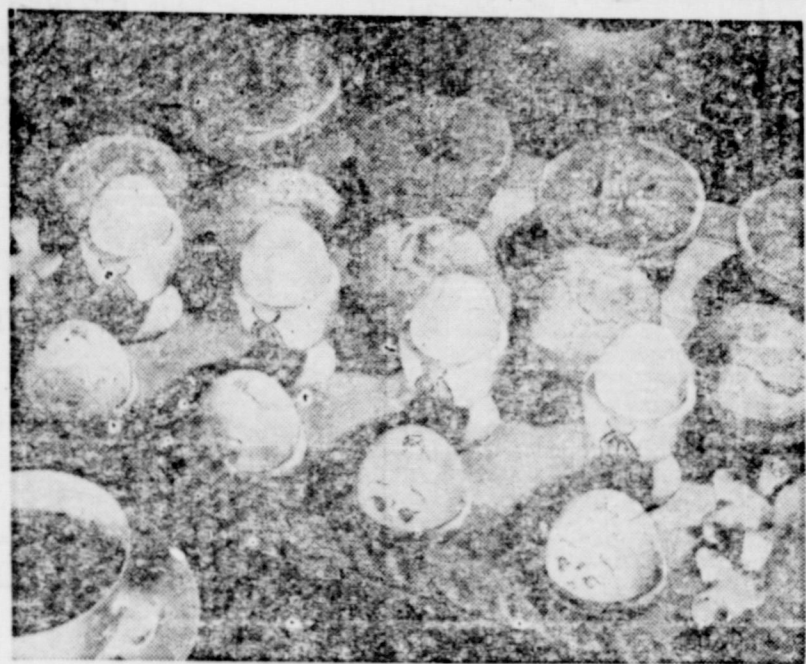
Paul, the missionary, was a courteous preacher. He recognized the faithfulness of Christian brethren and did not hesitate to commend them. We could do more of that when we meet true and faithful believers.

They were followers of Paul, but only because he followed Christ (v. 6). His power was from above (v. 5), even as they also were chosen from above (v. 4).

Following Christ meant affliction to them (v. 6), but it also meant the joy of the Holy Spirit, which is entirely independent of the circumstances of life—and above them.

These Thessalonian believers were examples of what it meant to be Christians. Wherever Paul went their faith toward God was recognized and he did not need to explain or argue for his gospel. People knew the Thessalonian Christians, and thus they knew real Christianity.

There could be no finer witness to the faith of anyone than to be able to bear testimony that it is an example—a model—to which others may look and not go astray. Do we dare to measure our Christian lives by such a standard?



Start the Day Right With a Good Breakfast
(See Recipes Below)

Breakfast Breads

How's breakfast interest at your home these days? Does everyone look forward to sitting down for breakfast because mother is sure to have some fluffy hot bread that they can smell baking while they're going through the finishing touches of bathing and dressing? Or, is the family anxious to scamper through breakfast without giving it so much as a sniff?

If the latter is the case, then sit down right now and do something drastic about it. You may have to do without bacon and sausage, those breakfast standbys, but the ingredients required for breakfast breads are available. Let them give you a lift for that important first meal of the day. Your family can't resist light, fluffy rolls with the tangy smell of cinnamon and raisins, or light and hearty pancakes.

Bran is a good food item for any day of the week, but it's especially good at breakfast when served in these tasty muffins:

Bran-Molasses Muffins.
1 1/4 cups flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
3/4 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 cups sour milk or buttermilk
1/4 cup molasses
1 1/4 cups bran
1 egg, slightly beaten
2 tablespoons melted shortening

Sift flour once; measure; add baking powder, soda and salt. Sift again. Add milk, molasses and bran; let stand until most of the liquid is absorbed by the bran. Add egg and melted shortening which has been slightly cooled. Add flour mixture and stir just enough to moisten the dry ingredients. Fill greased muffin pans 3/4 full and bake in a hot (400 degrees) oven for 20 to 25 minutes.

Peanut Butter Bread.
3 cups flour
5 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup sugar
1 cup dates or candied orange peel
1 1/4 cups orange juice or milk
1/2 cup peanut butter

Sift flour; measure; add baking powder, salt and sugar. Sift again and add dates or orange peel. Add milk or orange juice slowly to peanut butter, blending thoroughly. Pour into flour mixture and mix just until dry ingredients are moistened. Do not beat. Turn into a greased loaf pan and bake in a moderate (350 degrees) oven for about 1 hour.

Sally Lunn.
2 cups flour
3 teaspoons baking powder
3/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup shortening
1 egg
2 1/2 cups milk

Sift flour; measure and add baking powder and salt; sift again. Cream shortening, add sugar gradually; continue beating until light and fluffy. Add sifted flour mixture and stir just enough to moisten the dry ingredients. Do not beat. Pour batter into a greased square pan,



beat. Turn into a greased loaf pan and bake in a moderate (350 degrees) oven for about 1 hour.

How to Make Tastier Breads
When using flour or sugar for bread making, make sure that they are sifted or they will not measure out properly. It is often necessary to sift sugar to get lumps out of it. Yeast breads are usually put in hot ovens for 10 minutes to stop the growth of the yeast, then lowered to finish baking. Quick breads are baked in a moderate oven, as a general rule.

sprinkle with topping and bake in a hot (400 degrees) oven for about 20 minutes. Cut in squares and serve hot.

Topping for Sally Lunn.
1/2 cup brown sugar
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 tablespoon melted butter

Combine brown sugar and cinnamon; blend with butter. Corn cakes are a variation of pancakes and are especially good on cold, hard-to-get-up mornings. Make them nice and thin and serve with honey or syrup.

Lacy Corn Cakes.
(Makes 40 cakes)
1 1/4 cups yellow cornmeal
1 teaspoon salt
2 eggs, well beaten
2 cups milk
4 tablespoons melted shortening

Combine cornmeal and salt. Combine eggs, milk and melted shortening. Pour in cornmeal and stir until well combined. Bake on a hot griddle, stirring batter each time before removing a spoonful. Serve while hot.

Streusel Coffee Cake.
1 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon mace
6 tablespoons sugar
2 tablespoons shortening
1 egg
1/2 cup milk

Sift dry ingredients. Cut in shortening, add un-beaten egg and milk. Stir until smooth. Turn into a square or loaf pan which has been greased and top with the following mixture:

Streusel Topping.
4 tablespoons sugar
2 tablespoons butter
1 teaspoon butter
1/4 teaspoon mace

Mix all ingredients with a fork until mixture crumbles. Scatter over top of batter and bake in a hot (400 degrees) oven for 25 minutes.

Blitz Coffee Cake.
Bake Streusel coffee cake in tin, preferably a round one. Cover top, before baking, with shaved almonds and brown sugar. After cake has baked and cooled, split in half and spread with whipped cream and raspberry jam.

If you want to impart a buttery flavor to baked goods without using butter itself, then use sour cream. It imparts richness and taste to almost any baked food.

Sour Cream Waffles.
1 cup flour
3/4 teaspoon soda
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
3/4 cup rich sour cream
3/4 cup buttermilk
2 eggs, beaten separately

Add well beaten yolks, sour cream and buttermilk to melted shortening and sifted dry ingredients. Mix thoroughly. Fold in carefully the stiffly beaten egg whites and bake on a hot waffle iron.
