

THE WEEK IN WASHINGTON.

79th Day.—Mr. Abbott, to-day, presented a petition from citizens from Dallas county protesting against the Butterworth and Dawes land bills, which was referred to the committee on agriculture.

Mr. Culbertson presented a petition of Mary Chertiers of Lamar county for reference of her claim to the Court of Claims. Referred to the committee on war claims.

Among the bills reported from the committee and placed on the calendar in the senate were the following: To encourage the holding of a national industrial exposition of arts, mechanics and products of the colored race in the United States in 1888-89.

79th Day.—Congressman Crain, who has been suffering from an ulcerated throat for the past two weeks, was on the floor of the house to-day.

The conferees on the urgent deficiency bill have agreed upon the report. The amendment placed upon the bill in the House appropriated \$27,000 to reimburse the State of Texas for expenses incurred in repelling invaders.

The Senate committee on finance has recommended the Aldrich bill to authorize the secretary of the Treasury to apply the surplus money in the Treasury to purchase United States bonds.

General News.—The new Emperor of Germany has issued his proclamation. He has addressed the Reichstag in the name of the Emperor.

President Eliot, of Harvard, reports that last year gifts amounted to over \$500,000. His "quick capital" is over \$6,000,000.

Arkansas News.—A new post office has been established at Bell, Pike county, B. Thompson, Postmaster.
