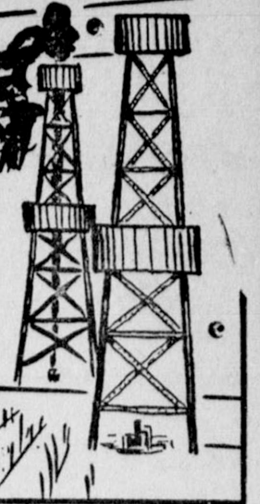

Under the Housing Act of 1961, owners of housing sites in rural areas and in rural communities with not more than 2500 population may be eligible for housing loans made by the Farmers Home Administration. Previously these loans were available only to farmers.  
Loans are made for construction, repair, and remodeling of dwellings and essential farm buildings. Interest rate is 4 per cent per year on unpaid balance, with repayment over periods up to 33 years.  
Applications for rural housing loans should be made at the local county office of the FHA.

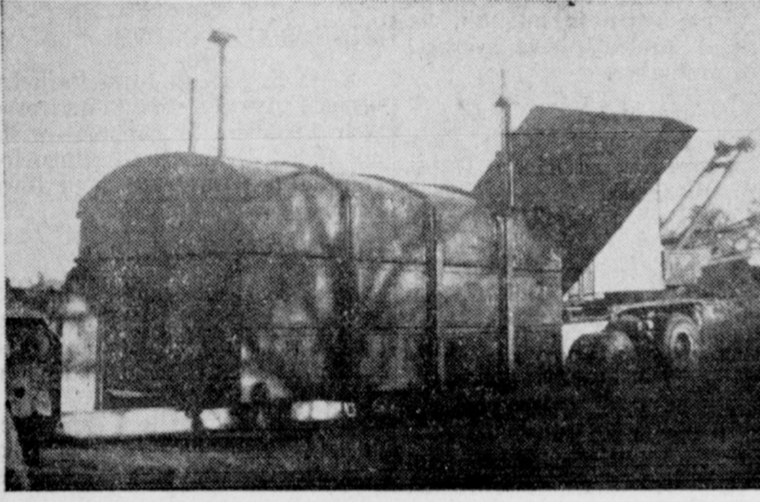

**Garden Club Has Workshop**

Mrs. Roy Magers of Burkburnett conducted a workshop for Iowa Park Garden club recently in the Youth Center. She is a nationally accredited flower judge and is serving as horticulture chairman of the Wichita Falls Garden club.

Subject for the meeting was "Selecting, Grooming and Conditioning for the Flower Show." Iowa Park Garden club will hold its annual flower show next spring and Mrs. Magers reminded members "good gardeners start at least a month in advance to get specimens ready for a show." She stated that to grow blue ribbon winners, a knowledge of the soil and individual plants is necessary. Mrs. Magers took the rose as an example to give specific instructions for getting a specimen ready for a show. Select a bud at least 21 days before the show, looking for one with a good straight stem. Some buds have a five leaflet leaf below the terminal bud. It is wise to select a bud with at least a two leaflet leaf.

She stressed the importance of spraying at least every 10 days for insects, and of disbudbing every morning below the terminal leaf. During the period of grooming, stake the plants or use plastic bags and screens to protect the bud from wind and rain. A systematic feeding program is important.

Mrs. Magers said to cut the flowers at about 4:00 p.m. the day before the show, because the sugar content is high at this hour. One third of the lower leaves are to be removed, and the stem is to be placed in water immediately. When the cutting is taken to the house, it should be submerged in water up to the bloom for several hours. It should remain in water not so deep overnight.

The speaker said many blue ribbons are lost from home to flower show and she gave instructions how best to get the plants there for display and judging. She also gave hints on the care of other plants and concluded with a talk on preservatives to be put in water for various cut flowers.
