RD Elms Receives Honors at SAFB

Randle D. Elms sr., an instructor at Sheppard AFB, received a length of service award and pin last week for 30 years of government service.

Mr. Elms is in the Jet Aircraft Mechanics department.

Elms enlisted in the Army Air Corps at Jefferson Barracks, Mo., in March 1941. He had basic training there and went to Chanute AFB, Ill., for training in airplane engine mechanics.

He served at Cochran Field, Ga.; Eglin AFB, Fla.; Chatham AFB, Ga., where he was discharged in October 1945. He re-enlisted and served one year in the Panama Canal Zone; a year at Robbins AFB; three years at Kirtland AFB, Albuquerque, N.M. He was assigned to Eniwetok Island in the South Pacific and then back to Kirtland.

In 1955 he put in for instructor duty at Chanute, for his first contact with the course he teaches now.

In 1958 Elms went to Saudi Arabia as a jet mechanic instructor evaluator and then to Amarillo AFB to the jet engine course. He retired from military service there in 1962 and began work as a civilian at Amarillo several months later. He moved to Sheppard in August 1964 when Amarillo AFB closed.

Elms and his wife Pearl live at 910 Van Horn. They have 5 children: Army Capt. Randle David Elms jr., Mrs. Mary Halady of Amarillo, Mrs. Mae Shelley of Wichita Falls, Martha, a senior at Midwestern university, & James, 4-years-old, of the home.
