



**Order for Directors Election**  
The State of Texas,

On this the 30th day of November, 1971, the Board of Directors of Wichita County Water Control and Improvement District No. 3 convened in regular session open to the public with the following members present, to-wit: M. L. Hines, President; Carl Sullivan, Vice-President; Delbert Todd; O. N. Newman, Secretary; and the following absent: Gaines Maness, constituting a quorum, and among other proceedings had by said Board of Directors was the following:

Whereas on the next ensuing second Tuesday, in January, being the 11th day of January, 1972, there will be elected 3 directors for this district;

Whereas this Board by order dated the 30th day of November, 1971, established the procedure for candidates who desire to file for said election;

Therefore, be it ordered by the

Board of Directors of Wichita County Water Control and Improvement District No. 3:

That an election be held in said district on the second Tuesday in January, 1972, the same being the 11th day of January, 1972, for the purpose of electing 3 directors to the Board of Directors of said District;

That said election shall be held at the ASCS offices in Iowa Park, Texas, within said District with Carroll Hester as Presiding Judge and Mrs. T. M. Clark and Mrs. Emma Gaunt as Clerks.

The polls at the above designated polling place shall on election day be open from 7 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.

George Trammell is hereby appointed Clerk for absentee voting, which shall be held at City Hall of Iowa Park, Texas, within the boundaries of the district and said place of absentee voting shall remain open for at least eight hours on each day for absentee voting or an official State holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceding the date of said election. Said place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on each day for said absentee voting. The above described place for absentee voting is also the absentee clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent.

The following named persons have duly filed as candidates for said election in accordance with the above mentioned order for election procedure in Directors Election passed by this Board, and their names shall be placed on the ballot for said in accordance with a drawing held by the Secretary of this Board in the following order: M. L. Hines, Carl Sullivan, Delbert Todd.

Notice of said election shall be given by publication of a copy of this order once a week for three consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published in the county in which this district is located; the first publication shall be at least 21 days prior to the date of election, and not more than 35 days prior thereto. Immediately after said election has been held, the officers holding the same shall make returns of the result thereof in triplicate, one being retained by the Presiding Judge, one delivered to the President of this Board, and one delivered to the Secretary. The ballot box and other election records and supplies shall be delivered to the Secretary at the office of the District and be preserved as provided by law in said office except that the Stub box shall be returned to the District Clerk for this County.

It is further found and determined that in accordance with the order of the Board of Directors the Secretary posted written notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting on the bulletin board, located in the administrative office, a place convenient to the public, and said notice having been so posted and remained posted continuously for at least 3 days preceding the date of this meeting. It is further found and determined that this district is located in Wichita County and that written notice of the date, place and subject matter of this meeting was furnished to the County Clerk and that said notice was posted by the County Clerk on the bulletin board at the county courthouse for said county, a place convenient to the public, at least 3 days preceding the date of this meeting. The returns of said posting shall be attached to the minutes of this meeting and shall be a part thereof for all intents and purposes.

The above order being read, it was moved and seconded that same do pass. Thereupon, the question being called for, the following members of the Board voted AYE: Delbert Todd, Carl Sullivan and O. N. Newman, and the following voted NO: None.



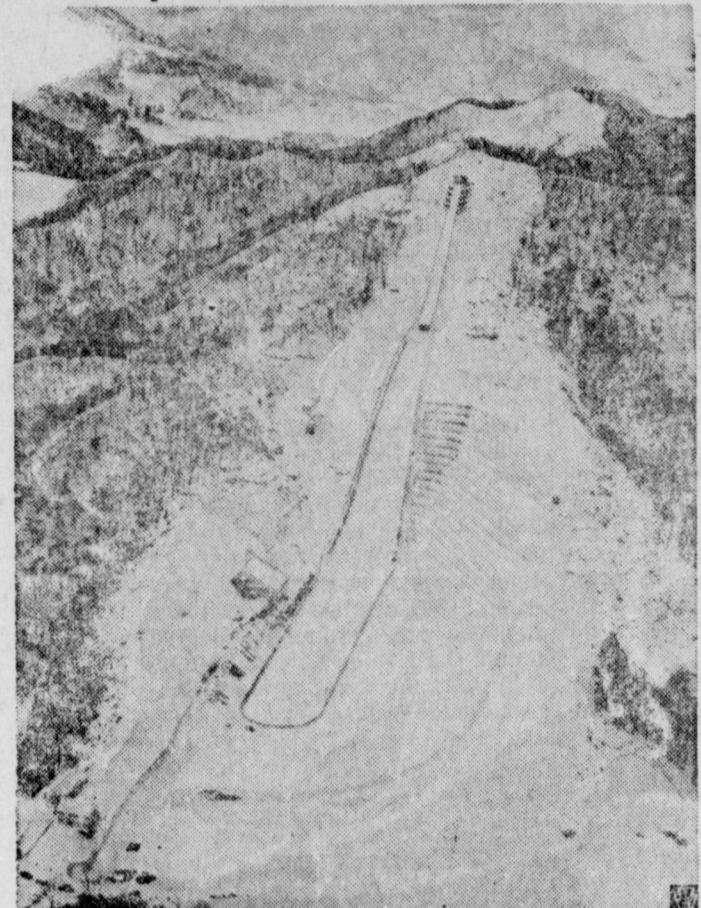
